What is Easy Uploads?

Easy Uploads is a Windows utility to help save you time and money when uploading ("Contributing") files to CompuServe Libraries using WinCIM or CSNav. Easy Uploads also helps insure that Descriptions, Titles, and Keywords for your files are consistent across all the Libraries you decide to place them on. Then, to help you remember where you placed them, Easy Uploads includes a Forum Tracker.

Why Easy Uploads?

I'm not sure how you've been doing it, but until now, every time I wanted to upload a new file, or an update to an existing file, I was always spending way too much time typing, and would wrack my brain trying to remember the description I used the last time.

Sure, I would use Notepad, or Write to compose my thoughts beforehand, but there was never any way to get all the data over to the File Description in one clean shot, and Pasting was really difficult (since the Library Contribute dialog box is *modal* [focus cannot shift until the dialog is closed], you cannot get at Paste in the Edit menu). By the time I was ready to upload the file, I inevitably had one or two overlooked typos, and had spent a good 5 minutes getting everything just right. **Forget it!**

So I thought I'd buy CS Navigator, so I wouldn't have to retype all the data every time. I'd create my script once, and then forget about it, because CSNav lets you do *everything* off line, right? WRONG! While still a great program overall, much to my surprise, CSNav DOES NOT save the data for Contributing Files with your Script. You must still type your Title, Keywords, Descriptions, etc. every time. Forget it!

Don't get me wrong, they're both great programs, but I have a lot of files to update, and I don't want to do all that typing! I suppose it would have been easier if I could have found something already on the Shareware market, but none could be found, so I built my own. As probably one of its biggest users, you can be sure that I will continue to improve it, until it's as easy as it can be! Your suggestions to help attain that goal are always appreciated.

The Solution to My Problems

I created Easy Uploads. With Easy Uploads, you create a simple text file with all your upload data, before that scary "Contribute" dialogs confronts you! This gives you a chance to spell check your work, and give it a good going over, without the pressure of being on-line, and incurring connect charges, or constantly fiddling with the Description. The text file uses the Windows INI format, so it's easy to understand and create. In fact, all the data for the Easy Uploads descriptions on CompuServe Forums were entered using Easy Uploads (obvious right, I mean I certainly wouldn't create this great utility, and then type in all the data!). Most uploads required less than 10 mouse clicks, and were begun within 10 seconds of entering a Forum with WinCIM, and filling the Contribute dialog in CSNav is a snap!

For WinCIM

Once you get on-line, and in a Forum Library, you can start uploading your file within seconds of beginning connect charges \$\$\$. With Easy Uploads, once you're in a Forum, you can upload a file with as little as **three** clicks of the mouse! See: <u>Uploading Files to WinCIM</u>.

For CSNav

CSNav already helps you save \$\$\$ in connect charges, however by using Easy Uploads you can quit busting your knuckles typing your descriptions every time. See: <u>Uploading Files to CSNav.</u>

Convenience Counts

Easy Uploads has an "On Top" check box to toggle its state between normal Windows behavior, and

always staying on top of other applications. When "On Top" is enabled, Easy Uploads will float above WinCIM/CSNav, so you don't have to use <ALT+TAB>, or minimize/maximize the programs to get at all the buttons.

Size Counts

We all know that size counts. When you want the best performance while uploading files, you know to close as many programs as possible, and give WinCIM/CSNav as much of your precious memory as possible, to effect a quick and error free transfer. With that in mind, I have created Easy Uploads with as few resources as possible to keep it small and efficient. Once it's copied your data to the Contribute dialog, you can close Easy Uploads, or let it sit minimized and unassuming, waiting to copy data for the same, or a new file, whenever you're ready again. Simply click on an Easy Upload Data File, in the file list, and you're instantly ready to upload another file!

Creating/Editing Upload Data Files

Select New to begin a New data File. Easy Uploads will prompt you for a filename to give your data file, and then display a standard Open Dialog so you can specify the Source file you'd like to Upload. Select a File, and Easy Uploads will place the Full Path in the File Name box, and the File Name in the Destination box. If it finds a FILE_ID.DIZ file in your source directory, Easy Uploads will ask if you'd like to read it into the Description, to get a quick head start! Then simply enter data in the appropriate fields. Enter the data just as you would if you were entering it to the Contribute dialog. Create an Easy Uploads data file for every program in your arsenal!

DATA FILE FORMAT

NOTE: The following assumes that you've already uploaded at least one file to CIS, and are familiar with the standard "Contribute" dialog. The Easy Uploads data files use the standard Windows INI format.

For Easy Uploads, a data file (INI) has the following parameters, shown in **bold**:

DestinationName= the Filename to use on CompuServe (6 chr. max + ext.)

Title= Your Program Title

Keys= Search Keys for your Program.

Library Forum Library Number (0-23) Use the actual offset in



If you wish to **Copy** an existing data file to use for a new file, simply choose "Save As..." from the File menu, to give the file a unique new name.

