

HERE 1.1



DESCRIPTION

Here is a shareware program that allows you to easily post your ever-changing dynamic PPP Internet address to a finger or web account, thereby allowing others to look up your current Internet address and contact you.

Here also includes integrated finger and web clients to allow you to easily check the PPP address postings of other **Here** users.

Since other users will now be able to locate your current address, you will be able to use talk servers such as **WinTalk**; FTP servers such as **WinQV/Net**, **Serv-U**, and **WFTPD**; and HTTP servers such as **HTTPD** and **ZB Server**.

MINIMUM HARDWARE AND SOFTWARE REQUIREMENTS

Here is available in two compilations, one for **Win16** and one for **Win32**. Both compilations require an IBM compatible PC with a **386+** microprocessor and **Winsock 1.1+**. The **Win16** version requires **Windows 3.1+** and the **Win32** version requires **Windows 95, NT, or 3.1** with **Win32s**.

REGISTRATION

Here is shareware. You may try **Here** for thirty days for free. However, if you decide to continue to use **Here** after the initial trial period, you are required to register it. The registration fee is \$10 US.

You can register **Here** by mail by printing the accompanying registration form contained in the "register.txt" file and mailing it to the address on the form, together with your check or money order.

INSTALLATION

After unzipping the archive, you will have the following files:

- here16.exe - 16 bit Program.
- here32.exe - 32 bit Program.
- here.hlp - Help.
- here.wri - Installation and Program Information.
- register.txt - Registration Form.
- file_id.diz - Summary Program Description.
- ctl3dv2.dll - 16-bit 3-D Control Library.
- ctl3d32.dll - 32-bit 3-D Control Library.

First, there are two versions of **Here** included in the zip file. "here16.exe" is for Windows 3.1 and "here32.exe" is for Windows 95, Windows NT, and Windows 3.1 with Win32s.

If you use only "here16.exe", move the file "ctl3dv2.dll" into your \windows\system directory, if you do not already have a copy of it located there. You may then delete the "here32.exe" and "ctl3dv32.dll" files.

If you use only "here32.exe", move "ctl3d32.dll" into you \windows\system directory, if you do not already have a copy of it located there. You may then delete "here16.exe" and "ctl3dv2.dll".

If you use both "here16.exe" and "here32.exe", move both "ctl3dv2.dll" and "ctl3dv32.dll" into your \windows\system directory.

Second, create a new directory (for example, c:\here) and copy all of the remaining **Here** files into it.

Third, add a **Here** Program Item to one of your one of your **Program Manager** groups.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Bofore running **Here**, you **MUST** remove both of the "dll" files from the directory into which you installed **Here**, either by moving them to your \windows\system directory or by deleting them if you do not move them. If you leave them in the same directory as your **Here** "exe" files, you will get error messages and **Here** will not run!

SETUP

To begin using **Here** to post messages, you must first enter your FTP login information in the **FTP Login** dialog box under the **Settings** menu.

You can choose two files to use for postings by using the **Upload Files** dialog box under the **Settings** menu. The default is to upload only your finger's ".project" file. You can add a second file to upload, and can choose any name for either of the two files so as to conform to the particular needs of your remote system (such as renaming ".project" to "project.txt" for VMS systems). The suggested name for the second file is "public_html/here.txt" which would upload a web page on must web server setups.

USE

To upload an ON message including your current PPP address, choose **On** from the **Post** menu. To upload an OFF message, choose **Off** from the **Post** menu. To automatically post ON and OFF messages when you start and when you exit **Here** choose the **Auto Post** toggle under the **Settings** menu.

You can check the address postings of other **Here** users by chosing **Finger** or **Web** under the **Query** menu.

Here's help file contains further detailed directions for using **Here**. If you would like to review

the help file before starting **Here**, just double-click on the file **here.hlp** from inside the Windows **File Manager**. You can browse through the help file sequentially from beginning to end by using the browse buttons (<< and >>).
