The Windows Help system is used by our magazines. It's a convenient way to view Hypertext files like the WinOnLine magazine you are reading now. Here are a few tips to make your reading more pleasurable and convenient:

The Help Button Bar at the top is arranged to help you move easily through the magazine:

The Contents button, when clicked, will return you to our Table of Contents

Search starts a dialog box with all the keywords that can refer to different sections and articles in the magazine. Try it and see.

History displays a listing of the places in the magazine you have been so you can return

Print Topic will send the article you are currently reading to the printer. It will not print "popup" boxes, though.

<<Page | Page>> can perhaps be the best way to view WinOnLine Publications. With these buttons you can browse through the magazine in page order, just as you would a paper magazine.

You may use the keyboard Page Up, Page Down and Up and Down Arrow keys to forward and backward in an article, or use mouse clicks on the vertical bar shown on the right.

The automatic **Pop-Ups** throughout the issue can be cleared from view by a simple mouse click anywhere on the screen. You will find that some may have a special bit of text that, when clicked, will take you even further to another page, function or popup. Using the **Back** button will always return you to where you have been.

Certain bits of text may be a different color be underlined, usually indicating that clicking on them will cause something to happen. Certain graphics, such as the authors' at the close of each article, are keyed to a popup image such as information about the author. When you see your arrow cursor change to a hand, you are on such a spot. <u>Click on this text</u> (see the special color and how your cursor changes?) to see what happens.

We hope you will enjoy the WinOnLine publication. If you want to print this page as a reference, click on **Print Topic** on the button bar.

Now click **Back** on the button bar to resume reading where you left off.

A FOND LOOK BACK

from Bob Gollihu

Hard to believe that we've come this far. Back in **June 1991**, a small staff of writers began publishing daily "NEWS" on Windows OnLineTM. These brief articles were meant to be read when members logged onto the BBS, and each writer had a day of the week for their article to be published.

Next came **Windows Online, the Weekly**[™], born on **April 25, 1992.** Our growing cadre of writers assembled their efforts into an ezine, in ASCII but also in Windows Write, complete with illustrations. But the limitations of Write gnawed at our spirit.

WOLW changed format from a Windows Write file to a Windows HELP file on June 15, 1992, with Issue #45. It opened so many new avenues as we recognized that more and more PC users were making Windows their system of choice. The companion ASCII version was dropped in early October. The HELP file has allowed us to add bigger graphics and hypertext links to the publication.

But change has always been the magazine's middle name. As the issues became more complex, preparation time was more important. Issue #62 introduced our current name, the **WinOnLine ReviewTM** on **October 10, 1992.** At this point **WOLR** began its plan to publish on the 15th and 30th of each month.

Who can forget **March 12, 1993**? It's when Wolly came into our lives, as the **WinOnLine Review**TM **Shareware Edition** published its first issue. At its birth it was published weekly, usually with a feature shareware review and group of Shareware Briefs by our often caustic friend, Wolly. It was an immediate hit, and included a listing of the latest files posted on Windows OnLineTM. With the introduction of the **Shareware Edition**, the original **WinOnLine Review**TM became a commercial-only publication that was published monthly.

We introduced sound and animation to both magazines in January 1994. We've since dropped the animation due to its overhead, but enjoyed it while it lasted.

As 1994 dawned, the **Shareware Edition** was reeled back in to become a monthly published on the 15th, alternating with **WOLR**, which was published on the last day of each month. Alas, Wolly ended his run as an independent as we published the final **WinOnLine Review[™] Shareware Edition**, Issue 46, on **October 14, 1994.** But, of course, Wolly didn't retire to Florida; his Briefs and all the fine shareware reviews were merged back into the **WinOnLine Review** in **December 1994**, with WOLR92.

Not content to simply surf the net, we decided to make some waves of our own. In **1995** we brought all our current and past magazines to our very own World Wide Web site: http://www.cris.com/wol Some of our latest issues are also available for on-line Web reading, duplicated in the latest version of HTML. What could be next?? We hope you will stay with us as we continue to evolve.

Be sure to download WOLRIDX1.ZIP (142K), a Windows Help file with an index of all the feature reviews and shareware briefs and their publications. It also includes a bonus text search feature, to help you find articles even more quickly.

It's an unfortunate thing to see a good piece of shareware apparently lost or abandoned. Searches for Syncit turned up no version any newer than the one you have, and reviews of databases to which we have access returned no hits on Sitback. This is rather common among mediocre shareware authors (although not common enough) who lose interest due to lack of registrations. However, we have seen and reported on authors who have produced very professional and useful shareware, such as Syncit, who have abandoned their efforts because of lack of remuneration. All we can say is, if you like it register it — it's the only way we'll keep the good stuff coming. If anyone knows what happened to Sitback Technologies, let us or Mr. Burt know.



Quick Takes and Pure Opinion from Wolly




Moving installed Windows programs from one location to another is, at best, a detailed and often risky proposition. Suddenly, you discover that Windows is delivering important messages to the wrong location. That new hard drive installation went smoothly, but there's no Fred Rogers welcoming you to the neighborhood. Nope, there's no DOS "hey, gang, as long as we're all in the same directory, we're happy" games here! Change of Address (COA) is a really slick program that can update your temporarily misunderstood INI and GRP files as well as the dreaded registration database. You can select INI and GRP files and use the search and replace utility to update everybody, including your registration database. COA will automatically make updates for you, or you can use the handy editing utilities included. Wolly suggests you grab COA.ZIP (273K) and slip it into your Swiss Army Knife directory. You never can tell when you have to cut yourself out of a mess. The source is included, too, if you're one of those techie types, like the author. Thanks to PC Magazine Technical Editor Neil J. Rubenking for this freeware goodie.





There are times that you or your delicate 28.8 datacomm download would rather not be interrupted by your resource-hungry, loud and obnoxious screen saver. NoSave is a wonderful freeware program that, once engaged, keeps your keyboard and mouse inactivity a secret from your screen saver, keeping it at bay. Wolly suggests that NOSAV10A.ZIP (12K) is a tiny and good addition to your Real World Swiss Army Knife directory of handy goodies. Thanks to author Mike Ellis for a good idea, simply executed and kindly donated for the public good.

So you won't even get too moist when the bills come



There is a tragic addiction spreading like wildfire throughout the world. Yes, fellow citizens, far worse than *new cellular phone disease*, it's the dreaded *surfus onlinis*. Citizens all over the globe are staring blankly beyond the focus point of their monitors for hours on end, being bombarded and overwhelmed into submission by WWW pages, wandering avatars, mindless online chats, and, oh yes, worst of all, on-line shopping malls! Meanwhile, their on-line and telecomm charges climb into the stratosphere. Oakley Data Services to the rescue, with this wonder. No, it isn't just a simple timer, **SmartSurf has more bells and whistles** than you can shake your tired mouse finger at. Each of your services can be tagged with a "Service ID" along with separate "Charge Bands." Yep, that means you can input a **specific service's hourly charges in conjunction with your long distance provider's charges, and make them different for the various times of the day and week.** Very cool. You can even set a "negotiation delay" to account for the dialing and connection time. SmartSurf can be set up to **start automatically when you open a given service's software** or run manually, and the **records it keeps can be exported for**

use in a spreadsheet. Oakley brings **a new dimension to the shareware world** — the best Wolly can do is call this **batteryware.** A bar measures the amount of charge in the "cells" powering SmartSurf. To keep it operational, **you must "recharge" these batteries by visiting the Oakley World Wide Web site to download a recharge** (Wolly made a visit for a 2K, 90-day recharge). Pretty clever marketing strategy, sez Wolly, and you probably won't mind the visit since we've found all these "Smart" programs to be worth a look. Grab **SMTSRF11.ZIP** (202K) and check out the depth of this useful application.



If you have the same aversion to Windows Explorer as does Wolly, check out **Drag and File's new Windows 95 release!** You can **open up to ten windows** and tile or cascade 'em, and bring a familiarity and ease of use to Win95. However, in keeping with the new host OS, you can **summon context menus at the click of your right mouse button**, and of course, **view, copy, move, or delete files.** As usual, Drag and File includes its **drive bar, formatting, and copying utilities.** Unbundled from the Windows 95 version of **DF95.ZIP** (518K) is one of Wolly's favored unarchivers, Drag and Zip, as well as the very cool Drag and View Gold file viewer. Both are incorporated within the current Windows 3.1 release of Drag and File; the Win95 versions are both due for a later release (oh boy — Wolly can't wait!). Anywho, Wolly suggests you **enjoy the advantages of Drag and File over Explorer**, and register for **\$35.00.** Early registrees will automatically be shipped the final version when Windows 95 is, at last, released.

Now, whenever you want to execute the saved sequence of keystrokes, simply press the assigned play key. Unlike Recorder, there's no need to switch away from your application. It works with any Windows program. Play and record **commands can be assigned to any of the function keys** between F1-F12 letting you select keys that don't interfere with ones you're already using. Download **EM201.ZIP** (72K) and check it out. Registration for single users is **\$25.00**; Wolly's not sure about married ones <g>.

The file manager style interface breeds familiarity and delivers support for most anything you'd want to do on the Internet: HTML 2.0 Web Browsing with some Netscape enhancements, VT100 Telnet, FTP, a few different flavors of E-Mail, viewers for BMP, ICO, XBM, GIF, WAV, AU, SND, and AIFF, and more. The retail price when released has not yet been determined, but you can grab this freeware beta EMIS_B2A.EXE (2543K) and give 'er a test drive. Even those old command line net vets may see the benefit from being able to drag and drop files or even Web images to a local drive to execute a quick FTP. Very cool.



No offense, we all started once. **PCBoard is one of the most popular BBS software,** near and dear to our hearts here at Windows OnLineTM. **PCBGUIDE.ZIP** (71K) is a help file with all of the PC Board commands for you to check out, while off-line, to become familiar with this great system, without feeling the pressure to perform. Wolly admits that it's not the help file you see here, but the facts are all there and pretty easy to understand. Freeware from the developers of PCBoard. Anybody else out there with a semi-functioning **Hayes ESP card**? Wolly had stuck that pretty little card in his PC a while back, but could never get it to act as anything more than a plain old UART. The software wasn't quite up to snuff, either, unpredictable being a compliment. Well, just in time (well, a little bit late) **ESP21A.EXE** (235K) showed up, as a **freeware software update**, and Wolly's a happy camper. No, the install didn't go flawlessly, since it left the old ESP driver in there to conflict with the new, but once that was resolved, Yippee! A few new lines in SYSTEM.INI fine tune both the ESP and Windows' behavior, while a nice and **brand new little**

applet called ESP Monitor can be loaded to keep track of your BPS rate and delivers TD, CD, RD, and SD mini modem lights. A new entry in Control Panel allows changes and offers some new options. "I'm glad that this and bunches of other new drivers appear on Windows OnLine[™] (BBS) each month," sez Wolly, as he leans back and watches the little lights flash, reflecting his speedy data transfer.



Wolly's Rule #83 is that *you always have to watch the marketeers*, and it's reinforced here. NoteBook '95 **promotes itself as a Windows '95 WinPad replacement, whatever that is?** Perhaps it could be a NotePad replacement, certainly not a WordPad replacement, but in any case one should be aware of the fact that it is actually **a garden variety, 16-bit Visual Basic 3.0 application.** It's an MDI application, so you can load in multiple ASCII files, and a buttonbar, but so what? Besides, NoteBook '95's editing and search menus didn't work in 3.1 or '95; apparently they're disabled in the shareware version, yet the edit buttons did. In any case, Wolly awards **NBOOK95.ZIP** (151K) his **"What Was He Thinking?"** award, especially in light of the **\$25.00** registration (a \$50.00 value! - yeah, right). We have all seen better for cheaper.

