Installation

Distribution Files:

WIN_VW11.EXE WIN_VW11.HLP	The main executable file. You can put this file anywhere you wish. Help file for WinView v1.10
CTL3D.DLL	Dynamic link library used by WinView v1.10 . Place this file in your \ windows\system directory. Please make sure you don't have a newer copy of this library residing in your system directory. If you find one and decide to replace it with the one in this distribution, it's a good idea to make a backup of the file.
CBK.VBX	Extension library integral to some functions in WinView v1.10 . This file goes to your \windows\system directory.

File Not Included But Required:

VBRUN300.DLL Although this file is needed to run theprogram, it is not included in the package to reduce its size. If you don't have this file in your system (check your \windows or \windows\system directory) you can download it from the site where you acquired this program. If not, write the author and he'll be happy to send you a copy.

Accessing the PopUp Menu

To access the PopUp menu, click the right button on your mouse anywhere on the form, excluding the command buttons of course.

Examining a Specific Window

If you want to examine the attributes of a specific window visible on the desktop, choose the <u>Pointed</u> button. **WinView v1.10** will change the shape of the cursor to a small, solid, outlined box. Click on the window you want to examine.

Pointed Button

Pointe<u>d</u>

Allows you to point to a specific window, visible on the desktop, to examine.

Control Name

Displays the form or control's Visual Basic name.

Window Styles

Enumerates the window styles of the currently selected window.

Class Information

Displays the class information of the currently selected window.

Size

Displays the size, in pixels, of the currently selected window.

Position

Displays the position, in pixels, of the currently selected window.

Top Level

Enumerates all the top-level window currently on the desktop.

Owned

Enumerates all owned windows, if any, of the currently selected window.

Parent

Shows the parent, if any, of the currently selected window.

Children

Enumerates all children windows, if any, of the currently selected window.

Flash Window

Flashes the currently selected window, if applicable.

Pointed

Allows you to select a window on the desktop to snoop.

Clear List Box

Clears the list box.

Exit

Quits WinView v1.10.
