# From the Principal

As a new school year approaches, students will see some new faces in the high school. I am very pleased and excited to introduce Mr. Jerod Fischer who will be teaching English, Mr. Erik Leist who will be teaching band, Mr. Barrett Willard who will be teaching

Industrial Arts, and Mr. Josh Wahlin who will be teaching Physical Education. I would encourage you to stop in during open house or during the first few weeks to meet these new staff members.

I would also like to ask for help and support from parents on a couple of issues that seem to arise every year. The first is dress code....

McGregor school policy states that Inappropriate dress includes but is not limited to the following: 1) "Short shorts," skimpy tank tops, exposed underwear, tops that expose the midriff, and other clothing that is not keeping with community standards. 2) Clothing bearing a message that is lewd, vulgar, or obscene. 3) Apparel

promoting products or activities that are illegal for use by minors. 4) Emblems, badges, symbols, signs, words, objects, or pictures on clothing or jewelry communicating a message that is racist, sexist, or otherwise derogatory to a protected minority group, evidences gang membership or affiliation, or approves, advances or provokes any form of harassment or violence.

This is not a new policy, and the vast majority of our students are in compliance. However, there are some students that are not in compliance, and it is an uncomfortable situation for all involved when a student is "talked to" about his/her attire. If students are in violation of this dress code, he/she will be asked to change, turn a shirt inside out, or cover it up.

The second issue that I would like your help and support with is contacting students during the day. Students are NOT to have cell phones on during class. Please do not call or text students during the day expecting an immediate reply. If you must contact your student immediately, please contact Deb in the high school office. McGregor High School does have a liberal cell phone policy where students can use their phones during lunch and during passing time.

We ask that you help by supporting these policies so that students and teachers can concentrate on teaching and learning with fewer distractions, and we can have a very successful school year.

## **Student Medication Policy**



It is sometimes necessary for students to take medication while in school. The school policy regarding prescription and over-the-counter medication is as follows:

- 1. The parents and doctor should inform the school nurse by letter/note as to the reason for the medication and how long the student will be taking it.
- 2. Medication must be in the original bottle and properly labeled as to the type, when it is to be given, and the amount to be given. Medication will not be given if not in the original container.
- 3. The school nurse will keep a list of the children needing medication and will give it only with written permission of the parent/guardian and prescribing physician. This includes all medication, including cough drops, vitamins, etc.
- 4. The school will not provide any medicine to students. Parents be assured that medication in the proper dosage will be taken, that medication will not be lost or think a child will accidentally take the wrong medication.

## **School Closing Procedures**

Throughout the school year in Northern Minnesota a major consideration is the closing of school due to weather conditions. The criteria for closing school is the safety of students and employees. The decision to close

school is made by the Superintendent.

When school has been canceled, radio stations KKIN/KEZZ,

KDAL, WCCO, WEBC, WKKQ, WTBX and KBEK, as well as TV stations KBJR, WDIO, KDLH, KARE 11, KMSP, KSTP & FOX 9 will be used to inform the public as soon as the decision is

made. Parents are urged to listen to these stations when a weather emergency is probable. The announcement will be "McGregor ISD #4" and will include elementary, high school, early childhood & the ALP.

When school is to be dismissed early due to weather conditions, the radio stations will also be notified. If possible, the decision to dismiss early will be made by 12 noon.

Prior to making the decision to close school, a number of sources are contacted. In addition to the weather service, the school will check with law enforcement authorities, the highway

department and bus drivers. A difficult situation exists because of the size of our school district. While the northern part may be having a reasonably nice winter day, the southern part, almost 70 miles away, may be in the midst of a blinding snowstorm.

Sometimes parents may not be comfortable sending their child to school when the weather is questionable. The decision to send the student is the parents decision. If the parent feels it would be unsafe, they should keep their child at home even if school is open. The parents are in the best position to know the individual situation.

# McGregor School District Facility Use Policy

The Board of Education believes that the public schools are owned and operated by and for its patrons and that the schools become an integral part of the community in terms of its intellectual and social expression and development. To this end the Board encourages the public use of school facilities.

School sponsored activities shall have first priority. The right to authorize use of school facilities shall be retained by the district. Such use will be determined by district policy and will be only at such times as the facilities required are not being used for school activities.

# Obligations of a Public School District to Provide Special Education Services

## Private School or Home School Setting

Under Minnesota law, a "nonpublic school" is defined to include state approved home schools and private schools (see Minn. Stat. 123B.41, subd 9). Parents who chose to educate a child with a disability in a home school or a private school are making a private school placement.

