#EE001 - WILD ENCOUNTERS FAMILY FUN DAY (Rice Lake National Wildlife Refuge) Friday, June 7 from 9am - 2:30pm

Activities will take place at Twin Lakes except fishing A day filled with unique opportunities for families to enjoy together.

9:00, 10:00 and 11:00 – Birding 101 – Learn how to use binoculars and get tips on how to become a "Birder", a hobby that will provide you with a lifetime of fun. Binoculars and bird guides will be provided or you may bring your own. Led by Warren Nelson, Birder and Wildlife Photographer.

9:00 - 12:00 - Kids Krafts - Assorted froggy, hoppy and slithering fun activities will be available throughout the morning for kids of all ages. Activities will be led by fun, loving volunteers. Be sure to attend the 1:00 program to see live frogs, toads and snakes!



9:00, 10:00 and 11:00 – Nature Walk and Talk – Use your natural senses as you enjoy the sights and sounds of nature along the trail with Master Naturalist Pam Brand.

9:00, 10:00 and 11:00 – Nature Photography 101 – Bring your own camera and learn some tricks to taking better nature photos. Class to be led by an experienced/professional photographer.

9:00 - 12:00 - Fishing Fun - Fishing will be held at both north and south water control structures on the Rice River; fishing poles and bait are available for loan if needed. Experienced anglers will be on hand to assist. No fishing license needed for kids under the age of 16 and no license needed for parents or guardians fishing with kids under the age of 16 during this Take-A-Kid Fishing Weekend. Catch and release is encouraged.

9:00 - 1:00 - Bird Mist Netting (capturing wild songbirds) and Bird Banding Demonstration - An informative and up close encounter with real live biologists as they apply leg bands to songbirds captured while you lie in wait. Participants are strongly encouraged to ask questions.

11:30 – 12:30 – FREE Picnic Lunch at Twin Lakes; followed by an orientation to the Big Sandy Water Institute.

1:00 - 2:30 - Leaping Frogs, Hopping Toads, and Slithering Snakes - Get up close with live frogs, toads and snakes. Learn interesting facts on how these critters survive our looooong Minnesota winters! This program will be led by a naturalist from the Long Lake Conservation Center.



#EE002 - RIVERS AND LAKES FAIR (Rippleside Elementary) Saturday, June 15 from 9am - 2pm

The River and Lakes Fair is a fun filled event where folks of all ages can learn about our natural resources. Programs will focus on Aquatic Invasive Species, Birding by Ear, and the Connection Between People and Water Quality. Kids will enjoy building blue birdhouses, carnival games and learning the art of fly tying. The fair will include free water testing for nitrates and an aquarium of live fish from local lakes.

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#EE003 - ANIMAL BEHAVIOR STUDIES AND ZOOKEEPER FOR THE DAY AT THE DULUTH ZOO (Duluth)

Monday, June 17 from 8:30am-3:30pm Age: 8 and up Registration fee: \$5/student

Spend the day at the Duluth Zoo! At the zoo students will learn what it's like to be a field biologist as we uncover the mysterious lives of animals through observation and data recording. The will also experience what it's like to be a zookeeper! Student's will have the opportunity to prepare bear diets, tour behind-the-scenes, examine x-rays, and more!



#EE004 - KAYAKING 101 AND SIX SNEAKY SALAMANDERS (Army Corps of Engineers)

Tuesday, June 18 from 9:30am - 3pm Age: 8 and up

that they need to survive.

Explore the underwater habitat, learn about water stewardship, increase your fishing skills while learning how to cast a line, bait a hook and identify various species of fish. Fishing for pan fish on Lake Minnewawa with local anglers is a "favorite" for kids.

#EE006 - SNAPPING TURTLE ECOLOGY (Army Corps of Engineers) Monday, June 24 from 9:30 - 3pm Ages: 8 and up

Students will gain knowledge of snapping turtle ecology and reproduction physiology via slide show, local field trip and incubation of turtle eggs. Scientific data will be collected by the students to include day/date/time/ location of nest; nest site soil temperature and weather conditions, egg viability, mass and diameter; and incubation temperature of eggs. Students will go home with a turtle egg for incubation.

#EE007 - FORESTRY AND ARCHERY (Long Lake Conservation Center)

Tuesday, June 25 from 9:30am - 3pm Age: 8 and up Did you know that a forest is more than just trees! Let's spend the morning with Aitkin County Forestry Department discovering woods, wildlife and their different habitats. Students will find their way in the forest. They will learn if cutting trees is good or bad for the environment. This hands-on day will take students to places that will put them in touch with nature while learning how to protect our environment and the animal habitats.

