SOCIAL STUDIES

*US HISTORY 9

LENGTH: 1 SEMESTER GRADE: 9 REQUIRED 1 SOCIAL STUDIES CREDIT

Examines the history of the United States from the beginning of the Civil War or Reconstruction era.

*US HISTORY 10A & B

LENGTH: 2 SEMESTERS GRADE: 10 REQUIRED 2 SOCIAL STUDIES CREDITS

This course focuses on past events making up our nation's history. Emphasis is on building a historical perspective through inquiry. There are ten major themes threaded throughout both semesters They are American Democracy, Civil Rights & Liberties, Economic Development, Geography, US in World Affairs, the Individual and Family, Humanities and Religion, Conflict and Cooperation and the Influence of Technology.

*WORLD HISTORY A & B

LENGTH: 2 SEMESTERS GRADE: 11 REQUIRED 2 SOCIAL STUDIES CREDITS

This course deals with the study of major periods and events in global history from prehistoric times to the present. Students will understand that today's society, its strengths and weaknesses, are the result of events that spread backwards thousands of years. This course covers those events that are the foundation of our society today. It also points out the causes for those tragic events that will hopefully not be repeated in the future.

TECH/VOCATIONAL

ADVANCED WOODS

LENGTH: 1 SEMESTER GRADES: 10-12

1 VOCATIONAL/TECHNICAL CREDIT

This is a machine woods class. The students will expand on their skills and knowledge base from the Beginning Woods class. The project in this class takes the entire semester.

AUTO MAINTENANCE

LENGTH: 1 SEMESTER

GRADES: 11 & 12

1 VOCATIONAL/TECHNICAL CREDIT

This is a course designed for students interested in understanding the basic systems in their car. There are job project areas that cover oil changes to cleaning your upholstery. We will also discuss the buying and selling of new and used cars.

BEGINNING WOODS

LENGTH: 1 SEMESTER GRADES: 9 & 10

1 VOCATIONAL/TECHNICAL CREDIT

This is a basic woods class, with a required project. The project will include the basics of joinery, gluing, cutting to size, shaping, sanding and finishing. Once students have finished this project, they can work on a project of their own.

BUILDING TRADES

LENGTH: 1 SEMESTER GRADES: 11 & 12

1 VOCATIONAL/TECHNICAL CREDIT

Carpentry is a program for development of manual skill as well as knowledge and understanding of basic principles and practices. This is a hands-on carpentry class in house construction, providing basic instruction in residential home construction from the ground up.

METALS 1

LENGTH: 1 SEMESTER GRADES: 10-12

1 VOCATIONAL/TECHNICAL CREDIT

In this class you learn the basics of sheet metal fabrication by completing three projects. The second half of the class students will learn the basics of three different types of welding.

METALS 2

LENGTH: 1 SEMESTER

GRADES: 11 & 12

1 VOCATIONAL/TECHNICAL CREDIT

Students will increase their skills from Metals 1 on metal fabrication. Students will be introduced to the basics of the metal lathe and to basics of foundry. Foundry is working with a mold and pouring molten metal into the mold.

SMALL ENGINES

LENGTH: 1 SEMESTER

GRADES: 9-12

1 VOCATIONAL/TECHNICAL CREDIT

This is a hands-on course designed to provide basic information on two and four cycle engines, their systems, maintenance practices, service techniques and repair procedures. Career opportunities are also explored.

YEARBOOK

LENGTH: 2 SEMESTERS

GRADES: 11 & 12

2 VOCATIONAL/TECHNICAL CREDITS

Yearbook is a very comprehensive class and requires extra work outside the classroom. Students must have an interest in journalism, photography and art before joining this class. Computer skills are also necessary due to the fact that the yearbook is produced entirely digitally. Because the yearbook is self-supporting, students will also be required to sell the book, sell advertising and organize a budget