This Help file was written for the Intermediate-Advanced user. The assumption is that: if you're smart enough to Upload files to CompuServe, I don't need to explain Windows or WinCIM/CSNav in great detail. It also assumes a general understanding of INI files.

Requirements: Windows 3.1, WinCIM or CSNav, VBRUN300.DLL (not included), MHGMEN.VBX, MHRUN400.DLL (both MH*.* files are included), and data files that you create.

The Help Contents lists Help Topics available for Easy Uploads. Use the scroll bars to see entries not currently displayed in a current Help window.

Select an underlined jump word (e.g. "Editing Upload Data Files" below) to move directly to a Topic.

Once you've created your data files, using Easy Uploads to upload your files to a forum using WinCIM is just that, EASY! This topic contains a lot of important information. Be sure to read it in its entirety.

<u>IMPORTANT</u> One of the advantages of using Easy Uploads is that you can compose everything OFF-line. The following assumes that you've already created, edited, spell checked, etc. your data file(s), and you're ready to go. You will negate Easy Uploads' usefulness if you compose ON-line.

Here's how it works:


- 1). Open Easy Uploads.
- 2). Select the Data File for the Program you want to Upload (everything correct, and ready to go).
- 3). Make sure the "On Top" check box is Enabled, and the "Warnings" check is set to your liking.
- 4). Minimize Easy Uploads.
- 5). Logon to WinCIM.
- 6). "GO" to the Forum where the file is to be posted.

- 7). Select "Library|Contribute" from the WinCIM menu, or click the Contribute Icon in the toolbar.

 The Library Contribute dialog box will appear.
- 8). Click the Easy Uploads icon **once** to display the Control menu.
- 9). Select the "Send: ?????" item.

If the "Warning" check box is enabled, you will receive the following message.



Translation: Make sure you executed step 7 above, and the cursor is properly set.

If the cursor is NOT in the proper input box, select Cancel, properly set the cursor, and begin again.

Proper Cursor Position for Send Data

The easiest way to properly set the cursor for Send Data, is to do nothing, after you open the Contribute dialog (leaving the cursor in the "File Name" input box). If you have changed the focus away from the "File Name" input box, give it the focus again (click in the box), before you select Send Data.

If everything is OK, select the OK button to start sending data. Easy Uploads will Minimize itself, and send your data to the dialog.

Since it is impossible to predict what will be in your "Forum" list box (this generally defaults to the proper one anyway), I have left this up to you. A couple clicks of the mouse, no problem. Be sure that you properly set all three dropdown list boxes, including the Library, BEFORE you select OK. They're set? Then you're ready, GO GO GO!

Select **OK** to begin uploading your file.

\$\$\$ Extended Connect Charges Are Suspended While Uploading \$\$\$*

* most forums do not charge for the actual upload time, only the time spent filling out the dialog. Go get a cup of coffee, and when you get back, if you have other files to upload, Easy Uploads is ready! Select "Library|Contribute" from the menu to open the dialog again. Then maximize Easy Uploads, and click on the new data file in the list box to get Easy Uploads ready. Click Send Data, and away you go! EASY!

You've just digested a lot lot of information, and it may seem from the length of my explanations that the process is complicated, but once you try it once or twice, you'll see that it can be done quickly, and easily, and in less than 10 seconds! Once you've got the hang of it, you can turn off the Warnings, and things will really fly.



Uploading Files with CSNav

Once you've created your data files, using Easy Uploads to update your Script to Contribute a file using CSNav is just that, EASY! This topic contains a lot of important information. Be sure to read it in its entirety.

<u>IMPORTANT</u> One of the advantages of using Easy Uploads, like CSNav, is that you can compose everything OFF-line. However, while CSNav lets you do this, it **DOES NOT** save the data for your Uploaded files in its Script once it's been uploaded. You must still type in all the data EVERY time you want to upload ("Contribute") a file.

Here's how it works:


- 1). Open Easy Uploads.
- 2). Select the Data File for the Program you want to Upload (everything correct, and ready to go).
- 3). Make sure the "On Top" check box is Enabled, and the "Warning" check is set to your liking.
- 4). Minimize Easy Uploads.
- 5). Open CSNav, and your Script.

- 7). Select Contribute Files... button in the CSNav Script Tree for the proper Forum.
- The Contribute File dialog box will appear.
 8). Click the Easy Uploads icon **once** to display the Control menu.
- 9). Select the "Send: ?????" item.

If the "Warning" check box is enabled, you will receive the following message.



Translation: Make sure you executed step 7 above, and the cursor is properly set. If the cursor is NOT in the proper input box, select Cancel, properly set the cursor, and begin again.

Proper Cursor Position for Send Data

The easiest way to properly set the cursor for Send Data, is to do nothing, after you open the Contribute dialog (leaving the cursor in the "File Name" input box). You've just digested a lot lot of information, and it may seem from the length of my explanations that the process is complicated, but once you try it once or twice, you'll see that it can be done quickly, and easily, and in less than 10 seconds! Once you've got the hang of it, you can turn off the Warning, and things will really fly.