WHATEVER HAPPENED TO WINDOWS 4.0?

OK, Bill, the suspense is killing me: When are you going to announce Windows 4.0? I can call William Gates, "Bill" -- we once had a cup of coffee together. Well, we were at the same table.

Hang on now, I'm not knocking Windows 95, after working my way through the beta test program from Build 3xx-something to the June Test Release. It's a pretty good product, and is likely to do a huge sales volume. Huge, because it has many things needed by corporate America, and because Microsoft's market muscle will have it pre-installed on thousands of machines within the next couple of months.

Windows 95 is far more stable than some accounts you may have read, and its hardware detection (even if you *don't* have Plug-'n'-Play hardware) is surprisingly good. Its video drivers found 256-color performance in an ancient monitor of mine that I thought was only 16-color. On-screen operation is sleek, and its menus are so Mac-like that Apple obviously filed their look-and-feel lawsuit about four years early.

But, I also have to key in a password just to start up my own computer. And, since I'm also logged onto the Microsoft Network, I have to feed it a separate password just to get anything going on my Win 95 machine. I also have to tell Win 95 that I'm going to turn off the machine, before doing so -- otherwise, it may hurl all kinds of deprecating commands at me when I turn it back on. (Not a good modus operandi in a lightning-storm-prone area). In fact, Win 95 even offers me a variety of shutdown options; yet another decision to make at the end of a long day.

I'm not writing about Windows 95, though. Instead, I keep wondering what fills the gap between Windows 3.1 (in varying permutations) and the new product. My estimation is that there are hundreds of thousands (millions?) awaiting an improved Win 3.1. Win 95 leaves them sitting in a barrow ditch, hoping someone got the license number of the truck that just ran over them.

Many of that same hund-thou people are not even aware that *their* Win 3.1 installation is way out of date. Microsoft's slipstream improvements have meant moving to Windows for Workgroups (of little interest in a single-computer household or in any other single-user environment), and adding successively released patches of 32-bit add-on packages, to stay current.

Checking today at my favorite mass-market software store, I learned it is not possible today to buy a release of the Win 3.1 system as I run it. I've faithfully followed all the upgrades/stepups/extensions -- but what I'm now running, cannot be purchased across the counter. In fact, the clerk didn't know of the latest 32-bit extensions release (unpublicized by Microsoft). You only get the full product by grabbing a piece there, a snippet there, an INI addition over there, etc.

A consolidation of the current Win 3.1/3.11 package is a good start, as it is, on Windows

4. Microsoft should release an installable package of all the accumulated slipstream enhancements of the past 4-5 years. But that's not all. What about all the bugfixes that Redmond's programmers have developed during those same years to make Win 3.1 run "right?" Plowing them directly into a refurbished product should produce cleaner code and faster executables.

That's what the single-machine Windows user, happy to be one, needs. Alas, Windows 95 offers far more than an individual computer user ever wanted or needed.

Bill, ya' got a gap here. Keep in mind that America is comprised of individuals, not groups. Win 95 leaves the individual computer user locked out, until he/she remembers the password. I'll run Windows 95, on one machine, by itself, in the corner, just so I can gain familiarity with it. But I'm still awaiting Windows 4.0 for my other four machines.

FORMPOWER a review by Ed Hoffman

Forms are as much a part of today's business world as the ubiquitous coffee pot. Like death and taxes, try as you may, you cannot avoid using these documents. From simple expense forms and invoices to daily schedules and balance sheets, we are virtually buried in forms of one kind or another. The use of forms has become so pervasive that virtually all of us are affected. Not only are we assaulted with a wide array of pre-printed forms, but many times we are even forced to add to this milieu, by actually creating our own forms. But, we do have a choice. We can either learn to live with the inevitability of these paper tyrants, or find a large cave and move in.

If you can't find an appropriate cave, or simply decide to give in to the form phenomena, you'll next need to find a suitable way to working with forms. *FormPower 1.22aa* is one program you might wish to try in your quest to work with forms more efficiently. This unique program will allow you to both create customized forms to suit your particular requirements, as well as fill out the forms you create. Though many word processors tout their form capability, more often than not, creating forms with a word processor is as much fun as a root canal. Unless you have a good handle on how to use your word processor, you may find creating master forms a real chore. However, creating forms with *FormPower* is a real breeze. And surprisingly, after using this program for a few weeks, even I don't mind building forms nearly as much as before.

The *FormPower* program, behaves very well and is actually quite intuitive. Rather than wading through the multiple levels of unrelated buttons and menus so common with word processors, every button and menu command in the *FormPower* program is dedicated strictly to forms. This not only makes form creation simpler, but a whole lot less time consuming. The program also works quite well for filling out custom made forms you create as well as any existing pre-printed forms you might already have on hand.

To begin the form creation process, your first step should be to rough out a sketch of the desired form on a sheet of paper. While you can just as easily do the complete process right on the screen, having a sketch will usually make the creation process a bit faster. Your sketch should include the general outline of the proposed form as well as the locations of the various boxes, lines, and similar elements. Once you have your sketch roughed out, you can begin creating the form with the *FormPower* program. Here you simply transfer your sketch to your screen using the variety of tools furnished with the program. Once the basic form is completed, you can then add the fill-in fields to complete the form.

Then when you need to fill out a form, you simply open the program and select the <u>F</u>illout option in the <u>F</u>ile menu. The program will display the listing of all your forms and asks you which form to fillout. Once you select the form, the program loads the form and asks you to name the filled out form. All your forms have a *.FRM extension and the filled out forms have a *.FOF extension. After you enter a name your form appears on the screen and the cursor is already positioned at your first field. You then simply type in the information and tab between the fields. The program will only allow you to enter information in these fields so there is no need to worry about messing up your forms.

The forms you create can contain a variety of elements in addition to the boxes and lines commonly found on most forms. You can add clip art, graphic images, signatures, or scanned photographs. If you desire, you can even include video movies (AVI) or sound clips (WAV) with the Windows OLE feature. The program allows you the option of using any font on your system

for your forms as well. When you send in the registration fee for the program you'll receive the full registered version that contains a wide selection of pre-made forms, graphs, and templates. Here you can select from over 100 different form designs. You may either use these as they are, or modify them to suit your particular needs. The graphs and templates may also be used to help you design and construct your own custom forms.

The registered version of *FormPower* program comes with a printed manual containing a considerable amount of information about getting the most from the program. The built in help system is also well done and has a variety of hints and tips, as well as answers most of the questions you are likely to have. Whether you work with forms on a daily basis or only occasionally, the *FormPower* program will undoubtedly prove to be quite useful for both your business and personal form requirements. The program sure has simplified many of the more routine tasks in my life. From making forms for keeping track of all my hardware settings, to forms for my grocery shopping, I've already found several uses for this program that I never initially expected.

When asked by a friend why he writes, Ed replied that he "was way too lazy to work and much too fearful to steal." However, there are some publishers who will disagree with the latter.



When was the last time you discovered a mystery file on your system? Mystery files are those files that have been installed on your system by a program that you have long since discarded. However, rather than angering the Windows gods, you reluctantly leave the file on your system. Even though you have absolutely no idea from whence this file came, you're unwilling to deep six the file, just in case something else needs it to run. If this sounds familiar, then *Peeper 1.16* might just be what you need to help with your housekeeping chores.

At first glance I thought the *Peeper* program was just another file viewer. But after using the file for a while, I've quickly reassessed my earlier opinion. Yes, it's still a file viewer, but rather than just another file viewer, *Peeper* is more like a file viewer on steroids. This utility is an example of what a well thought out and well-written program should be. It's long been my opinion that the most useful utilities only do one thing, and they do that one thing very well. In this vein, *Peeper* only views files. But it views files VERY well.

One of the unique aspects of this program is it actually does more than advertised. There is a dialog box within the program that allows you to select the types of files you'd like to look at. Here a listing of 16 different file extensions is offered. You have the option of selecting any number of extensions to look at, or you may also select the ALL FILE TYPES option. The file types listed are:

*.TXT	*.EXE	*.DLL	*.DRV
*.VBX	*.OCX	*.386	*.FON
*.CPL	*.BMP	*.WRI	*.INI
*.WAV**	*.DOC	*.ZIP	*.TIF


(** In the case of *.WAV files, the program plays the files, rather than viewing it.)

However with just a little exploration, I was able to uncover at least eleven more file types that the *Peeper* program would read equally as well. I'm not all together sure that there aren't another dozen or so different file types that the program will read. I haven't yet had a chance to check out all the other file types on my system. However, the additional file types that I was able to find are:

*.CVR	*.PCX	*.REG	* . PIF
* . TTF**	*.FOT	*.WLL	* . FIF
*.WMF	*.TRS	*.FLT	

(** In the case of *.TTF files, the program displays the character map with a good approximation of what the fonts look like.)

With most of these file types, the *Peeper* program will display all the embedded file information about the document or file. For example, for a *.DLL or *.VBX file, the program displays file name, description, version, company, and a host of other data. This can help you identify where the file came from or a general idea of the file's function.



With most graphic formats, such as *.ICO, *.WMF, *.PCX, or *.BMP's, the program will show the actual graphic, rather than textual information about the graphic. With document, or text type files, depending on the format, *Peeper* will show either the imbedded information or the actual text of the document. File formats that the program cannot view directly are shown as hex files. With this display, by simply scanning the right side of the display you can occasionally pick out a few words that might give you an idea of the file's origin or function.

So, the next time you need to peek inside a file, just to see what it is and maybe where it came from, give *Peeper* a try. This remarkable program might just tell you what you want to know so you can decide whether to keep the file or send it to the *bit bucket*. You may even elect to use this program as a general purpose viewer. This way you may be able to retire several other viewers you have on your system. The program is well written and though there is ample help, it's doubtful that you'll need to use the help feature very much. The *Peeper 1.16* program has saved me considerable grief on several occasions and has more than earned its prominent place on my system.

WINZIP SELF-EXTRACTOR & WINZIP

a review by Ed Hoffma

A couple of years ago I learned a couple of valuable lessons about sending ZIP files on floppies to a computer neophyte. Unfortunately, both these lessons were learned at the expense of the same person. This person is the editor of a magazine where I write a regular column. This editor, I'll call him Joe, for the sake of anonymity, had just moved from paper and pencil to a computer. During one of our telephone conversations, Joe told me to start sending my submissions on disk. This way, he explained, he could both read my column and do any editing right on the computer. This system worked quite well until I had a submission with a few rather large drawing files. These files, along with the text of my column would not fit on a 1.44Mb floppy disk, so I compressed the files. A few days later I received a frantic phone call from Joe wanting to know what kind of file I had sent him. After explaining what ZIP files were, I stepped him through the decompression process. Conveniently, the company that built his computer did install a registered copy of PKUNZIP on his system.

