1.2 The 16 Colour Palette

16 Colours on your Workbench
The 16 colours that I use on my Workbench are those from RomIcons9.
This is a direct quote from RomIcons9 RI.Guide about the installation of a ↔
modified 16 colour
Workbench.

Take it away Roman.

"Steps to install my 16 colour palette on your system:

- 1. Change your screenmode to 16 colors.
- 2. Load the User-Startup into your editor and change the MagicWB-Daemon to: Run >NIL: C:MagicWB-Demon 4,123,123,123 5,175,175,175 6,170,144,124 ↔ 7,255,169,151 8,0,0,255 9,50,50 10,96,128,96 11,226,209,119 ↔ 12,255,212,203 13,122,96,72 14,210,210,210 15,229,93,93
- 3. Do the same with your Startup-Sequence

4. Load Prefs/Palette and change the last four colours to 255,212,203 122,96,72 210,210,210 229,93,93 and save it. After re-boot everything should work fine."

1.4 Colour & Pointer

Colour & Pointer

As I have discussed the 16 MWB palette elsewhere Click Here to find out more.

This pointer is my creation.

After seeing the multitude of arrows and other weird and wonderful pointers out $\,\,\leftrightarrow\,\,$ there I thought it was time to develop my own pointer. It is a picture of a cartoon-like \leftrightarrow hand with an out-stretched index finger for the pointer. The wait picture is like the \leftrightarrow original Zzz cloud. I think they look much better than arrows and give my AMIGA (and ↩ maybe yours too) an individual touch that only owners of INTEL Based Machines can only drool \leftrightarrow over - Ha Ha. Geert Coelmont from Belgium found my pointer so interesting that he made a \leftrightarrow little programme to animate it. When you click the left mouse button the index finger of my hand \leftrightarrow pointer bends in response. So when you click an icon the hand actually pushes the icon down. \leftrightarrow It's a cute hack that has been stable on my computer for nearly six months without so much as a \leftrightarrow hick-up! Try it I know you'll like it. I know I do! To get PointerClick to work on your system just follow these simple steps. 1) Copy the supplied Pointer.Prefs to "ENVARC:sys/". This will replace your current mousepointer (make a copy if you don't want to loose it). 2) Copy PointerClick to "C:" 3) Add this line to your S:User-Startup: run >nil: <nil: C:PointerClick</pre> 4) Reboot your machine 5) Push left mousebutton !! Note: Nothing happens if the original 'hand' pointer is not active. Don't start PointerClick more than once. PointerClick cannot be deactivated, except by resetting.

1.5 Tomlcons4 Information

16 Colour Icons

Hi Everyone :-)!

Here is my forth collection of MWB Icons and other stuff that I have drawn or $\, \hookleftarrow \,$ created over the

last few months. Most of them require the modified 16 colour palette discussed $\, \hookleftarrow \,$ in RomIcons9 .

I am not an artist but use a registered version of Iconian and Picticon to cut $\,\leftrightarrow\,$ and paste images to produce the icons that are on your screen now. Once in a while $\, \leftrightarrow \,$ Personal Paint 6.3 came in handy as well ;-). Why do I insist to draw my icons using a 16 colour pallete? I find that if I use \leftrightarrow the dark grey colour (Colour 9:50, 50, 50) instead of the original blue (Colour 4:59, 103, \leftrightarrow 162) a better contrast and 3D effect is achieved. If you are using an 8 colour WB just \leftrightarrow recolour any icons, that you may find useful, to your own pallete. Many of the icons in this package are those from other packages which I have $\,\,\leftrightarrow\,\,$ recoloured and remodelled to accentuate their 3D features. Some, however, are completely \leftrightarrow original and may not look as professional as those which I have "borrowed" and played around with ;-) \leftrightarrow Click Here for a brief look at my Workbench Screen. I have also included some icons for two commercial programmes:- Scala and \leftrightarrow Organiser. I own both these programmes and was not satisfied with the boring 4 colour efforts provided \leftrightarrow by the programmers, so I made my own. The Scala icons use colour 8 (0, 0, 255) as a $\, \hookleftarrow \,$ background which may or may not be compatible with your workbench. I used this colour because I \leftrightarrow run MagicCopper which gives that great looking gradient background seen in my WB pic.

1.6 Boot-Pic

Boot Picture

Here is a picture which is suitable as boot-pic using a programme such as ↔ BootScreen or something similar. It is in the PAL HiRes Interlace format. This picture of a Tree-frog was converted from its JPEG original using \leftrightarrow Persoanl Paint 6.3®.

I think it's more interesting to display a picture which is aesthetically $\, \hookleftarrow \,$ pleasing and shows off

the colour capibilities of the Amiga rather than something that tells the owner $\, \leftrightarrow \,$ which operating

system he/she is using (they should know this anyway, it's their computer!).
