

Pen Edit Help

Pen Edit is an editor for text files. This program can be used to edit files that contains only text. The program was specifically designed to simplify the task of editing text files on pen based computers.

To position the insertion point, tap the pen at the desired location.

To correct text displayed in the boxed input corrector area, just write over the incorrect letters in the boxes. To load text into the corrector area, just double tap near the text you wish to correct.

File Menu

New

Clears existing text from the Edit Window (after prompting you to save any unsaved text)

Open

Prompts you for a filename. Then loads that file into the editor. A short cut for reopening one of the last five files you edited is to select that file from the bottom of the file menu.

Save

Saves the current file to disk. If the file has not been saved, then you will be prompted to enter a name for the file.

Save As

Prompts you for a new name to save the existing file as.

Print

Prints the current file

Exit

Exits the PenEdit program.

Edit Menu

Undo

Undoes the last editing operation if possible.

Cut

Copies any marked text to the Paste clipboard and then deletes the marked text from the editor.

Copy

Copies any marked text to the Paste clipboard.

Paste

Inserts any text in the Paste clipboard into the editor.

Delete

Deletes any marked text from the editor.

Select All

Marks the entire document as being selected.

Change Case

Inverts the case of the next character or of all the characters in the marked text.

Swap Number/Letter

This command is useful to fix some common handwriting recognition errors. For example: this command may be used to quickly change the letter I to the number 1. Simply position the insertion caret before the letter I and then select this command.

This command changes the next character or all the characters in the marked text according to the following swap table. Numbers may be switched to their matching letter or letters may be switched to their matching number.

Search Menu

Find

Prompts you for text to locate and then searches for the next occurrence of the text. You may specify that the document be search up or down from the cursor position. You may also specify whether the case of letters to be matched matter or not.

Replace

Use this command to replace the next occurrence (or all occurrences) of a string with some other text. The command prompts you for text to locate and for the new value. The command includes options to force the case to match and also allows you to specify that you want to be prompted before the found text is replaced.

Search Again

Repeats the last Find or Replace command.

Options Menu

The Options Menu allows you to customize the pen edit program. Any changes you make to the options are recorded in the penedit.ini file. The setting of these options will remain in effect the next time you run this program.

Font...

Allows you to pick the font, size, and style of the text displayed in the Edit window.

Word Wrap

When checked, words in the edit window will automatically wrap when you reach the end of a line. When word wrap is enabled you do not need to press the enter key at the end of each line. You should only press Enter when you want to force the next text to begin on a new line, such as at the end of a paragraph. If the size of the edit window is resized, the text you entered will be reformatted to fit the window's new size.

When the word wrap feature is disabled, text will not wrap from one line to the next. As you enter text, the window will scroll to allow you to insert more text. Also when the word wrap feature is disabled, a scroll bar will be displayed at the bottom of the edit window to allow you to display any text which does not fit in the edit window.

Tool Bar

This option allows you to disable the toolbar. When the toolbar is disabled it will not be displayed on the screen. Therefore, the size of the edit window will be slightly larger. Customizing the toolbar is accomplished by editing the penedit.ini file.

Corrector Line

The corrector line is the portion of the screen below the edit window where text is displayed in boxes. Text is automatically placed in both the edit window and the corrector line as it is recognized. You may correct that was misrecognized by simply writing over the incorrect letters in the corrector boxes. As you correct text, the changes will be made in both the edit window and the corrector window. You may also load the corrector window by double tapping before the text you need to correct in the edit window.

When the corrector line is disabled, it will not be displayed on the screen. Therefore the size of the edit window will be slightly larger.

Status Line

The status line displays information about what the tool on the toolbar under the cursor will do if tapped. It also displays a longer description about any currently selected menu items.

When the status line is disabled, it will not be displayed on the screen. Therefore the size of the edit window will be slightly larger.

Register...

Displays a window, where you can enter your registration key after you have registered

this shareware program.

Help Menu

Contents

Selecting this menu command will open the penedit help file using the windows help program.

About...

This option displays version and copyright information about the penedit program.

Modifying the Toolbar

Currently the tool bar can only be modified by editing the penedit.ini file. The "tools=" line lists codes which correspond to the tools that will be displayed on the toolbar. Most values indicate either a specific ASCII character or a menu item. Tool values from 1 to 255 are used to indicate an ASCII character code .