The next time I had another large submission, I tried to eliminate the earlier problem by using Phil Katz's ZIP2EXE program. This program allowed me to convert the ZIP file to a self-extracting archive. Anticipating the problems this might cause Joe, I included a note explaining that he should copy the file to an empty directory before opening it. Well, a few days later I again received a call from Joe. It seems he read my note, only after he opened the EXE file within his Windows directory. Fortunately, it didn't take too long to step him through the process of moving the files I'd sent to another directory. Since then, I've been very careful about sending compressed files to others. Before using ZIP2EXE, I've now acquired the habit of calling to make sure the recipient understands how to handle this type of file.

Though Phil Katz has certainly done a great job in writing the PKZIP family of file compression programs and utilities, I've often wondered how many other folks have had similar problems. Well, evidently I wasn't the only one asking that question. Nico Mak must have also had seen this problem, because he has developed some of the most useful utilities for working with compressed files. His program *WinZip*, has long been a permanent fixture on my system and now his newest release *WinZip SE*, has also found a home on my computer.

The *WinZip* program, now in release 5.6, is quite possibly the most popular shareware compression shell for Windows. This program provides a simplified yet powerful interface for PKZIP and PKUNZIP as well as other major file compression utilities such as ARJ and LHA. Even the Microsoft compressed files (those files usually underscore as their last digit, i.e., FILENAME.EX_) are supported with *WinZip*. You can even have the *WinZip* program run your favorite virus scanner to check your ZIP files.

The *WinZip* program offers a variety of features and makes working with any of these compression formats much simpler than reverting back to the DOS prompt. The WinZip program also supports the ZIP2EXE feature. Here you simply compress the files with the <u>New</u> option in *WinZip* and a ZIP file is created. Then open the newly created ZIP file and click the Make .EXE File, under the <u>A</u>ctions menu option. The EXE file is then created. However, like the ZIP2EXE created file, when clicked, this EXE file will expand where ever it happens to be.

If these self-extracting files have caused you problems, you might want to take the *WinZip Self-Extractor 1.0* program for a test drive. To use this program, you simply open up WINZIPSE.EXE and it opens a dialog box to allow you to select the appropriate ZIP file. The Browse button makes finding the file you want much simpler. Once you've located the file you next decide the default location for the extracted file. This is usually a TEMP directory. Once this is entered, you can also add any commands that are to be run after the file is extracted. Once this

is completed, click the <u>Make</u>.EXE button and the *WinZip Self-Extractor* program automatically creates the self-extracting archive file. A test feature built into the program allows you the option of testing the archive to make sure it behaves the way you desire before you send it out.

When the person who receives the file clicks on the *.EXE, rather than expanding the file in an unwanted location, a dialog box appears to ask them where they would like the file placed. The directory location you entered when the file was created will appear as a default. But this can be changed to whatever location your recipient wants. Then it's a simple click on the <u>Unzip</u> button and the file is opened in the chosen directory.

With the *WinZip Self-Extractor* program there is no need to copy self-extracting archives to your hard drive just to open them. And more importantly, there will be no more surprises for the people that get the files you send. Both the *WinZip 5.6* and *WinZip Self-Extractor 1.0* programs are well written and well documented. Both are very intuitive with ample context-sensitive help files to get you through any problems that might come up. If you ever work with compressed files both the *WinZip 5.6* and *WinZip Self-Extractor 1.0* programs are utilities that you'll definitely want to have on your system.

But you can take heart in the fact that you don't necessarily need to go it alone. Your friendly computer is a number cruncher, par excellence. All you need to do is feed your electronic marvel the problem, and voilà, it instantly returns the correct answer. The only trick to this is feeding the computer the information in a way it understands. Just as formulas help simplify mathematical calculations for humans, mathematics programs help your computer understand the problem you are asking it to solve.


Two such programs that you should explore are *AngleCalc 2.0* and *Section Properties 1.0*. These programs will help make short work of many calculations dealing with right triangle trigonometry and plane geometry. All you'll need to do is plug in the values you know and these programs will do the rest.

AngleCalc 2.0

Practical right angle trigonometry problems face us every day. Although we may not realize that we are working with trigonometry, many times we are. From trying to figure out the surface area of our house before we buy paint, to laying out a square corner for that new patio, right triangle trigonometry plays an important part in helping us find the answers. The next time you need to find the surface area of the gable ends of your house, just measure the width of the gable and the height from the bottom to the top of the gable. To find the area, simply multiply the width by the height and divide by two. Likewise, to create a perfect right angle, use the 3-4-5 method. To layout that patio, put a stake in the ground with two strings tied to it. Mark a point 3 feet from the stake on one string and 4 feet from the stake on the other string. Holding a tape measure at one of these points, move the other string until the marked point is at the 5 foot mark in the tape. The angle between the strings is exactly 90°.

But rather than relying on remembering these tips, you can also use the *AngleCalc 2.0* program the next time a right triangle trigonometry problem pops up. This program is remarkably simple and easy to use. All you need to do is fill in the known values for any right triangle and the program will instantly give you the remaining values for the triangle. So, for example, if you have a right triangle to calculate with one 30° angle and a side adjacent of 5.50", you simply enter these values. The program then asks which value you require. Assuming you


want to know the length of the hypotenuse, you select *side "a"* from the choices and the program instantly tells you that the hypotenuse is 6.351".




One other nice feature of the program is that the triangle display changes color to show both the size you asked for and its location on the triangle. Once the answer is calculated you also have the option of adding descriptive text to the solution. This can be a simple note to yourself, detailed instructions, or whatever else you might wish. This text along with the solution can then be printed to give you a hard copy of the results.

Section Properties 1.0

If your calculation requirements go beyond the simple right triangle, than you might want to try *Section Properties 1.0*. This program is directed toward solving a variety of common geometric shapes. Virtually any geometric shape you could ever desire is included in this program. From the simple square and circle to the more complex sectors, segments, and ellipses are all listed.



Using this program couldn't be simpler. To start the process all you'll need to do is select the type of geometric form you want to calculate from the main dialog box. The next dialog box that appears contains a representation of the geometric shape you've selected. In addition to this drawing the dialog box is divided into two general areas: Input Values and Output Values. As you might suspect, the boxes in the Input Values area are where you type in the known values. The letters representing these values correspond to the letters in the drawing, so this should be relatively easy to figure out.



Once the Input values are entered, just click on the OK button, or tap the Enter key and all the boxes in the Output Values area are automatically filled in for you. You then have the option of working off the screen or sending the answer to your printer. The printout you receive closely resembles the screen image. All the answers are provided in the same fashion as the screen display and only the boxes are missing.

Whether you're trying to figure out math problems at work, around the house, or trying to help junior with those pesky homework problems, *AngleCalc 2.0* and *Section Properties 1.0* can really help you through the rough spots. Both programs are well written and very intuitive. While both programs have help files, both are somewhat abbreviated. But, since these programs are very easy to figure out, you may never even need to use them.

Ed often bemoans the state of shareware today. Like the "little girl with the curl on her forehead, when she was good, she was very good, when she was bad, she was horrid." These reflections, however, do not

apply to the programs above. If it's bad, Ed won't review it, and we're in complete agreement.

POWERSEARCH

a review by Steven Justic

Take a look back over the last couple years of *WOLR* and you'll see that we're great fans of WinWord add-ons. We're reviewed the classics--Dan Goodman's *Fileware* and *DocuPower*, Woody Leonhard's *WOPR*, and the like--and some impressive though lesser-known entries. These older packages have always owed their popularity to doing things that WordPerfect did better, like file management, printing, and special characters. But there is a new generation of macro and add-on programmers who are staking out new territory. One aspect of the new territory is new functionality, making word-processors do more than you thought they could. But another is partial independence from particular applications. PowerSearch by CommTech is one of these new entries, and it qualifies on both scores. The functionality, which you'll read about in a moment, is carried out dazzlingly. It is available presently for Word 6 and WordPerfect for Windows (the author hopes to release an application-independent version soon). Here I've used the Word 6 version to show what it can do.

PowerSearch has one aim in life: to help you search your documents. Database users have always taken multi-term searches for granted, but in our word-processors we have allowed ourselves to remain content with the simple Find and Find and Replace functions. This software teaches you to want more from the word-processor: who had ever imagined that you could do Boolean searches on a Word document? Install **PowerSearch**, choose Edit|PowerSearch, and there you are.

Let's pause and look at the dialog: there is artful programming and interface design in this little box. In the *Standard Edition* of **PowerSearch** (which is available in a shareware version), you can have up to four search terms (I'm using three in the one shown) connected by Boolean (AND/OR/NOT) logic. As you enter a new search term, the buttons (Web..., Insert, etc.) attach themselves to the one you're entering. Between each line for search items is a button showing the logic connecting the two terms: the button between the first pair shows that I'm looking for instances of "Margery" within five words of "Calle." Click the button, and it becomes a series of drop-down lists like the ones you can see between the second and third search terms in the

screen-shot, so that you can define the search in any way you want.

Anyone who has used Boolean searches can tell you how powerful they are. The document I was searching there is a 2MB Word document containing a collection of fifteenthcentury letters. I knew that there was a testamentary bequest to Margery (Paston) Calle's son, but I couldn't remember the exact wording of the bequest or the name of the son; there's no way, except by trial and error that I could have found the passage using Word's Edit|Find. But by defining the search as I did, I found it in 32 seconds, on page 309 of the document. Anyone who has used Boolean searches will also tell you that you need to learn the rules of precedence in evaluation; the **PowerSearch** documentation explains them clearly, and also offers useful hints on speeding up your searches.

The *Standard Edition* allows you to use four search terms. But it has an additional, and very handy feature that in effect extends its range. You can create and store *webs*, which are collections of related terms all connected by the Boolean "OR." For example: a computer writer may often be searching through old articles to find where either "multithreading" or "multitasking" were used in proximity to certain other words, like "OS/2" and "Windows95." You could store those first two terms as a web (called, say, 32BIT.WEB), and enter it as a search term; it would then find each occurrence of either word in the proximity and relation to other terms you specify. You can include up to three words in each *Standard Edition* web.

And you do not need to retype every search from scratch. A real estate attorney may often need to search contracts for appearances of (say) "easement" in the same paragraph as "repair" but not in the same paragraph as "rent" or "rental." S/he can construct the search once, save it (with the extension .SCH) and run the search again any time on any document.

Once **PowerSearch** locates a passage that matches your criteria, it displays the passage, highlighted, with this dialog box hovering up near the top of the screen. The buttons are self-explanatory. What is wonderful about this, in contrast to the very clunky implementation of Word's native Edit|Find, is that this box gets up out of your way and makes it easy to do any editing or copying once you've found what you need. For this reason, **PowerSearch** is a useful add-on even if you rarely find yourself doing complex Boolean searches: if you simply enter one search term in its dialog box, you can use it as a handy replacement for Edit|Find, just as fast and more elegantly implemented.

Of course you can't make a silk PowerPurse of a sow's ear, and **PowerSearch** is limited by the application in which it's used. Word was not written to be a database, and if you create large data sources that you often search, you need a database, either relational (like Borland **Paradox** or Lotus **Approach**) or freeform (like **askSam**), depending on the kind of data you work with. But if you do have to create documents in your word-processor--contracts, grant proposals, research reports, project outlines, or the like--that you need regularly to refer back to, this wonderful utility could repay your investment very quickly. And if you have more sophisticated searching needs along these lines, CommTech also makes a *Professional Edition* of **PowerSearch**, available only in commercial release. In this more extensive version, you can enter as many as eight search terms, and each "web" can contain as many as a thousand words. Most people's needs are not so extensive, and (given the price of the *Professional Edition*) it's a good thing too.

