Product Description

EasyZIP Self-Extractor Pro is the first program in its class to provide all of the following features:

- Creates self-extracting archives which only take up 15 to 17 kilobytes more than the ZIP file which they were created from
- Creates 16 and 32-bit archives
- If you choose to create a 16-bit archive, you will not have to give up long filename support! If a platform which supports long filenames (such as Windows 95) is detected, long filenames will be preserved. Otherwise, filenames will automatically be truncated
- Works in the background after extraction to automatically run a program (without being prompted!) and optionally delete the extracted files after the program is done running
- If you like, it will display a progress bar while files are extracted so users will know how long something will take
- Uses a Wizard interface so creating archives is a snap

System Requirements

EasyZIP Self-Extractor Pro System Requirements:

- Personal computer with a 386 or higher processor running Microsoft Windows 95, Windows NT 3.51, or Windows 3.1 with Win32s 1.3, or a later version of any of the previous operating systems
- 1 MB of memory
- 1 MB of hard-disk space
- A VGA or higher resolution monitor is highly recommended
- A mouse is also recommended

Running Setup

- 1. If you are installing from a floppy, insert the disk into drive A.
- From Program Manager, go to the File menu and click on Run.
 Or, from the Start menu click on Run.
- 3. Type **a:\setup** (or the correct path to SETUP.EXE) and press ENTER.

The setup program will ask you where you would like to install the files. Setup will then install the files and create a group of icons for its programs.

Uninstallating

To uninstall EasyZIP Self-Extractor Pro, go to the EasyZIP Self-Extractor Pro group in Program Manager or on the Start Menu. Then double-click on **Uninstall EasyZIP Self-Extractor Pro**. You will be prompted as to whether or not you want to uninstall EasyZIP Self-Extractor Pro. If you choose Yes, the uninstaller will delete all icons and program files referencing EasyZIP Self-Extractor Pro.

License

This program is shareware. You have the right to use this program for evaluation purposes. If you decide you would like to distribute the archives you create with the program, you need to buy a registered copy before doing so. Feel free to give a copy of this program to your friends. We would be grateful if you would upload it to your favorite BBS too!

NOTE: You may not collect a fee of more than \$10 in distributing this shareware program. This should be more than enough to cover any costs you may have for the disk to hold the program and/or postage, etc.

Tutorial - Main Screen

The process of creating a self-extracting archive is very simple. This tutorial will outline the steps needed to create an archive.

When you start the program, a dialog box which looks like the one below will appear. The first step of this tutorial is to click on **Create a Self-Extracting Archive Wizard...**

ZIP File

The wizard appears. Type in the location of the ZIP file in the box, or locate it with the Browse button. Then click on **Next**.

Create a	Type the location and name of the ZIP file you want to create a self-extracting archive from. Or, search for the file by clicking Browse.

Title

Type in the title which will appear in the self-extracting archive. The title will appear in any dialog boxes displayed when the archive is run. Then click on **Next**.

The next step is to choose an icon. Accept the default, or choose your own by clicking on **Change Icon...** Then click on **Next**.

Create a 16 or 32-bit Archive

The self-extracting archive can be created as either a 16 or 32-bit archive. If the archive needs to run on Windows 3.x, then a 16-bit archives is the best choice. However, if the archive will only be run in Windows 95 or Windows NT, a 32-bit archive is the best choice. Click on either of the options and then **Next** to move on to the next step.

Prompting User for a Directory


Decide whether or not to prompt the user on where to place the files. Click on either of the options. Then click on **Next**.

Default Directory

Select a default directory. Then click on Next.

NOE: The last option will be different if you chose not to prompt the user.



Overwriting Files

While extracting files, the program may encounter a file with the same name that already exists. The program can prompt the user whether or not to overwrite the files. Or, it can choose one of the options automatically. Click on one of the options. Then click on **Next**.

Progress Bar

A progress bar may displayed when the program is run. This will let the user know how long the extraction should take. Click on one of the options. Then click on **Next**.

Run Program

The self-extracting archive can run a program once the files have been extracted. Click on one of the options. Then if you would like to run a program, type its name and any parameters you would like to use in the box. Then click on **Next**.

NOTE: If you are running an InstallShield installation and you want to delete the extracted files once the program is done running, you must add the **-SMS** parameter to then end of the **SETUP.EXE** command. This will ensure that extracted files will not be deleted until after the installation is done running.

Deleting Extracted Files

This option will be displayed if a program will be run by the self-extractor. It deletes the extracted files when the program is done running. It is especially useful after a setup program has run. Click on either of the options. Then click on **Next**.

Deleting the Archive

The self-extracting archive itself may be deleted once it has completed its tasks. This can be useful for download-and-run files found on certain online services. Click oneither of the options and then click on **Finish** to create the self-extracting archive.
