



Meeja

Meeja is a sort of cross between File Manager and Media Player.

Whenever you get a CD-ROM from the front of a magazine, you usually want to go through it and check out all the Multimedia files to see whether or not they are of interest, before you throw the CD away.

Meeja lets you search an entire disk (or CD-ROM) for all the .WAV .MID or .AVI files. Then you can play them, either one by one or all at once. Finally, you can move them or delete them, without having to fire up another program.



Meeja

The main Meeja screen looks like this:-



When the program loads it scans the contents of the Disk Drive you select. You can change the disk by altering the Drive Selector. If you want to avoid the Blue Setup Screen at Startup then enter on the command line the disk you wish to scan (ie **MEEJA e:**)

The File Box will show the available files. You can choose whether to display .WAV files (sound files), .MID (Midi music files).AVI files (Video clips) or you can show All Files.

Playing a single file

Either click once on the file in the List Box and press the Play button, or double-click the file name in the List Box.

Playing Multiple Files

Select the files you wish to play. You can do this by pressing the CONTROL button on your keyboard

whilst clicking on the files you want. Keep the CONTROL key depressed until you have made all your selections, then press the Play button.

Deleting Files

Select one or more files, then press the Delete Button.

Copying Files

Select one or more files, then press the Copy button. You will need to specify the directory you wish to copy the files to.

Refreshing the Drive Window

Select this menu option to re-read the disk (or CD-ROM). This feature is particularly useful if you change CD-ROM.

Meeja has been used on Windows 3.1 and Windows 95 and seems to work fine. It uses Windows to access the Multimedia devices, which means that providing Windows can play sounds on your machine then Meeja will be happy. I have heard a rumour that it wont work if you have the PC Speaker Driver installed as your sound device.