GETTIN' ON THE I'WAY

Dusty desert two-lane on a hot, sunny afternoon. Skidding to a halt in the gravel driveway beside the two fifties-generation bubble-top gas pumps. Old timer in greasy bib overalls comes out, tugging his sweat stained straw hat a little lower over his grizzled face and wiping the oil from his hands on a rag that won't absorb much more. Squinting against the glare he mumbles, "Kin I help ya?"

"Yes, please. Could you tell me how to get to the information highway from here?"

He pauses and considers the options before answering. "Well, there's lots of ways you can get there from here, but some are toll roads and some are under construction--they've been working on them for a while now. There are some shortcuts, but they aren't very well paved. There's some new-fangled company that claims they'll get you there, but they do the driving. I'll tell ya what, here's your best bet. Here's the way I'd go to get on the Information Highway:"

What's so difficult about getting on the I'way? It seems as though every piece of paper we pick up is touting a new route to Internet access. The problem is that most of these programs are designed more for the benefit of the software company than for the new user. Examine them closely and you find that they seem to concentrate on getting you signed up with "their" service provider. Buy this book or that communications package or this operating system and you will get on the Internet. Sign up with this on-line service and we will give you Internet e-mail (for a fee per message) and access to 2000 of the 8500 usegroups (those which we deem "family" appropriate) and we will give you our "Web Browser" as soon as we get it working with the rest of our software. I'm sorry, but I just don't find multi-tiered billing for limited access or long distance connections with low-speed modems a very good deal.

So, the first step to the information highway is to find a local access provider. Ask at your local computer store, read the local computing magazine, or check the yellow pages under "Computers--Bulletin Boards" or "Telephone Companies." Shop the available providers and compare offerings and rates. Check the number of lines available from the provider, the speed of host modems (demand 28.8 kbps--if you aren't at that speed now, you will be next year), the type of connection provided (dialup, SLIP, PPP or if you are into the bigtime, dedicated access), and the availability of tech support to get you up and running. Ask how the provider is connected to the "backbone" of the Internet. The speed at which you drive down that ol' highway is going to be dependent upon the horsepower of your provider. It will take time to make a series of low-speed connections, so you would prefer that your provider has the largest possible "pipeline" and the shortest possible distance to the main throughway for data. You, the private computer user, will probably be the slowest link in the chain.



Once you've selected a service provider, you will need software. A good provider will have a package available for subscribers that includes all the latest shareware applications used on the Internet pre-configured to operate on the provider's system. This software collection should be offered either on disk or downloadable from a pure dial-up bulletin board style system. It's an often quoted "Catch-22" that you should get your Internet software from an FTP, file transfer protocol, site on the Internet--how do you get software to get on if you have to be on to get software? You should be able to unzip the package to your hard drive and with not much more configuring than entering your username and password, you should be in the acceleration lane to get on the I'way.

Although some packages promise it, there is no completely integrated Internet software yet. Different functions on the 'net require different software items, and the closest they come to integration is that they can run simultaneously in Windows. The good news here is that the best, the fastest, the latest, the most functional, the most efficient Internet software is still shareware---in fact, a lot of it is freeware. It is continually being updated and revisions are immediately available once you are on the 'net. The package your provider supplies should include a mail reader, a newsgroup manager, a Web browser, a file transfer utility, a chat manager, a number of search tools, and the heart of the Internet for personal computers--a TCP/IP stack program, usually *Trumpet WinSock*.

To drive the highway you don't need to know what the cam, crankshaft, valves, injectors and pistons are doing in any great detail. To drive the information highway, you don't need to know what is going on under your computer's hood either. Suffice it to say that the WinSock program is the basic telecommunications software. It dials your provider, conducts a modem "handshake," exchanges password and username with the server, and manages the exchange of information that the other software components conduct. Just like your other communications programs, you need to identify your port and your modem parameters to make it work. Once that is done, most of the detailed configuration should have been handled by your provider. Before any of the other software can work, the WinSock must make a connection with your provider. Most applications will automatically launch the WinSock, a few will require you to start it and make your connection before they will function.



Probably the most commonly used Internet capability is e-mail, the exchange of messages between computers on the 'net. Your local access provider maintains a "post office" on the 'net with his server. When you log on, your mail software will query the post office for messages addressed to your e-mail address. Your software will collect the messages, display a list of mail, and allow you to read and respond. A good e-mail package, such as *Eudora* will allow you to compose and upload replies with a built-in text editor, maintain an address list for regular correspondents, allow you to forward mail to another address, carbon copy or "info" secondary addressees and attach files to e-mail.

Eudora is a well designed Windows application. When launched, the program signs in to your provider "post office" and collects any new mail for you. Three areas are maintained in the program, an "In" directory, an "Out" directory and, shades of Appleware, a "Trash" directory. Incoming mail is listed with date/time, subject and originator. Click on an item to read it, then choose to reply, forward, or save it. If you delete it, the message will be recoverable from the trash until you close *Eudora* at the end of the session. The program can be configured to check your mail at regular intervals while it is running and alert you when you have new mail.

Regular correspondents can be maintained in the "Nicknames" list so that you don't have to look up or type in message addresses. For outgoing messages, select the recipient from the nicknames list and a dialog box will let you choose "to," "CC:" and complete your message header. Ditto for "reply" messages. As with many BBS off-line readers, choosing "reply" from the menu will give you a copy of the message you are replying to so that it can be edited to provide context for your reply. Again, the header is completed for you.



Newsgroups are arguably the most mentioned feature of the Internet. Regular electronic bulletin board users have been familiar with "echoes" for quite some time. The Internet takes these national discussions to the extreme. There are currently nearly ten thousand newsgroups on the 'net covering every imaginable topic from current events to hobbies to sports to fan clubs to detailed technical forums. Some are active, interesting and educational. Some are boring, immature and abandoned. It doesn't much matter though because there are so many to choose from.


Newsgroup software should allow the user to manage this vast array of information. Software such as *WinVN*, allows you to query your local access provider to list the newsgroups, then lets the user select those which are of special interest to "subscribe" to. The software allows you to look at postings to a newsgroup, select how many messages you would like to retrieve (100, 250, "latest unread," etc.), then displays the dates, titles and sender's name. Threads or message sequences are displayed so you can quickly follow a dialogue on a particular topic by noting messages that respond to a previous posting. You can reply with a built-in text editor, keeping portions of the original message for clarity, and automatically send a carbon copy by e-

mail to the originator at the same time you add to the newsgroup.

Graphics files are available through various newsgroups. They are encoded and often segmented into several files which need to be joined before the pictures, sounds or video clips can be viewed with conventional PC viewers. *WinVN* offers automatic management of file downloads. Merely select the files you wish to receive, and the program will download, decode and join, so that your hard drive receives a JPG, GIF, MPG, or WAV as appropriate. You can select a number of files and the program will automatically put the component parts in the right place.

FTP FILE TRANSFER PROTOCOL (FTP)

Files, documents, graphics, sound and video clips are all available on the Internet. The quickest way to get them is through an FTP site. The software required is an FTP client and *Windows Sockets FTP* is one of the finest. When *Windows Sockets FTP* is launched, you actually enter the file directory tree of another computer. You become equivalent to a network user with access to the hard drives of the host. Clearly this is dangerous territory and you can expect to encounter some restrictions or "firewalls" in most FTP sites. Depending on the level of access you have at a site, *Windows Sockets FTP* is capable of letting you copy files from your system onto the host or from the host to your computer. With full access you can create directories, move files and even delete files remotely.



Since you are on the Internet and operating through your TCP/IP software, the files exchanged by FTP will move in binary format and exchanges in either direction will be considerably faster than you are familiar with from standard bulletin board protocols like Z-modem. For rapidly changing software updates, there is even a software program called *AutoWNet* that automatically contacts pre-set FTP sites on a scheduled basis and collects updates to files. For most of us that would be overkill, but it is a good example of the level of sophistication of Internet shareware.

WORLD WIDE WEB

The World Wide Web (WWW) is a subset of the Internet. It is a graphic environment with "links" between Internet servers that allow you to effortlessly move from site to site in a world of pictures, video, sound and text. It is powerful stuff, and being powerful requires a little more from the participants. To experience the Web, you will need a SLIP or PPP connection from your Internet provider. A simple, low-cost dial-up connection won't suffice although there are some software utilities available that provide a "pseudo-SLIP" connection through a dial-up line. You also should have the fastest possible modem, since the graphics of the Web require fairly large data transfers, and a slow modem will leave you spending a lot of time watching the screen redraw. And, finally, you need a software item called a Web Browser.

There are two Web Browsers available that lead the field, *Netscape* and *Mosaic*. Both are shareware and both are edging into the commercial software market through packaging agreements with various companies. Either one will serve you well as a vehicle for wandering the Web. I've used both of these browsers and currently favor *Netscape* for its speed and it's handling of address "bookmarks" for regularly visited Web sites.

Netscape launches to a default "home page" that can be set to any site of your choosing. Your Internet provider may have installed his own page as the default, and since it is a local company, that is probably as good a place to start as any. The home page will have descriptions with "links" to a variety of other information. Merely click on underlined or highlighted text and the program will automatically jump to another file. You've seen this in Windows "Help" files where hypertext will move you to another place in a file. Now the link might take you to Europe, Asia or the Orient seamlessly, in seconds and without a penny for long distance charges.

On the Web there are sites or home pages that specialize in directories or searches. Using key words, you can quickly find Web sites that specialize in topics of interest. White and Yellow page directories exist to find Internet addresses for businesses, individuals or special subjects. Your local provider's home page will start you off exploring with a number of links and the browser software will also include a number of "what's new" or "what's interesting" recommendations.

As you explore you will find home pages that offer a rich variety of links that you may want to revisit. When you do, *Netscape* allows you to establish a "bookmark" for the site. The address, called a URL (uniform resource locator), is recorded and added to a drop down menu for future use. The Edit feature of the bookmarks list allows you to set up sections and sub-headings for cataloguing of your list of sites. An easy to use "import-export" utility allows for generation of a file that can be swapped between friends to allow others to see where you've been in your Internet wanderings.

While "surfing" the Internet, you will be moving large volumes of data between your computer and the various servers you enter. *Netscape* speeds the process by allowing you to jump to another page without waiting for the current page to completely draw. It sounds like a small thing, but other browsers will lock you out until a page is completely transferred to your computer. *Netscape* also speeds your return to a previously visited site during a session by storing graphics in a temporary directory on your computer rather than resending the complete file from the host. Of course, if you are disk limited, you can restrict the amount of drive space available for temp files.

Although not a fully integrated 'net software package, *Netscape* comes close, as it includes a very functional and graphically attractive newsgroups reader. The program also supports file transfers from FTP sites that are linked to the Web although you are restricted to those files that the web page designer has provided rather than being able to shop an entire directory. A "power" user may want more functionality and faster access, but for the beginning or recreational Web surfer, *Netscape* can do a lot of the job.

