

# JukeBox Release 1.1

## New in Release 1.1

- Plays MIDI files (\*.MID)
- New button : play selected – plays only the selected song
  - Bug fixes

JukeBox is a tool designed to play WAV files though others will be supported in the near future. Simply run JukeBox and you can drag WAV files from Explorer to the JukeBox WAV list.

JukeBox is being written for a particular application but has been made available to anyone who might find it useful. It doesn't solve the problems of the world – nor is it even the world's best wav player.... But it's free.

Songs in the list can be re-organized by dragging them around a dropping them where you want them to appear.

When songs are first dragged in, they appear with a file icon and won't be played by default. Double-click on a song and its icon will switch to a picture of a CD. The song is now marked for play. (Double-click again to reverse this procedure.)

Click on the JukeBox system menu or right-click on JukeBox's title bar to get JukeBox's menu. From there you can open and save JukeBox files.

A number of buttons appear along the bottom of the JukeBox display:

**Play** - This button commences playing the songs in the song list.

**Answer** - Not used yet.

**Pause** - Pause playing of the song list.

**Resume** - After a Pause, resumes playing of song list.

**Stop** - Stops playing of song list.

**Skip** - Skips playing of current song.

**Close** - Exits JukeBox.

A number of options appear on the right side of the dialog:

**Repeat Each Song** - Default is 0 so that songs play one time. Choose 1 to have a song play twice etc.

**Repeat List** - Default is 0 so that the entire song list plays one time. Choose 1 to have the song list play twice etc.

**Interval Delay** - Default is 0 so that there is no pause between songs. Choose a number of seconds that JukeBox will pause for between each song.
