1.2 Description

ReturnReceipt.br is an ARexx for use with THOR, and also relies on a correctly configured SortMail trigger.

As you probably know, when you write messages in THOR there is an option in the "Extra Message Options" window to ask for a receipt from the sender. This effectively puts a "Return-Receipt-To: <address>" line in the header. What happens if somebody sends you a message like this asking for a receipt? Nothing :- (This is where my script comes in...

My script will automatically create a receipt message and add it as an event. It will add "RECEIPT:" to the beginning of the subject, and put the "To" address, message date, message id and the original subject in the message. Here's an example:

1.3 Installation & Usage

Installation is very simple. Just copy the ReturnReceipt.br to THOR's rexx directory. You can run the script manually if you want to, but this kind of defeats the objective ;-) Instead, I recommend that you configure a SortMail trigger to launch the script automatically when required...

- Run CfgSortMail.thor from within THOR and add a new trigger.
- Give it a name ("Return-Receipt" may be a good one).
- Make sure the relevant option is enabled so that the actual message doesn't get deleted.
- Turn on the "Match All Criteria" option.
- Add a search entry of type "Header", enter "Return-Receipt-To:" and then "@" as the string to search.
- Add a search entry of type "Header", enter "Status:" and then "U" as the string to search. This is required so that the trigger isn't activated by your own outgoing messages! This search entry can be anything really - just as long as it doesn't match outgoing messages.
- Add an action entry and select "Run an external ARexx script", select ReturnReceipt.br from the file requester, and then enter "%s %c %n" as the command line options.
- Select "Accept and return" and then "Save and exit"

If you've done that all correctly, whenever somebody asks for a receipt, one will be created and added as an event as soon as the message is added to the database.