CONCLUSION

Your Internet access provider will probably include a number of other utilities in your start up package. Depending on how you use the net, they will either be absolutely essential or so much dross. Expect to find *Archie* and *Veronica*, two text-based search engines that go looking for files on the 'net either by title or subject. Then there might also be *Gopher*, a search engine from the University of Minnesota, and *Finger* and *Whois*, which help you find people on the 'net when you don't know their cryptic user name or address. Also expect to find *WinIRC*, for interactive real-time chat in groups; *Ping* to check if a server you want to access is on-line; *WinTalk*, to page a user on another site for real-time chat one-on-one; *Telnet* for simple command line Internetting; a sound player utility such as *WPLANY* to support the noises of the Internet; and maybe some others.

If there is one thing you should remember about the Internet, it is that this is a very dynamic environment. It changes daily. Every time you log in, the 'net will be different. Individual components came together without corporate or government control to make the 'net what it is. Software has been developed in bits and pieces by hackers and wizards to do particular jobs. The free market has embraced the good stuff and discarded the bad. If you are entering the information highway today, it is easier than ever since the hard part is already done. All you need to do is call a local provider service, take the software from the public domain that he will provide you and get ready to enter the twenty-first century. And, of course, register the shareware you find worth using.

WORLD WIDE WEB TOOLS

an introduction by Steven Jay Coher

These are very exciting times we live in! The World Wide Web is growing by leaps and bounds and the speed, breadth and depth of this growth are astounding! There is an array of tools -- both shareware and commercial -- being produced concurrently in various quadrants that are designed to ease the task of authoring documents for the Web.

Before discussing the pros and cons of some of these tools, a brief explanation of Hypertext and HTML is in order. Both concepts are actually quite easy. If you use Windows, you've used a Windows Help file, so you've undoubtedly used Hypertext. Our magazine, for example, uses this feature extensively. This is the feature that allows the user to click on a marked (or sometimes unmarked) area to "jump" to another page or area of the Help file. The usual signal that your cursor is over one of these areas is the transformation of the cursor arrow into a hand with a pointing finger. When you click on one of the linked buttons or article titles in our Table of Contents, you are immediately "jumped" to the page containing the article.

These "hot spots" or "links" make it very easy for the user to move from one place to another within the body of a Help file, usually to obtain additional information about the topic at hand. All the user has to do is point and click! Hypertext works in very much the same way in World Wide Web documents. The difference is that in addition to moving the user to another portion of a given document, these Hypertext links are also designed to move a user to Web documents on other servers around the globe.

HTML is the acronym that stands for HyperText Markup Language. This is the programming language used to create Hypertext documents for the World Wide Web. This language, written in plain ASCII, contains all the instructions needed by a Web Browser to interpret and deliver a Hypertext document to your screen. A Web Browser, of course, is the vehicle used to travel the Web. HTML provides not only hypertext linking instructions, but it also contains all the coding necessary to format the text in a document. In other words, it is used to make text bold or italicized, organize sentences into paragraphs, etc., and also to specify the placement of graphics within the document.

The World Wide Web can be thought of as an unbelievably huge collection of multimedia documents residing on millions of computers all over the world -- all linked together with Hypertext. WEB AUTHOR FOR WORD FOR WINDOWS

a review by Steven Jay Cohen

As its name suggests, **Web Author** is an add-in for Word for Windows 6.0. It is the first release in Quarterdeck's planned Internet Suite of applications. Its WYSIWYG (What You See Is What You Get) environment makes possible the creation of an HTML document without ever seeing the underlying code. For those already accustomed to creating documents in Word 6.0, but new to HTML, this is an excellent authoring tool. When you begin a new document in **Web Author**, you are greeted by the following dialogue box:

If you are creating a new document, the next dialog box will ask you to enter a title before displaying the editing screen. This is the text displayed in a browser's title bar for the current document, or Web "page." The **Web Author** editing screen customizes the Word interface in several ways. In addition to providing its own toolbar containing buttons for the most often-used features, it automatically places a 1 inch style area to the left of the text. This area gives immediate visual feedback to inform the user about the style or format of individual lines and portions.

Web Author's Word Interface

Web Author makes it quite simple to embed links and graphics in a document, walking the user stepwise through the process. It even provides an "address book" for saving and inserting URLs (Universal Resource Locators -- the network designators that denote the specific locations of documents.) One area where it really shines is in the automatic creation of forms. By hand, coding the appearance of HTML forms can be very tedious and frustrating. I was very impressed with its ease and versatility in this department. Creating labeled pushbuttons, drop-down lists and text areas is a snap! This process, of course, merely produces the form. In order to enable functionality, one must supply the required scripting and code.

As is true of most new tools, there is a bit of a learning curve, but it doesn't take long to pick up speed and gain some degree of productivity. For the most part, the interface is logical and intuitive, but there are a couple of important exceptions. Physical and logical text styles, such as **bold** and *italic*, are picked from a list in a popup dialogue box rather than by using Word's existing buttons and hot-key combinations. This is where the WYSIWYG concept breaks down a little. One must be careful in this instance **not** to rely on the appearance of the text on the screen.

Web Author strictly adheres to the HTML 2.0 standard. This is the established, agreedupon set of rules and guidelines in the industry for the creation of HTML documents. Author will parse your document and promptly inform you of any variances before allowing the document to be saved. At each such juncture, it displays the offending portion, providing an explanation and the opportunity to correct the error. This feature is a desirable safety measure, however it does present a difficulty for the more advanced user. Though HTML 2.0 is the current standard, the development of version 3.0 is well down the road and on the verge of approval. Consider also that the most popular and widely-used browser, Netscape, is empowered with the ability to interpret and implement most of this new standard. As a result, most of today's better, attractive sites are constructing their documents with the more versatile, "not-quite-formally-approved" 3.0 code. This first release of **Web Author** unfortunately makes no allowances for new code and treats it as an error. It would be nice to see a feature in the next release that provides the built-in flexibility to add and customize as standards change.

Web Author is accompanied by thorough, context-sensitive on-line Help and an effective tutorial. In all, it does a very respectable job of buffering the user from the coding process. Nonetheless, it is still much easier if you already have some degree of knowledge about HTML.

HTML ASSISTANT / PRO

a review by Steven Jay Coher

HTML Assistant Pro is one of the best HTML authoring tools around. It adroitly addresses the needs of both the "newbie" and the pro. Written in Visual Basic 3.0, it has an obviously well thought out interface for its feature-rich toolset. A high degree of user configurability further sets this application apart from the crowd. It is so "workable," in fact, one gets the impression that the author probably uses it every day in his own work.

First, let's talk about the difference(s) between **HTML Assistant** and the **Pro** version. **HTML Assistant** is freely distributed as unsupported freeware. Download it and use it to your heart's content. It does what it does very well, but its primary purpose is to tease -- to give you *just* enough to make you go for the **Pro**. Its feature set and capabilities are somewhat truncated compared to its purchasable, fully supported sibling.

The freeware version limits document size to 32K but offer automatic HTML conversion for several URL-related text files: Cello Bookmark files; **HTML Assistant** URL files, which are creatable by the user; and Mosaic INI URL files. The convenience of handling plain ol' text, however, is reserved for the **Pro**. This is a very handy way to create easily accessible hierarchical lists of one's favorite URLs.

Both versions of **HTML Assistant** offer a palette of two basic tool types. **Type 1 Tools** bracket highlighted text to effect particular formatting. For example: Let's say you want to format a particular section of text to be bold. Simply highlight the targeted text, click on the **B** button, and voila! The text will automatically be bracketed by the required target text HTML coding. With one exception, all of the tools on the top bar are Type 1 Tools.

The exception is the "<**P**>" button, which is a **Type 2 Tool**. Type 2 tools insert desired HTML elements at the cursor. The <P> designation is to denote a paragraph spacing in the text. Similarly, all the buttons in the lower row (pictured above) insert the designations on the button face.

You have, no doubt, noticed the **USER TOOLS** portion of the button bar. This feature of HTML Assistant allows the user to insert any Type 2 commands not already built in. Once inserted, all commands here remain available via a drop-down listing. The Pro version saves these items from one session to the next; the freeware version does not.

For the user who is new to HTML authoring, the **Pro** provides another excellent function in the URL drop-down menu. A click on "**Automatically create browser page**" brings up the following interactive dialog box:

As you might expect, this makes basic page construction a *very* easy task. Other **Pro** features/choices include toggling the display of the lower (Type 2) toolbar: the ability to choose the font you wish to work with, the ability to convert a UNIX HTML file to DOS format, and the ability to choose the size of the text segments that will be "loadable" at a time in the fully MDI compliant child windows. One really nice touch is the functionality that allows the repetition of a command by merely clicking the right mouse button. Add to the above, the ultimate in convenience: each document-containing child window has the following toolbar at its top:

Ah hah! You noticed the "**Test**" button in the above bar -- right? This feature can be found in both versions of HTML Assistant. This is a function I have yet to see in any other authoring tool! This Test feature uses DDE (Dynamic Data Exchange) with a test browser to permits back and forth transitions from HTML Assistant to Cello and vice versa. It eliminates the hassle of closing and restarting the test browser each time you want to test a file.

HTML Assistant provides the option of using DDE (Dynamic Data Exchange) to send

Cello the name of the HTML file you want to test. If Cello is not loaded, HTML Assistant loads it. Once loaded, Cello will not have to be reopened whenever you need to test a file. Each time you select the item in the File menu for testing using DDE, the name of the file you are testing is sent to Cello and it becomes the active, topmost application. Thus you can test your page as it develops, ferreting and cleaning out the bugs and fine tuning as you go!

"O.K. But I don't use Cello -- I use Netscape!" you say. Not to worry! **HTML Assistant Pro 1.5** (the current version) ships with the beta 1.65 version, which allows you to establish and use the same DDE connection to Netscape! If you use Netscape as your primary Web browser, I would suggest using this version. The thorough on-line help that accompanies the **Assistant** is a marvelous resource -- a virtual wealth of HTML information.

Whether you are new to HTML, or a seasoned veteran, **HTML Assistant Pro**, finely crafted by Howard Harawitz, is an authoring tool that you can call your own. Because it is so easy to customize, it is perfectly suited to take advantage of the new capabilities brought to the medium by the new HTML 3.0 standard and the new Netscape extensions. Grab a copy of **HTML Assistant** today and give it a whirl. I'll bet it won't be long before you find yourself ordering a copy of **HTML Assistant Pro**.

One thing I like about Microsoft is its remarkable ability to create markets and generate revenue for other companies and developers. Sure, Microsoft rakes in tons of dough, but so do others who create products to replace poorly designed utilities supplied with DOS and Windows. Consider, for example, the number of currently available replacements for Program Manager. If users were satisfied with Program Manager, I doubt there would so many alternatives.

Personally, I use replacements not only for Program Manager, but also for File Manager, Task Manager, Write, Cardfile, Clock, Clipboard, the Fonts function within Control Panel, and quite a few others. And then there are the "missing" utilities. Among those missing from Windows is an adequate file viewer. Write and Notepad *can* be used to view files, but anytime a file is loaded into an editor, one risks the possibility of inadvertently altering the loaded file. And if the file is more than 53k, Notepad cannot load it for editing let alone for viewing. Of course, you can always shell to DOS and use its TYPE command. <g> So if you want a decent file viewer, don't expect to find it in DOS or Windows. I found mine here on WOL and it's called WnBrowse.

As a general purpose file viewer **WnBrowse** is terrific. It has features that make it both powerful and easy to use. It can load files of any size, and, once loaded they can be viewed in either hex or text format. In addition to the viewing options, you can perform file commands such as deleting, printing and launching. WnBrowse can even be configured as an "add-on" to the Windows File Manager.

