

Setting the PS code set

577765_paste.tiff ↗ Choose Preferences from the Info menu.

241915_paste.tiff ↗ To get PostScript output that has no comments in it, choose the 'Use uncommented PS code'.

808281_CheckMark.tiff ↗ Convert PICT keeps two copies of the PostScript 'library' that it uses when generating eps files. These two sets are identical in content and behavior, save that one has comments throughout. This preference selects which set to use.

518075_CheckMark.tiff ↗ You'll generally want to use the uncommented PS code set. It is much smaller than the commented set, which means Convert PICT will generate smaller eps files.

172630_CheckMark.tiff ↗ The commented PS code is useful if you need to examine the PostScript code yourself, since the comments should explain why all the code is there and what it is doing. The drawback is that this set of code is significantly larger than the uncommented set.
