### 1.2 intro

I'll just go straight into it.

SysLock is basically a password program which allows different users to use the program with different passwords, it is based loosely on that stupid password program on Windows 95 on the PC (Grrrr! Stupid Windows)

Anyway, I saw the program and thought, that could be useful on the Amiga though not until it was made halfway decent 8)

Anyway, I was going to allow different startups to be executed when a certain password was put in, but I basically couldn't be bothered, so I've decided that if I get enough response off this I will finish it off and release it!

SysLock is one of my many password programs written for the Amiga, but

---

this one has a firm difference, its my first written in Blitz Basic actually released, most of the others were either written in AMOS or I haven't bothered compiling them from the Blitz source. The other difference is that multiple users can use it, 99 to be precise. The users names and codes are stored in a file called S:SysLock.dat and it is encrypted, so nosey folks around you cant read it and find your password. Plus, the program saves the date and time you booted, along with your name into a logfile called S:SysLock.log, this is just for reference, so you can see when your Amiga is used (useful if more than one person uses it, and you find something has gone horribly wrong - you can easily distribute blame - as everyone surely knows, this makes things all better! 8) Well its there anyway, put up with it)

I personally know of only one other program which does a similar job, and that isn't getting mentioned (hah! - no free adverts for the competition) however, I believe mine is better because it encrypts the data stored!

Right, you might want to see Usage for more info!

## 1.3 usage

SysLock is REALLY easy to use!

When its is started, a (nice!) GUI is opened with the following:

A rectangle with messages in it

A string gadget, which allows you to type in your name

If it is incorrectly typed in, it will not allow you to continue

A string gadget which allows you to type in you password, like above if it is incorrectly typed in, it will not allow you to continue, also you will not be able to use it unless you have correctly typed in your name, as it is disabled (You can tell by the 'mesh' over it.

A button marked Enter, this will also be covered in a 'mesh', and it only disapeers after you have correctly tped in name and password, by pressing it, you will close the window, and continue the startup process.

Thats basiclly all there is to it, a small note should be made here about how you assign names and codes - SysLockPrefs

SysLockPrefs is a separate program from SysLock, and should be available with SysLock, as part of the archive.

The program has its own docs with it, so you can read them instead.

As mentioned in the Intro, a file called SysLock.dat is created, which has the encrypted names and codes saved to it, without it the program ends. I'm not sure as to what would happen if it has over 99 names saved to it, as I haven't bothered to check with actually 99 names and codes. If anyone has far too much time, and there is no trains to watch (or if they are a PC owner) then check and let me know.

---

Finally, the logfile created will store, name of user, date used and time used.

It can be accessed with any text viewer, its at S:SysLock.log

Easy huh?

Oops, looks like I forgot to mention something, the font Kai.font needs to be added to you FONTS: directory, I seemed to have forgotten because I DO have it in my FONTS: directory, and it didn't come up on SnoopDos. Sorry!