During setup, you have the option to install **WnBrowse** as a File Manager "add-on." This lets you browse files directly from File Manager using a newly installed "Browse" menu item. To view one or more files, select files in the usual way, then select the 'Browse Selected File(s)' from the Browse menu. WnBrowse will open with the selected file loaded. If multiple files are selected, the "view next" or "view previous" commands will let you scroll through them. This also works from the search results window. If you use Windows for Workgroups, WnBrowse adds a button in the form of a magnifying glass to the File Manager toolbar that performs the same function as the Browse menu command. Select a file and click the button to view it. That's all there is to it.

In addition to using File Manager, files can be loaded into **WnBrowse** in different ways. The Open file menu command works as you would expect. Files can be dragged from File Manager (or other utility supporting Drag and Drop) and dropped on the program's icon.

Command line parameters can be used to load one or multiple files, and finally, previously viewed files can be loaded from a list of files at the end of the File menu.

Once loaded, **WnBrowse** lets you do many things with a file. And the easiest way to do these things is by using the user-configurable button bar. This button bar can be configured to show some or all available buttons and the order of the buttons. Here is a summary of the more noteworthy functions within **WnBrowse**.

Launching Files

The Launch command will behave differently depending on the type of file being viewed. If the file has an associated application, that application will open and load the file being browsed into it. If the file being viewed is a Windows 16-bit program, Launching the file will execute it. If the file is a text file, launching it will start the default editor program. You can set the 'Minimize on Launch' option to minimize WnBrowse after the file has been launched.

Selecting Text

Selected text can be copied to the clipboard, printed or saved to another file. If the Find function is activated after selecting text, the selected text is automatically loaded as the search string.

Printing

When printing selected text or an entire document, a number of options are available. You can customize the content and appearance of headers and footers, set all margins, set the printer font or print using the default printer font, process embedded form feed characters and wrap print lines. Available header and footer codes include current date, current time, file name, page number and you can add a line below the header, or above the footer.

Configurability and Customization

In addition to the Print options mentioned above, there are options to change the display font and the colors of text, background, selected text, status line and the ruler. You can show button bar bubbles describing the function of each button as the mouse passes over it. You can save options as named configurations, allowing you the ability to specify the named configuration at run time by using a command line parameter. The File open dialog box displays a list of file types (filters) that can be user-defined. For example, you can set a filter to display TXT and DOC files.

Other Important Features

WnBrowse can list and view the contents of ZIP files. The launch facility also works when viewing files within a ZIP file. (This requires PKUnzip.) When multiple files are selected for browsing, a right mouse click will show a popup dialog box for switching between files. A "bookmark" can be set using the mouse that will be returned to whenever you double right click.

WINHELP OFFICE

a review by Bob Gollihu

Blue Sky has long been close to our hearts at the **WinOnLine ReviewTM**. We have used their tools to create the magazine since the conversion to Windows Help, when it was RoboHelp 1.0 and Windows' 3.0 compiler. We have evaluated other products, but always come back to **RoboHelp**, with its excellent set of tools and features. Recently, they became the first company to fill virtually all of the help developers' needs with the first *suite* for WinHelp: **WinHelp Office.** Version 1.0, recently released, was quickly followed by a significant upgrade, version 1.5, with Windows '95 features and other enhancements.



Assembled in a large box with pull-out compartments, **WinHelp Office** is a suite of tools and supportive utilities designed to accomplish nearly any mission in Windows Help, including in Windows 95. **RoboHelp**, the heart of the system, is a Microsoft Word add-on that makes Help file creation so much easier. **Mastering WinHelp**, a video tape, is a good introduction to the new user, for a quick start into RoboHelp. The **WinHelp Video Kit** includes video file recording software as well as a wizard to install it into your system. The **WinHelp Tool KitTM** includes several utilities to make the help developer's life easier, in the form of a decompiler, context call testing tool, graphics tools, and a style guide. The **WinHelp Hyperviewer** includes separate outline viewing and text searching add-ons for use with any help file, much like that available in Windows 95 help system. Finally, the **Moving to WinHelp '95** section includes a book and software to move your projects to WinHelp 4.0. Let's go into detail on each of the six modules.




This newest RoboHelp version brings some significant updates over the prior version, which was certainly no slouch. It has always been a well-designed, convenient tool, but subtle usability enhancements and some new features make it better than ever. Requiring Microsoft Word 2.0 or 6.0, it initially presents you with a dialog to open a current help project or create a new one. It prompts you for a file name, project details, and directory location, and then creates your first topic. You're quickly ready to move on to create your help file once given this automatic start.

A large toolbox has long inhabited RoboHelp, bringing easy access to the main tools of

the program. The original toolbox can be arranged vertically or in the form of a larger, upright palette. New to version 3.0 is a compact, Word-style toolbar that can join the others at the top of the screen, or be broken off and placed anywhere on the screen for quick access. With it comes a wide variety of selections to accomplish your work.



Each of these tools allow you to quickly develop your help project. As an example: highlight text or a graphic, click on *Create Jump Hotspot*, and choose from the list of topic names — or create a new one! Convenience should be RoboHelp's middle name. New to the toolbar are the *Quick View Help Project* and *Create Macro Hotspot*. The first opens the last compile of the help file to the topic you are currently in, while the second creates a link to the many macros that are available to be called by WinHelp. While a certain amount of technical knowledge regarding these functions is helpful, truly context-sensitive help is but a click away, not just to explain the dialog, but also document the macro and its usage.



Inserting graphics is an equally simple operation. BMP images can be easily previewed, and then inserted flush left, right, or as a character. The dialog gives access to a mini file manager, SHED graphics, Paintbrush, and more. There are also options to show the graphic stretched to the window size, a partial display, or full size.

The myriad of options that can populate your project file are easily manipulated through the tabbed Setup Help Project dialog. No more hand-editing is required. A scrolling display shows each section of the HPJ and a quick double-click provides a dialog for changing or adding specifications. The window section is a real dream, with the ability to size primary and secondary windows by dragging their perimeters and changing colors with a simple click of the mouse in the area you want affected. If you have ever hand-tooled an HPJ file while searching through the MS Windows Help Authoring Guide, you will appreciate this more than I can say.

Version 3.0 brings the long-awaited support for 256 color graphics and textured bitmap backgrounds. Unfortunately, automated implementation is not provided for the use of this feature, so keying instructions for the embedded bitmap is necessary, and can become tiresome. The technique is only briefly explained in three paragraphs on an included "release notes" card. The 59K support file, HLP256.DLL must also be distributed with your project to enable the function.

Also briefly outlined on the same card is another advance for version 3.0, titled "Word-to-Help TechnologyTM." This optional feature enables the display of certain Word 6.0 features such as bulleted and numbered lists, hanging indents, smart quotes, and en- and em- dashes. You may observe many help files with *you'll* displayed as *youll* — that is due to the fact that the help compiler does not recognize certain characters, and therefore omits them. This feature can be an attractive addition; however, a Windows Help quirk will cause your special character to end up on the next line if a line wrap is due. This process extends the time for RoboHelp to scan and format your source file, so keeping the option turned off while you're in the early stages of your project is a good idea.

Packaged within are several utilities to assist in the creation of graphics for your project:



The **Screen Capture Utility** is a program to capture and customize graphics. You can do the usual copying and pasting, open your favorite bitmap editor, and open up a floating palette of tools to "tweak" your bitmap or capture.



PaintIt Image Editor is a simple but effective graphics editor. Its feature set is nice enough, in fact, to easily replace Windows Paintbrush.



Enhanced Hotspot Editor enables the creation of "Shed" graphics--special bitmaps that contain hotspots within them. This tool makes it easy to outline visible or invisible areas that can be jump, pop, or macro hotspots. Selections are made very convenient by the provided RoboHelp dialogs.

Mastering WinHelp™

This brief video is a good start for new users of RoboHelp and especially for new help developers. Its deliberate pace and liberal screen shots makes understanding the mechanics and basics of the program easy. A user should be able to turn out their first help project in no time at all once they view this presentation.



The WinHelp Video Kit includes four components:



Software Video Camera can execute screen captures and store them as an AVI file. Simply drag to locate and resize the capture window on your screen, or enter specific coordinates. Preferences include the frame rate, a user-definable stop recording keystroke, and optional audio formats, including PCM, MS ADPCM, and IMA ADPCM. You can choose a specific file name for your creation, or allow the system to increment the filename as you reshoot. At press time we were still in conversation with technical support, trying to determine why we were unable to record sound along with the video capture, which was otherwise easy and produced fine results.



Video Wizard[™] sets up your project to play WAV and AVI files. Simple, sequential dialogs allow you to specify your project file and check-offs for the two options. Setting hotspots for actually playing these files is very easily done from within RoboHelp, using the Macro Hotspot tool. Runtime functionality is contained in RHMMPLAY.DLL (9K), which must be distributed with your completed file. Microsoft Video for Windows is also included for optional distribution with your finished product. Video Tester is simply a dialog to select and then play (test) video and sound files after you've created them. It's very handy; the video dialog stands by, and if you choose a sound file, a slidebar appears in the conventional file|open dialog for ease of play.



WinHelp Video/Sound Player is the tool to enable playing video or sound from within a Windows Help file.

WinHelp Tool Kit™

This group of utilities is a bonanza for help developers, with a number of uses during development and for interactive use with the program your help file may be supporting.



Help2 Word decompiles Windows Help 3.1 files into a Microsoft Word document, complete with formatting and colors. You can open and view it, and perhaps use it as the start to recreate or modify an existing project. Graphics are also extracted.



WinHelp Inspector views and displays the internal workings of any help system, with dropdown listings of topics, search keywords, fonts used, compilation compression, copyright notice, name, date, size, and startup macros used.



Winhelp Bughunter is ideal for the developer, displaying all the calls made by a running application to Windows Help. This utility can be a real life-saver when trying to verify context-sensitive calls. The release included with WinHelp Office version 1.5 can now debug Windows 95 help systems as well as Windows 3.1.



Graphics Locator browses and previews SHG, MRB, WMF, BMP, ICO, and CUR files, displaying their size and color density. You can specify and copy files to a target (your project) directory.



Graphics Library is a help file with 57 different graphic bullets, buttons, and other symbols helpful to a WinHelp author. Each can individually be copied as a BMP file to a target directory. Frankly, I would rather have just had the files.


Style Guide is another, very extensive help file. It includes advice, tricks, and techniques for new and experienced Help authors. Elementary and advanced features are included.

The **Hyperviewer Wizard** makes adding a full-text search feature and an expandable/collapsible hierarchical view of a help file's topics quick and easy. This latest version doesn't require changes to the HPJ (project) file; it works directly on any *compiled* Windows 3.1 help (HLP) file. Therefore, WinHelp Office owners could even add these capabilities to existing help files not of their own making, for their own convenience and use.



Simply select the help file from the Wizard's dialog box, and then choose to add either or both the HyperViewer and Find+. In seconds, the HLP file is modified; the change has a very minimal effect on the size of the file. Your distribution package, however, will require the addition of CTL3DV2.DLL (22K), and either or both of HYPRFIND.DLL (100K) and HYPRVIEW.DLL (112K), depending on the functionality you've chosen. Readers who have had an opportunity to preview Windows 95 will recognize these features as native there, and an excellent addition to Windows 3.1 help. The end-users can select and print individual or all topics as well as improve their navigation. Unfortunately, with the convenience of the process comes a penalty: *every* topic, including pop-ups and other topics you may not want accessed in this manner, is included. As well, the topic name, i.e., XXPOPUP, becomes the entry in the HyperViewer dialog. It still, however, is a convenience and quite suitable for many help file

structures.