The afternoon will be spent learning the proper mechanics of archery, field basics, history of archery and learning about the differ-

ent types of bows. This will be a hands-on session. Equipment will be provided. Please wear tennis or hiking shoes/boots, long pants and shirt; we will be in the woods. Bug spray would be useful! **Bus Pickup: McGregor School at 9:10am** Bus Return: McGregor School 3:20pm

#EE008 - BIRDS AND MAMMALS (School/Rice Lake National Wildlife Refuge) Wednesday, June 26 from 9:30am - 3pm Age: 8 and up

Students will spend the day talking about the life of a bird and mammals. This day will include many hands on activities studying bird specimens and frozen mammal skins. The study of teeth, claws, coloration, body size/shape and how they are related to the type of lifestyle they have. Students will be listening to bird songs and calls and learning about things like "where does a bird sleep?" why do they sing?" and "why / when / how do they migrate?". Students will dissect some owl pellets and finish the day as they travel to the refuge to do some bird watching. Students may bring their own binoculars or we will provide them.

#EE009 -SMALL WATERCRAFT CERTIFICATION & PORTABLE SAWMILL (Army Corps of Engineers)

Monday, July 8 from 9:30am - 3pm Age: 8 and up Students will learn about various forms of impairment and stressors that can affect their boating skills. This interactive program will utilize the Corps of Engineers electric boats to demonstrate how the environment and alcohol can affect driving skills. Life jackets will be provided for students. Students will also observe a portable sawmill; from a tree to a birdhouse all in

one day. They will be hands-on building birdhouses from the trees that were cut into boards and then used to construct the birdhouse. They will go home with their newly constructed birdhouse for months of enjoyment to come.

#EE011 – FISHING & ANIMAL ADAPTATIONS AND NATURE JOURNALING (Rice Lake National Wildlife Refuge)

Wednesday, July 10 from 9:30am - 3pm Age: 8 and up This program introduces students to the adaptations of several animals that call Rice Lake Refuge home. Ever wonder why a beaver has that tail? Dress up like one and find out! Students will play games to learn about the special features animals have and how their activities, behaviors, and body parts help the animal to survive. Participants will also fine-tune their observation skills on a short nature hike and receive a nature journal to take home. More fun

will be had when everyone is given the opportunity to catch fish in the Rice River. Fishing rods, bait, tackle will be provided and experienced anglers will offer assistance.

#EE012 – SNORKELING, HIKING, POND STUDY AND DIGITAL BRIDGE TO NATURE PROGRAM (Savanna Portage State Park)

Monday, July 15 from 9:30am - 3pm Age: 8 and up Come discover what critters live in Loon Lake! Students will have time to wade in the lake and catch those critters for a pond study. Staff will give students an opportunity to look under small microscopes at creatures and returning them to their watery home when finished. For more exploration the morning will include a "Digital Bridge to Nature" inspired photography program. Students will explore nature through the lens of a camera.



During the afternoon hours students will spend time in the water snorkeling... peeking at lake creatures that share the waters when swimming. A hike around the lake wandering through the forest habitat identifying forest, prairies and wetlands is a must!

Monday-Thursday; July 22 - 25 and July 29 - August 1



American Red Cross Water Safety Instructor: Shari Tetrick Lifequard: Jake Krezowski

Shari Tetrick, Water Safety Instructor brings you and your child 30+ years of experience working with youth and adults teaching swimming lessons. Your child will

receive 30 minutes of water safety instruction and 15 minutes of practice and free time each day. 12:15pm - Level 6: Swimming and skill proficiency; refines the strokes so participants swim them with ease, efficiency, power and smoothness over greater distances.

11:30am – Level 5: Stroke Refinement: provides further coordination and refinement of strokes.

10:45am - Level 4: Stroke Improvement: develops confidence in the skills learned and improves other aquatic skills.

10:00pm – Level 3: Stroke development; builds on the skills in Level 2 through additional guided practice in deeper waters.

1:45pm – Level 2: Fundamental Aquatic Skills; builds on the skills learned in Level 1 and gives participants success with fundamental skills such as floating and basic locomotion.

1:00pm - Level 1: Students must be 6 years old by 8/31/13. Introduction to Water Skills; helps students feel comfortable in the water and to enjoy the water safely.
