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This file replaces README.TXT, because WineBase for Windows is, after all, a Windows application and text files are something that belong in that wonderful world of DOS.

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Files on the Disk

The WineBase for Windows disk contains a number of files, most of which are compressed. An installation program called DECANT will expand these for you. The program files need 3.5 mb of free space on your hard disk. The User Guide files a further 6.0 mb, but you can delete these after printing.

System Requirements

Software

∎ Hardware

Any computer that runs Windows well (ie 386SX / 2 mb up).

Windows and WineBase for Windows are much happier running on a 486 with 4 mb of memory, and 486's are happier running with 8mb (or 16mb).

1000 kb of memory (free that is).

VGA 640 X 480 is minimum display requirement.

It will not run at EGA resolution (640 X 350).

Looks much better at 1024 X 768 resolution.

Hard Disk with 9.5mb of free disk space.

The manual needs 6.1mb but can be deleted after printing.

Not a PC

I have not at this stage any plans to write a version of WineBase for Windows to run on that other type of personal computer.

In recent times I have looked at this further, but a major problem has turned up, in that Apples still use a mouse with only one button. I looked at a Mac several years ago, and wondered why it had only one button and was surprised to find the latest PowerPC still uses this format!

As WineBase makes extensive use of both Left and Right mouse buttons (and I now know how to access the Middle button as well, and may be adding it soon), this does pose a problem.

Known Problems

OS/2

WineBase runs fine on OS/2 WIN, but you may have problems in running DECANT.

DECANT needs to drop out of Windows to a DOS Window to expand the files. If you are running OS/2 make sure you have this option turned on in OS/2.

286AT's

This program will not run on a 286 AT with only 1 mb of memory. If the program starts 'missing things' then lack of memory is the probable cause. In order to use all features of the program you will need about 1 mb of free memory.

WineBase for Windows has been written for speed, the drawback of this is that is rather memory hungry.

Video Cards

A few people have experienced problems with GPF's in module GDI.EXE. The program does not call any GDI functions in a way that is unusual, and upon investigating the matter it seems that certain video cards (their Software Drivers) are the cause of the problem, and not WineBase for Windows.

ATM Fonts

Until you select a font using the Options/Fonts menu choice, WineBase for Windows will choose the first font it finds that match the default font styles. This should be a True Type font, but on systems with ATM fonts installed, some strange ones indeed can be displayed. If the Status Line at the bottom of the Window is displaying strange symbols, then select a font and quit WineBase for Windows. The next time you start the program it will display in the selected font.

Disk Caching

If you are running a disk cache such as SmartDrv and the program is apparently performing a lot of disk access at startup and taking 15 seconds to do so, the probable cause is that Write caching is turned off. This shouldn't make any difference but if you turn it on the program will then fire up in a couple of seconds and will not access the hard disk as much (?).

WineBase for Windows is a Windows based Wine Cellar DataBase. It stores information on up to 1170 different wines (per file). Provides graphical display of wine maturity, cellar value and total stock. Graphs the structure of your cellar. Search on most fields. Choice of sort options. Prints sorted reports. Easy to add wines or edit existing stock. Keeps Transaction Files, tracking comings and goings, and you get to use both Mouse buttons!

WineBase for Windows and the GoldBook for WineBase are shipped on Australian made disks.

When a new feature (or several) is included, I test it for a while and when I am sure that it works OK (I don't always get this right), I then ship that version.

This occasionally leads to a version of the program that, to put it in the kindest possible terms, 'has a few problems'.

If you find a problem with WineBase for Windows please let me know about it. Chances are, that it has already been brought to my attention, but it may not have been.

If you are evaluating WineBase for Windows, and are put off registering it, because it appears to be doing something wrong, let me know. The problem may well have been fixed.

If you are using a registered version, and find a problem, let me know. Not only will the problem be fixed (if it hasn't been already), but you will be sent the latest 'Bug Free' version **FREE**.

Support

Some people think that because WineBase for Windows is so reasonably priced, that they shouldn't bother me for support, when they're having some difficulty with some aspect of the program.

I don't mind getting letters, eMail or phone calls about topics that you might think are too trivial to raise. If you are having a problem then the phone is the most effective method, as sometimes, questions and response's have to flow back and forward to get to the bottom of things.