WinHelp Find+ performs a full text search of the file, and can be restricted to matching case, partial or whole word only, and by a specific topic only. Results are speedily returned in the view window, and you can move between multiple findings, display the help file topic in which the text was found, and print the topic, all from the dialog. This is an excellent addition to a help file. An example of this find system in action has been created for our readers' convenience. We invite you to download WOLRIDX1.ZIP (146K), a hypertext help file that lists the over 1200 reviews in the first 99 issues of WOLR and its predecessor publications. It's free!



My first exclamation when using the **Moving to Winhelp '95 Porting Tool** was, "This is wonderful!" Blue Sky is making it such an easy and pleasurable process that your first project will seem more like play than work.

The first step is opening the selected HPJ and adding books to create the Contents Tab for your Windows 95 Help system. You simply select individual topics and introduce them as a new book or topic to be added into the Contents Tab Composer. You can drag lines up and down to reorder them, and as with most of Windows 95, your right mouse button will come in handy. Topics can be previewed in Windows Help from the menu if you are unsure of your selection, and viewed by their topic names or titles.



If you have but a simple project, it's a quick hit of the compile button, and away we go ---

Instant WinHelp 4.0 file! Obviously, if you have a more involved file with secondary windows or want to take advantage of further Windows 95 help features, there's some fine-tuning involved. If you rely on any external DLLs or fancy HPJ tricks to make your 3.1 projects hum, don't be surprised if the WinHelp 4.0 compiler doesn't like them.

Incidentally, you will need HCW.EXE and HCRTF.EXE from Microsoft; these development tools were still in beta at press time. Blue Sky cannot, as a result, provide the Windows 4.0 compilers at this time, but will include them with the package once the final versions are released. Using the late beta compilers, we quickly created a WinHelp 4.0 file that ran perfectly in Windows 95.

If you want the most thorough and complete set of tools for help development, there is only one choice: WinHelp Office. RoboHelpTM's ease of use and level of support by the tools that surround it will help any user to competently create projects from the most basic to the very complex.




ECCO Professional and I have had a love-hate relationship for a long time. I've sought separation, tried other information managers, but always end up coming back. It has always had lots to recommend it: its flexible scheduling, outlining capabilities, and full use of relational database capabilities. It's also had plenty to drive one batty: its appetite for memory and stolid user interface, for example, and the implementation of its relational capabilities was so complex that users were posting their own documentation for it on CompuServe. Since its last release, however, the program has been acquired by NetManage (makers of *Internet Chameleon*) and has now appeared in version **3.0**. It still eats memory like popcorn, but in every other way it has been improved beyond the hopes of its most dedicated and frustrated users.

For those who have never used **ECCO**, it is arguably the most powerful of all the Personal Information Managers. Like all PIMs it offers a scheduler, phone book, and to-do list. But these basic functions are just where it begins. Every piece of information (appointment, name, phone number, to-do item, etc.) is conceived as an object, associated with other objects. All information is stored in (though it is not always viewed by means of) *folders*. At the simplest level, this means that, for instance, all zip codes in the phone book are grouped in the *City* folder, associated with their phone book listings — you could therefore view all your phone-book entries by city or state, and sort them by zip code to find your contacts in a particular area. But it means more than this. You can maintain a master task list and place each task in the *To Do* folder under a particular date, and it will then show up on your to-do list on the given date. You can maintain folders for each of your subordinates at work, and associate every project, and every date for the project, and every to-do item for the project, with the subordinate concerned. Look in his or her folder, and you can see all the tasks s/he is scheduled to do.

Closely linked with its use of folders is **ECCO's** *outlining* capability. Every object, every item of information, can include or be included in a hierarchical, collapsible outline. This is one of the reasons I love **ECCO**, and a point of pride among its users: this PIM can include and organize any amount of information about any appointment or contact or anything else, and not just in the flimsy "Note" or "Memo" fields that many PIMs use.

These are the capabilities **ECCO** users have always enjoyed. In a software market that often encourages meaningless bloat in the successive versions of a product, this new release of **ECCO** is astonishing in its depth and intelligence. The power and technology of the program have not changed, but the screen presentation has been rebuilt from the ground up, and the elusive concept of *folders* is something that, while still available for practiced users, you need never think about it you don't want to.



The main screen is a calendar and to-do list. You can arrange these in different fashions: they can be stacked (as here) or appear side-by-side; the sidebar on the left can show the threemonth calendar, or a one-day, one-week, or one-month "busy bar," or nothing at all. You can also split the screen to show the calendar and to-do list, stacked, on one side, and the phone book or any *notepad* (I'll get to those in a moment) on the other (though there's a harmless bug in the screen display that makes these last options look odd on a 480x640 monitor). Of course, the calendar and to-do lists offer several flavors of recurrent scheduling and alarms and you can drag phone-book items into the calendar and drop them to create appointments; these are standard fare for solid PIMs. How **ECCO** manages the details of these most familiar tasks is one part of its excellence. For navigating among dates, it offers an ingenious series of cascading menus.

Compared to clicking on little arrows or scrolling scroll-bars as you must in other PIMs, this is one-stop shopping. And this new version has introduced the concept of *anchor dates*. Say you're to make a presentation on November 30, and you've planned the tasks you need to perform to get ready for it. Now say the date is changed to November 7 — moving the anchor date of the presentation moves the other dates attached to it as well. One last feature of the calendar and to-do list that I find invaluable is the ability of each, as everything else in **ECCO**, to support collapsible outlines, like the one I've expanded under "Jim Hinch" in the first screen shot.

Outlines are really at the heart of how **ECCO** works, but it was not clear that the original designers recognized that fact: they were difficult to set up correctly and the program emphasized instead the calendar on the one hand and the folders on the other. But in version 3.0 the outline, now called the *notepad*, is at center stage. You can create as many of them as you want, and now they are quickly accessible through the little tabs at the bottom of the screen.

Working in an outline is like working in a word processor, and you can format its text as you could in a word processor and create particular formats for particular levels of the outline. You can add any number of columns to an outline to associate the outline's items with other folders, and the columns can be of a check-off form, text or numbers, a pick list, a Gantt chart, or a date picked from a drop-down calendar The "To-Do" column above is of the calendar type; choosing a date places it on the to-do list for that day. And now you can run basic calculations with numeric and date or time columns, a function so in demand in previous versions that a shareware utility emerged to do it.

Another long-standing ECCO feature has been perfected in this version. An outline can

accommodate filenames for any document on your computer; double-click on the filename (you used to have to click a button or choose a menu command) and the document is launched with its associated application. This means that **ECCO** can function as a document manager: you can classify your WordPerfect documents and QuattroPro spreadsheets and Approach databases by category, give them long descriptions, and launch them straight from **ECCO**. If you've got a Web browser, you can double-click on any URL and the browser will launch and (assuming you're connected to the Internet) open the web page.

This new release of **ECCO Professional** has won me back, and I don't think I'm likely to change again for a long time. It goes without saying that no thousand-word review can do justice to any fine application; I'm conscious of that with every review I write. But with **ECCO** I feel that I've barely scratched the surface. But then, after nearly two years, I'm still learning new ways to use the power of this astonishing software; its brilliance and depth keep revealing new possibilities.

Though the new HTML 3.0 standard lifts the capabilities of the medium to new heights, some limitations remain. This is not so much the fault of the standard as it is the inherent nature of the beast. The most popular browsers permit the user to choose the proportional fonts to be used when documents are displayed. User configurability is nice, but there is an aesthetic downside to this aspect of HTML documentation, especially from the author's standpoint.

By default, the Netscape browser is configured to use the Times New Roman font. This means that all text appearing in the body of the document will look like the type you are reading right now. The only variations possible are manipulations in size and style. The text can be bold, italic and many different sizes and combinations of these qualities, but the bottom line is, it is *still* all Times New Roman.

In and of itself, this is not a terrible thing, but from an artistic point of view, it is visually boring and constricted. Ideally, one would like to "snazz" up a document with color and style. Here's an example:

This is a headline in Times New Roman.

This is a headline in Monotype Corsiva.

O.K. Let's have a show of hands. Which of the above headlines is more noticeable and visually appealing? No contest! If you are an experienced HTML author, then you know it is possible to have a headline like the Monotype Corsiva pictured above. It requires the encoding and placement of a transparent GIF bearing the image of the headline into the document. This is, however, *much* more easily said than done. It requires software tools and knowledge that most users simply don't have.

Wouldn't it be nice if there were a tool that would allow you to create a colored headline using any True Type font on your system by simply typing it in? Wish no more. **WebFonts** is the tool you're looking for!



When it comes to creating a fancy, attractive headline in an HTML document, **WebFonts** is about as effortless as it gets. You simply pick a font and color, enter the text of your headline

in its WYSIWYG (What You See Is What You Get) environment, and **WebFonts** generates the graphics files and HTML source code for you. If so desired, it can also create individual characters. What could be easier?

As a practical matter, there are built-in provisions in the HTML standard for those who surf the Web with their graphics turned off, and for the older, DOS-based Internet hypertext browsers such as Lynx. (Some might say that this is more like "belly-boarding" than surfing; To which the opposing camp responds that purely text-based travel is inarguably faster and more efficient. But I digress...) For those who lack the tools or the inclination to view the imbedded graphics, there is a function called "Alt = " which alternatively replaces each graphic with text of the author's choosing. WebFonts has a feature that automatically generates these "Alt = " fields in the HTML source.

WebFonts does have one major flaw. The current version 1.1 unfortunately lacks the ability to create headlines with more than one line. My good friend and colleague, Ed Hoffman, has bestowed his "Works for Me!" award on many a one-trick pony in the pages of this magazine for quite some time now. I would say that **WebFonts** might be a contender for such an award except for its price tag. For \$49, I think I'd like it to create more than single lines of text. On the other hand, the valuation of convenience is an individual, personal matter. It does, after all, perform as advertised.

HP COLORADO T1000 TRAVAN

a review by Thom Foulk

Now that you've moved uptown with a many-megabyte hard drive (couldn't ignore those low prices, right?), the next thing on your shopping list should be a tape backup system capable of handling more megabytes than anything you now have. That's Travan, a technology expected to spread industry-wide.

You'll also want to make sure it's compatible with your current QIC-80 tapes. That's the **HP Colorado T1000 Travan** drive, offering 400MB+ (up to 800MB) of backup power. Besides the healthy increase in capacity, the drive is backward compatible with DC2000/DC2120 tapes -- like those produced on my old Colorado Memory Systems (CMS) Jumbo 250 drive.

The Travan cartridges, developed by 3M, not only handle 750 feet of tape but are also heftier and larger. That's why you'll find it easy to recognize a Travan tape drive -- the drive's insert slot has a notch at the top two corners, allowing it to accept either the smaller DC2000/2120 cartridges, or the larger Travan cartridges. The drive and operative software can automatically distinguish between the two. Automatically.



