



First a couple of definitions:

This is a Finder Folder Window (It happens to be for my 100 MB Hard Disk, N100)




This is a Finder Folder: when you double-click on it, the Finder Folder Window opens up, and shows you the contents of the folder


Do your Finder Folder Windows look like this?



Wish they looked like this?



Or this?



LineUp 1.0 is just what you need to keep your Finder Folder Windows hierarchically organized. Basically, you define a relationship (above, each "child" folder is below its parent, and each child folder's sides are a few pixels in from its parent) between a Finder Folder Window and the LineUp Window, then choose the selected Folder (usually, it will be a Volume, or the "root folder") from the Apple Menu, and LineUp 1.0 does the rest!

Step-by-Step Instructions:

1. Run LineUp 1.0 (double-click on it). First, the Apple Menu Folder items get initialized (The program is searching your Hard Disk for Folders), then the "About..." Window appears, and finally, after dismissing the "About..." window, the LineUp Window appears.
2. Open up the Folder you would like to "LineUp" from the Finder (It will usually be your Hard Disk, if you're like me). It helps to CLOSE ALL other Finder Folder windows.
3. Move the LineUp Window to define the relationship between the Finder Folder Window and its

"offspring".

4. CLOSE the Finder Folder Window. ANY FINDER FOLDER WINDOWS LEFT OPEN WILL NOT BE PROPERLY LINED UP. This is because if you leave it open, then click on the close box, the positioning of the window gets updated (if it was open, it remains right where it was before!).
5. Choose the Folder from the Apple Menu, or one of its Popup Menus.
6. If you're sure you have the right folder and the right relationship, answer OK to the "safety check" Alert.
7. If you do "mess up" somehow, you can always do it over, this time with the proper relationship defined. At worst, the "bad" relationship could cause some windows to move off the screen. LineUp compensates for this and does NOT allow the boundaries of the window to go beyond the screen dimensions.
8. If all went well, you should have hierarchically organized Finder Folder Windows, at least until you or someone else starts moving them all around!

## Preferences

Under the Apple Menu, choose the item "LineUp Prefs...". Here, a dialog box will appear with all setup options. Minimal ScreenSaving and Password Protection are supported, as well as options on progress dialog box displays and initialization.

The LineUp Preferences button takes you to another dialog box. This one lets you choose whether LineUp 1.0 calculates Finder Folder Window heights, or if the LineUp Window height should be used for all child folders. This dialog also lets you specify a minimum window height and width (just in case the windows wind up OFF the screen, they will be squeezed back onto the screen at the minimum height and/or width.

In the LineUp Prefs... dialog, there is also a button to display text-only basic instructions.