The school district is obligated, upon request, to evaluate a child to determine special education eligibility. If a child is found eligible for special education services, the school district is required to develop an Individual Services Plan (ISP) that describes the specific special education and related services that the school district will provide. The school district is responsible for initiating and conducting meetings to develop, review and revise the services plan. Procedural safeguards will be provided to you that explain the district's obligation to locate, evaluate, identify, and re-evaluate children with disabilities.

The school district maintains the right to determine the location of services and is not obligated to provide special education benefits or services that are equal to services provided to public school children. The public school is required to consult with you to decide what services will be provided, how services will be provided, and how the services will be evaluated. You will be given the opportunity to express your views, however, the school district will make the final decisions with respect to the services provided.

# Annual Notification of Asbestos Safety

As a result of federal legislation (Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act - AHERA), each primary and secondary school in the nation is required to complete a stringent inspection for asbestos and to develop a plan of management for all asbestos-containing building materials. The McGregor School District has a goal to be in full compliance with this law and is following the spirit, as well as, the letter of the law. As a matter of policy, the district shall continue to maintain a safe and healthful environment for our community's youth and employees.

In keeping with this legislation, all buildings owned by the McGregor School District were inspected by EPA accredited inspectors and samples were analyzed by an independent laboratory. Based on the inspection, the school prepared and the state approved a comprehensive management plan for handling the asbestos located within its buildings safely and responsibly.

Furthermore, the McGregor School District has completed their 3-Year Re-inspection required by AHERA. Our district buildings, where asbestos-containing materials were found, are under repair, removal and Operations and Maintenance.

This past year McGregor School District conducted the following with respect to its asbestos containing building materials:

## Implemented our Operations and Maintenance Program

Federal law requires a periodic walkthrough (called "surveillance") every six months of each area containing asbestos. In addition, the law requires all buildings to be re-inspected three years after a management plan is in effect.

Short-term workers (outside contractors i.e., telephone repair workers, electricians and exterminators) must be provided information regarding the location of asbestos in which they may come into contact. All short-term workers shall contact the District Building & Grounds Head before commencing work.

The McGregor School District has a list of the location(s), type(s) of asbestos containing materials found in each school building and a description and time-table for their proper management. A copy of the Asbestos Management Plan is available for review. Copies are available at 25 cents per page. Questions related to the plan should be directed to the District Office at 218-768-2111.

## No Shots, No School....

## It's the Law in Minnesota



These are the shots the school law requires.

Parents may get a legal exemption from the school law for medical reasons or conscientiously held beliefs. Children entering Kindergarten and 7th grade must now have proof of having had chicken pox or the varicella vaccine. These forms are available from the nurse's office. All children should be protected by hepatitis B shots - not just those required to have them by law. For more information, call your doctor, clinic or health plan. Information provided by the MN Department of Health.

- Varicella shots not required if child already had chickenpox disease. A second shot will be required for kindergarten and 7<sup>st</sup> grade in fall, 2009.
- \*\* If a child received a Td at age 7-10 years they do not necessarily need another one at age 11-12. However, they must receive another shot of Td or Tdap 10 years after their last one.
- \*\*\* An alternate 2-shot schedule of hepatitis B may also be used for kids from age 11 through 15 years
- \*\*\*\* The Hib requirement is temporarily suspended due to a vaccine shortage

To go to school in Minnesota, students must show they've had these immunizations or file a legal exemption with the school.

Parents may file a medical exemption signed by a healthcare provider or a conscientious objection signed by a parent/guardian and notarized.

Other immunizations recommended for school kids, but not required by the School Immunization Laws

- Influenza (flu) each year for children age 6 months through 18 years especially those with risk factors like asthma and
- Meningococcal for age 11-18
- Human papillomavirus (HPV) for girls age 11-18

# **Indoor Air Quality Notice**



The McGregor School District is proud to be taking a leadership role in providing a safe, comfortable, and productive environment for our students and staff so that we achieve our core mission - educating students. Our school will follow the EPA guidance to improve our indoor air quality by preventing as many IAQ problems as possible, and by quickly responding to any IAQ problems that may arise. Good air quality requires an ongoing commitment by everyone in our school, because each of us daily makes decisions and performs activities that affects the quality of the air we breathe.