In fact, that's an awesome power. After working with a Travan cartridge for a couple of hours, using Colorado Backup for Windows (CBW) V. 2.70, I pulled the tape and inserted a DC2000 tape that contained scanned, edited images of a family Yosemite outing from more than two years ago. CBW's menu display instantly reflected the tape removal...and, about 45 seconds later, automatically displayed the "Yosemite" title of the old backup tape.

Now, comes the acid test of backward-compatibility. These were TIF photo images, some ranging to 3MB. I randomly selected four from the old tape, and restored them to a TEMP directory. No fuss, no muss. About ten minutes later, I browsed through the images; they were flawless. There had been no errors, and this came from a tape which has simply been in storage for months. (I will note that the restoration was much quieter than performing the original backup).

There's a kicker to this test -- and here it is: All the above was done in Windows 95 (May Test Release)!!! Nothing in the firm's documentation claims Win95 compatibility, but nothing told me I couldn't, so... And it worked. I also brought up Windows 3.11 on the same machine, and the T1000 acted as expected -- no problems.

The Travan technology was announced last December as a joint development of 3M, Sony, Conner Peripherals, Iomega, Hewlett-Packard, and H-P's Colorado Memory Systems division. The group has since been joined by other firms, and ratification of the proposed standard is pending before the Quarter-Inch Cartridge (QIC) Drive Standards committee.

Although the new standard does not change the head or electronics technology of existing QIC designs, it does use a .315-inch wide media instead of .250-inch. The Travan cartridge I reviewed has a 750-feet of tape; longer versions are promised. Without data compression, it can handle 400MB of data. Software compression can increase that to as much as 800MB, but is widely variable with the type of files being stored. (An ASCII text file, as example, will compress considerably more than a ZIP-file archive.)

Another unpredictable variable is the speed of backup. CMS says the drive is capable of speeds up to 9MB per minute. But that's variable with the speed of hard drives, machine speed, type of data and other factors. The best I could get (on a 486DX2/50, Maxtor IDE drives) was a shade over 4MB-per-minute, without compression, using Colorado Backup for Windows, V. 2.70. That's about a third-faster than a Jumbo 250 drive on the same machine.

CMS has tried hard to make installation a no-brainer and the well-illustrated installation guide is exemplary. The drive comes ready to place in a 5.25-inch bay; removing an adapter makes it easy to fit in a half-height bay. I was marveling at its quiet operation in less than an hour after opening the shipping box. Because it uses the existing floppy drive controller, no additional expansion card is necessary; cables and screws for a variety of installations are included.

Pre-formatted TR-1 tapes from CMS are priced at \$43, a price that can be expected to drop as other manufacturers build to the new Travan standard. Just introduced in May, T1000 Travan drives and tapes may not yet be in every PC accessory store or catalogue.

SSS-170W SURROUND SOUND SYSTEM

a review by Bob Gollihu

Are you still using those little mini-speakers that came with your sound card kit? Get with it, you might as well be listening to music through the telephone. Time to replace those tiny squawk boxes!

To put this review into perspective, I must advise you that I am a bit of an audio enthusiast. (Note that I said *enthusiast* — you need big money to be an *audiophile*.) When I had the opportunity to review the new **Media Depot SSS-170W Surround Sound System** I was very pleased. My test machine was using the tiny Labtec speakers that originally came with my SoundBlaster kit. Okay, I'm ashamed — but not entirely.

You see, the machine not ten feet away is equipped with a SoundBlaster AWE-32 that drives an ancient, but still very capable, Marantz 2230. It, in turn, powers a pair of large bookshelf speakers each containing a very healthy 6½ inch woofer and ferrofluid dome tweeter. So, when this new machine stole the Marantz, I had to break out the Labtecs or suffer in silence.



Measuring 4.3x9x4.3 inches, the **SSS-170W Surround Sound System** speakers are nicely styled and well constructed, and in the usual computer color. I can say so since I disassembled one to check it out. The full range, three-inch acoustic suspension driver inside is impressive, and magnetically-shielded so placement adjacent to your monitor is not a problem. The reflex enclosures are large enough to let the unit breathe, and includes a small port near the top of the permanently attached grille.

As with most speakers of this type, the stereo amplifier is within one enclosure, with a connecting cable to the other. Rear panel inputs are provided for the very substantial power supply. The 110volt 35watt/15volt 1.2amp monster is well-designed with a real cable and plug so

it won't obscure other outlets on your power bar. Finally, a pair of color-coded RCA jacks for right and left inputs, and a jack for the cable from the right speaker are provided, as is a cable terminated with a mini-phone plug. A word of advice: use your mixer to determine if right and left are reflected properly; I had to reverse cables to get the proper result.

All the controls are conveniently located on the front panel of the left speaker. A bass control thins out or boosts the low end, while a volume control anchors the other side of the unit. Between them, two push buttons control the power and engages the Surround Sound feature.

Two mini-phone jacks are on the front panel for features that all speakers should provide. First, the blessing of a headphone jack, for those late evening teen game sessions, so your offspring can conveniently blast their ears out while you get your beauty sleep. Second, a front panel Input 2 — yes, a place to plug in your portable CD unit, tape player, or whatever you want! This is a super feature, and with a front panel jack that automatically disables the primary source, there's no messy plugging and unplugging of multiple cables. Good idea, Media Depot!

As for the reason that you've read this far — how does the Media Depot SSS-170W Surround Sound System sound? In a word, *great*. These are excellent computer speakers, due not only to the handy features mentioned above, but their impressive price/performance ratio. I first auditioned them with audio CDs representing a wide variety of styles. In their normal state, the SS-170W's response was observed to be quite flat without any exaggerated peaks, which my classical music taste appreciated. There was a pleasing lack of distortion, even as the volume control neared maximum. These are *not* underpowered speakers that shout at you and hurt your ears with the sound of their amplifier "clipping."

The Surround Sound button brought different results, depending on the program material. Generally, the highs became more pronouced, the lows boosted, and the stage wider, as the speakers' output came up several decibels. Since the effect is achieved by mixing right and left signals, the results achieved rely heavily on the input. You won't get much from a mono signal, but a good stereo signal can produce amazing results. The stage extended at least 24 inches beyond the outside of each speaker in most cases. Naturally, the best effect is achieved when your head is squarely between the speakers. This setting is no doubt a *game must*, for maximum impact and to enhance the usual special effects. Certain music definitely benefits from the Surround Sound treatment, too. I was shocked at the perceptible depth and localization of instruments that certain CDs produced.

I highly recommend the Media Depot SSS-170W Surround Sound System. They're compact, deliver good lows for their size, and provide a practical set of features. Take my advice, though — if you get these speakers, listen to them first *without* the surround sound for a while. Otherwise, they may sound a bit colorless to you, in comparison, once you disengage the feature — *but that's the mark of a good speaker*. They're not *supposed* to color the sound, just deliver it. And the SSS-170W does deliver.

While not yet available on retail shelves at press time, the system can be ordered directly from Media Depot and selected mail order vendors (PC Zone 800-258-2088; PC Mall 800-555-4204).

Addendum: The resident teen who shares my machines, in spite of my recalcitrance, came home with Full Throttle, a game with liberal motorcycle and other sounds. We first installed it on the 486, which now has ownership of the SSS-170W's. That first motorcycle racing across the screen and across the room was a real surprise to him. He played the game for a while, but due to problems with the 1x CD ROM drive, we moved it to the Pentium with the quad speed drive. The first thing out of his mouth was "can we move the new speakers over here, they really sound good!" The surround sound effect was extremely impressive, presenting quite a wide field of bold, animated sound — apparently "cool" enough to invoke enthusiasm from an otherwise taciturn teen. I guess SSS-170W Surround Sound System also gets the "youth vote."

PHONEDISC POWERFINDER

a review by Bob Gollihu

The CD ROM that populates most PCs these days brings more than just games and convenient software installation to users — it can bring massive amounts of data as well. PhoneDisc'95 is a great example of that technology at work.



PhoneDisc PowerFinder is more than just a database of 90 million of the nation's business and personal phone numbers and addresses. It's an organized program to retrieve *the* data you seek, quickly, delivering it in a format that you can use. The five discs that are provided with this particular PhoneDisc product are divided by regions in the country, as shown in the map.

Searches are amazingly quick, although admittedly we auditioned PhoneDisc on a 90mhz Pentium with a quad-speed CD ROM drive. As you key in each character, the database moves to match the criterion. You can quickly change the index key by using the menu or clicking on one of the index buttons. Your view can quickly be switched to look at all the listings on the street of the highlighted entry, or all the phone numbers, sequentially, around your selection. A great trick to pull on your distant friends is to read them all their neighbors' names.

The limit function is the key to paring down all this data into managable chunks. Any individual or combination of partial entries filters the display to only those entries in which you're interested. This can take a longer time to display, as the disc is scanned and qualified entries added. There are tricks to get the best performance from PhoneDisc. Depending on your targets, there are some better methods to search, which were discovered when trying to isolate just residents on a particular street, causing a lengthy wait while the entire disk was searched.

However, the flexibility is good; for instance, the example used was searching for entries with the word "Rescue" within the name, narrowing it down to a partial zip and single area code.

Now that you are viewing your data, what can you do with it? PhoneDisc excels in delivering the data in a format you can use. Specify either all the records found in the search, or highlight selected records to export for use in many applications, with name order as Last, First M, or First M. Last. You can save the data as a generic dBase II or comma delimited file in a single line, or take advantage of PhoneDisc's forethought in this matter. They offer formats compatible with ACT!, WordPro (AmiPro) mail merge, Desktop Manager, ECCO, Lotus Organizer, Q&A's .CSV or Write mail merge formats, MS Word mail merge, MyMailList, Packrat, or tab delimited. The thorough help file even includes tips on how to use the data in the other applications. What a great way to fill your PIM with prospects or your address book with neighbors!

Finally, PhoneDisc breezes past all the interim steps to directly print labels or envelopes from the application. Select from popular Avery label styles or common envelope sizes, specify the name order, and choose to include the phone number, and even the Postnet bar code and an "attention line" if space permits. You can also select the output font and size, and the program can fake upper and lower case output. This is an excellent feature that was very easy to use and produced excellent results quickly.

It should be mentioned that PhoneDisc also expects you may be ringing up a few of the folks you locate. Click on the phone icon to dial the selected entry using your modem, or by producing the dialing tones through your sound card. Selections can also be copied to the clipboard by menu selection or clicking the appropriate icon on the convenient button bar, or dragged and dropped in Windows 95.

PhoneDisc's interfaces are very intuitive, with all of its functions very well thought out. It was never even necessary to consult the brief manual, except for the purposes of this review. If you do use it, you'll find the text is very clearly written from the point of view of the practical use of the program.

This release of PhoneDisc '95 PowerFinder includes installation programs and operating interfaces for Windows 3.1x, Windows 95, Windows NT 3.5x, MS-DOS, or the Apple Macintosh. The Windows version is a 32 bit application that will install Microsoft's Win32S (32 bit extensions) to allow Windows 3.1x to run PhoneDisc.

Digital Directory Assistance quotes an independent study citing that PhoneDisc's telephone listings were 93% accurate, far in excess of their closest competitor. That's probably due, in part, to the fact that discs are updated quarterly. Additionally, all retail packages include a registration card that provides a free update to the most current disc. These factors, combined with the great ease of use and variety of output, makes PhoneDisc an excellent choice.

PhoneDisc issues different versions of the product depending on your needs, with list prices ranging from \$39.00 to \$299.00. Yearly subscriptions are available.




