1.3 Introduction

What is Spitfire?

In a nutshell, Spitfire is a Palm Desktop for the AmigaOS. It provides a connection to 3Com's Palm Pilot Personal, Palm Pilot Professional, Palm III organizer, or IBM's WorkPad, and allows a user to HotSync these devcies with their Amiga.

1.4 Features

Features

Currently, Spitfire supports the following main features:

- Full backup and restoring of Pilot databases and files.
 - Multiple user support.
 - Install of files (prc, pdb) with or without a complete HotSync.
 - Changing of user name ids.
 - Add/Delete/Edit memos, with synchronization.
 - Add/Delete/Edit Addresses, with synchronization.
 - Viewing of To Do items.
 - Easy configurability with support of any serial device.

- An available serial port.
- Palm Pilot with it's cradle plugged into a serial port.
- AmigaOS 3.0 or greater.
- MUI 3.8 or greater.
- o MCC classes InfoText, TextInput, and NList
- PalmLink library 1.0 or greater

1.9 Installation

Installation

1) With your Amiga turned off, plug the Palm cradle into an available serial port. If your Amiga only has a 25-pin serial port then a 9-pin to 25-pin adapter will be required to plug the Pilot's cradle into the Amiga's standard serial port.

2) Use the Installer to copy the Spitfire files to your hard drive. The installer uses the standard Amiga installer program and will install Spitfire and its appropriate files onto your hard drive.

When Spitfire is executed for the first time on a system, it will ask the user:

- 1) to enter your user name id for the Pilot*
- 2) to set up the preferences and serial port settings that the cradle is connected to.
- 3) to perform a HotSync of the Pilot (therefore be sure to have your Pilot ready and its cradle connected to your Amiga).

This first time procedure will allow Spitfire to establish the proper accounts on your Pilot and Amiga.

If your Pilot has already been HotSync with another computer, then Spitfire will recognize this and create a new account on your Amiga. It will not overwrite a user name established on a Pilot unless specifically told to do so.

*(If you do not have a "virgin" Pilot, then enter the same name that your Pilot is synchronized with on the PC. If a different name is supplied then Spitfire will create a new user profile).

1.10 Usage

Usage

Please, also refer to the Pilot's User manual for help with terms and operation.

Main Window

The main graphical user interface window is divided into four main sections:

- 1) User currently selected for HotSync in the top of the window
- 2) Button bank located in the upper half of the window
- 3) Log/Conduit Tabs (listviews) in the lower middle half
- 4) Information window on the bottom of the window

Image Tool Bar

Along the top area of the window there are several buttons:

Install - Allows selection of applications to install at HotSync

Datebook - Opens the Datebook application

Address - Opens the Address book application

Memo - Opens the Memo Pad application

To Do - Opens the To Do application

HotSync - Begins HotSync according to Sync Operations defined.

To abort this process, double-click on the Abort button

that appears in the requester.

NOTE: Although currently you can play around with the conduits they are still not completed and thus not 100% functional!

Conduits

Here you can find a list of conduits that Spitfire supports. In addition to the Date Book, Address Book, To Do List, and Memo Pad conduits, Spitfire includes a System and Install conduits.

The System conduit backups up the system information stored in the Pilot. The Install conduit is used to install Pilot applications.

Double clicking on entries opens a window for altering conduit actions to be performed at HotSync time. This allows customization for each conduit in setting the direction in which you want to sync data.

This customization can be saved for future use, or set for temporary use, which affects only the next hotsync, thus reverting back to their saved state.

The supported sync actions are:

- 1) Pilot overwrites Amiga

·This will write information from the Pilot to the Amiga.

·You can also refer to this as a backup.

- 2) Amiga overwrites Pilot -

·This will write information from the Amiga to the Pilot.

·You can also refer to this as a restore.

- 3) Synchronize the files

·This will synchronize data between the Pilot and the Amiga.

- 4) Disabled

·This will turn off the conduit during a HotSync.

The Install conduit has a different action when doubled-clicked. Such an action open a window displaying the applications to be installed at hotsync. This list can be altered by adding or deleting applications.

HotSync Log

Displays feedback on the synchronizing operations.

Settings Window

The settings window is divided into two sections:

- 1) Directories
- 2) Serial Port

Directories

Application Dir - This is the default directory to where Pilot applications are normally kept on the Amiga.

Pilot Storage Dir - This is the directory where the pilot system and conduits are to be stored on the Amiga.

Serial Port

There are three parameters that require setting.

- 1) Device - Select the serial device that the Pilot cradle is attached to.
- If your serial device is not present in the popup listview then please type it into the string gadget.
- 2) Port - The port on the serial device that the cradle is connected to.
- 3) Baud - The maximum speed that the serial port supports.

This conduits has no interface and has the function of backupup/restoreing files that are not managed by the other conduits.

The Memo allows the viewing, editing, deleting, and adding of items. Selecting an item allows its contents to be viewed in the right-hand side area. Double-clicking of items opens up an edit window for that item.

The Address allows the viewing, editing, deleting, and adding of items. Selecting an item allows its contents to be viewed in the right-hand side area. Double-clicking of items opens up an edit window for that item.

A. Select the menu item Backup from under the menu Action. Spitfire will automatically adjust the conduit actions and do a backup.

Q. How do I do easily do a complete restoration of my Pilot?

A. Select the menu item Restore from under the menu Action. Spitfire will automatically adjust the conduit actions and restore your Pilot.

Q. I do not like the user name that my Pilot has set. Is there a way to change it?

A. Choose the menu item Change User Name from the menu Action.

Q. Can I "virginize" my Pilot with Spitfire?

A. Choose the menu item Change User Name from the menu Action and set the string gadget to be empty.

Q. Can I install applications files without doing an entire HotSync?

A. Use the menu item Install Files from the menu Action.

 - v0.12 - Correct bug in memo syncing.
 - Began implementing syncing of categories for memos (not active yet).
 - Several minor changes to Spitfire and memo conduit code.
 - v0.13 - Added ability to change a pilot's user name id.
 - Fixed some problems in synchronizing of memos.
 - Fixed problem of certain requesters popping up at the wrong times.
 - v0.14 - Sync log listview now becomes active at HotSync.
 - Disabled parts in conduits that are not fully completed for hotsyncing

 - Re-wrote many parts of the Address conduit
 - If there were zero items in Memos or Address then enforcer hits occurred

 - If change made to the same memo on the Amiga and Pilot, then the Amiga overwrites Pilot memo at sync.

 - Implemented new log list updater for the main Spitfire program from the throttle process. Should cure the graphci glitches reported by some.

 - Address book will now display and sort by company name in listview if first and last name fields are blank for an entry.
 - * v0.16 - Had a major HD crash in which I lost most of my HD (in fact, my HD is now dead, and I had to buy a new one). Luckily I did have a recent backup of the source code for Spitfire on floppy. I had to re-install and re-create my development environment though...
 - Changed demo expiration date to June 1, 1999.
 - Finished synchronizing of Addresses!
 - Entering notes greater than the Pilot limit of 4000 characters would crash Spitfire. This also could result in crashes with cut'n'paste feature of the textinput note editor.
 - Fixed illegal access of memory in Memo and Address which would cause unpredictable crashes.