School staff, students and parents can obtain checklists or self-help information so they can properly evaluate their child's home or other out of school situation by contacting the school. Staff and parents can also obtain information about school facility construction, maintenance and housekeeping practice, chemicals used, mold and HVAC related information, chemical producing academic subjects and pesticide and herbicide applications to determine the extent of which the school activities contribute to a child's symptoms by contacting the school.

The 1997 State Legislature developed a new formula for compensatory aids based on those children eligible for the program. Some families are eligible but do not choose to access the program, so that is why we are asking families to complete the form. All information is confidential, and can only be identified to the State for purposes of calculating aids. Thank you very much for your cooperation in helping us obtain all the revenue we have available to the school.

FREE AND REDUCED APPLICATION FORMS: Please return this form prior to school beginning. This was mailed in July. If you need another, please call for one.

LUNCH PAYMENTS: Payments can be mailed to the attention of Greta Kulju or paid in the commons between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. daily. You may include all of your children on one check, just be sure to indicate the amount you are paying for each child, including their account number.

ENTREES AND EXTRA MILK: Students in grades K-12 can purchase extra breakfast entrees at \$1.25; extra lunch entrees at \$1.50 and extra milk at \$.50 per carton.

SALAD BAR: Students in grades 4-12 can choose the Salad Bar in lieu of the regular lunch line.

K-6 lunch is \$2.00 and High School is \$2.25. Adult lunch is \$4.25.

## **Driver's Education**



Driver's Education classroom instruction will take place during the school day as part of your child's 9th grade curriculum. The class will be taught

twice during the 10/11 school year with the oldest students scheduled to take the class 1st quarter and the remaining students taking the class 3rd quarter. Behind the Wheel will be scheduled after school and during the summer months with Mr. Grones and Mr. Lemire once your child has completed their classroom instruction at McGregor High School and paid the fee.

New laws have been put into place as of August 1, 2008. If you have a teenage driver please note the changes and discuss with your child.

# Health Checkups & Sports Physicals: Helping Kids Do Their Best



How long has it been since your child had a health checkup? Is he or she planning on participating in sports? Regular checkups are important to help keep children healthy. A child who is healthy will perform better in school. Through regular health checkups, problems can be found and treated early, before they become serious. Hearing and vision tests will make sure that a child is able to see and hear in his or her classroom. School age children need a complete checkup at least every other year.

The Minnesota State High School League requires students to have Sports Physicals every three years to participate in sports. Athletes need to be healthy and well to perform their best.

If it has been two years or more since your child had a checkup, call your clinic soon to schedule an appointment. If your child is on Medical Assistance or Minnesota Care, ask for a Child and Teen Checkup when you make the appointment.

## **General Pesticide Notice for Parents & Guardians**

A Minnesota state law went into effect in the year 2000 that requires schools to inform parents and guardians if they apply certain pesticides on school property.

Specifically, this law requires schools that apply these pesticides to maintain an estimated schedule of pesticide applications and to make the schedule available to parents and guardians for review or copying each school office.

State law also requires that you be told that the long-term health effects on children from the application of such pesticides or the class of chemicals to which they belong may not be fully understood.

If you would like to be notified prior to pesticide applications made on days other than those specified in the estimated schedule, please contact Rick Christensen Building & Grounds Supervisor.

## 21st CCLC PROGRAM

Our District 21st Century Community Learning Center grant has been renewed for an additional two years. This means we will be able to continue to offer academic support and afterschool enrichment opportunities for our students. 21st CCLC is operated with Federal funding administered by the State of Minnesota, Department of Education.

Homework Help and Open Computer Labs – for students in grades 4-12 will be available beginning the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of school. Watch for poster and bulletin information when school begins.

**Theater Program –** Our new theater program offered through 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC will offer 3 opportunities for performing in the 2010-2011 school year.

**Small Group Mentoring** – All 7<sup>th</sup> graders are assigned a 7<sup>th</sup> grade teacher who will act as mentor for a small group during the school year. Mentors are provided to assist our new 7<sup>th</sup> graders in transitioning form 6<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> grade with minimal difficulty. Mentor group recreational activities as well as academic and social support are part of what 7<sup>th</sup> graders can expect as participants. Students in grades 8-10 are also offered Mentor Group opportunities that will be advertised through the bulletin as soon as school begins.

**Fall Community Musical –** This community theater production of "The Music Man" is open to performers age 10 through adult and is a collaborative effort between ISD 4 and Kids Plus Ageless Friendships.