Notes about Descriptions

As much as Easy Uploads states that it *helps* to insure consistent data across multiple forums, I cannot guarantee that this will be the case. So, I feel I need to make a simple (and somewhat obvious) disclaimer, and explain.

<u>DISCLAIMER:</u> While I can guarantee that Easy Uploads will consistently fill the 'Contribute' dialog with your data, I cannot guarantee that the data displayed on CompuServe will be consistent with what you uploaded. The SysOp of the forum, ultimately, has the final word about how the information for your file is displayed. Even I am not immune to this "problem", as you'll see later.

NOTE: Any SysOp or User reading this, who would like to add anything, or refute anything I'm about to state, can feel free to write me with your observations. If of use to the general public, I will be happy to include them in the next version's Help file, so these types of things happen less often.

I'll Explain:

Many CompuServe forums/libraries have their own conventions for displaying the information regarding user contributed files. In general, your: *Destination Name*, and *Keywords* are pretty safe as is, however your *Title* and *Description* are areas where you may see a variety of different things happen. A few things to watch...

Your Title:

Be sure to include a version number for your program somewhere in either the Title, or the Description. Most forums seem to prefer that it appear in the Title.

If you don't include a version number, some may use its Date, (v10-31-94) which looks pretty silly (I should know, as one did it to my first version of Easy Uploads which didn't have ANY version number! My fault! I should have known better.)

Don't get too crazy with the Title. Although you can type a lot in the box, the number of characters visible to users while doing a quick scan of files is limited.

Don't use ALL CAPS for your Title (reduces the number of characters visible, and really annoying).

Your Description:

Some forums will automatically add your name, some will add comments regarding their forum, while others will include your SWREG#, and a host of other little idiosyncrasies. Sometimes even additional spaces show up, or punctuation is missing (how that happens is a mystery to me, unless someone is retyping it? Maybe they should get Easy Uploads?).

Always include your SWREG# for your program if it's registered with the service.

Include the version number for your program, if not already in the Title.

In general, you should be checking up on your file after it's been posted. Check all the parts carefully to be sure they're OK. Easy Uploads is a good way to check, since it can stay On Top of CIM, as you view the data that's been posted.

<u>Authors Note:</u> In over 100 Uploads of my own Shareware/Freeware to CIS, I've only found about 30 occasions where my original Description has been left *completely* intact, without modification.

In the majority of instances where it had been altered, it was never anything glaring, or detrimental, and a few even helped, so I simply left them, and had fun waiting to see what they came up with the next time. In a few instances I felt I needed to contact the SysOp, and request some changes. In ALL such instances I was given a fair shake, and was able to compromise with the SysOp.

So please, if a SysOp changes your description to the point you think is unreasonable, or incorrect, don't start your E-mail off with: "What the h-ll have you done to my description?". Something like: "In reviewing my recent upload to your forum, I noticed that the description for my program is in error.could you

please change it to:" will inevitably get you better service. Also, be sure to include how you want the description to read, including any of the things they may have added, like your SWREG# (don't just send back your original description, as it obviously didn't meet their criteria the first time). Also, they will be more eager to help if they have the new data with the first E-mail you send, and don't have to chase you down, and play E-mail tag.

Menu Descriptions

File Menu

You will be given one opportunity to change your mind.

Print the current Data file.

If you want to Print more than one file at a time, you can select multiple files in the list by holding the Control key, and clicking with the mouse (at present, multiple selection in the File list only applies to the time estimate, and printing).

Print ZIP Ctrl+Z

Print the contents of the ZIP source file (same as what you see in the ZIP Viewer list).

Print Instructions Ctrl+I

Print Quick Instructions for WinCIM users. This is a quick print of the steps required to upload a file (in case you're online, and need a hand). CSNav users are already offline, and can refer to the <u>Uploading Files to CSNav</u> topic in this help file if you get stuck.

<u>VBFile Stamper...</u> Ctrl+T Exit Ctrl+X

All three are standard Windows behavior.

Data Files

The Data Files list box displays all the data files in your Easy Uploads directory. Simply click on a file name to display its data, or move up/down the list with the arrow keys. Double-click on a file to edit it with Windows Notepad.

New

The New button/menu item helps you begin a data file. You will be prompted for a name to give the new data file. Use standard filename conventions, and enter a name up to 8 characters. You do not need to add a file extension, as .INI will be applied automatically by Easy Uploads. After you name the file, Easy Uploads will prompt you for the Source File that you want to Upload.

Open

The Open... menu item opens the currently selected data file. Easy Uploads will open it in Windows Notepad so you can edit your data. You can also use the <Ctrl>+O shortcut key combination to edit the currently selected file.

NOTE: For Users of Version 1.02 and Before.


You no longer need to use Notepad to edit your files. You can now do all your editing within Easy Uploads. This feature has been retained for those of you who might prefer it. Also, you can still double click in the File list to open your data file in Notepad.

Menus

Many of the buttons have equivalents in the Easy Uploads menu, however, some features can only be accessed from the menu. File Delete... is a prime example. See $\underline{\text{Menu Descriptions}}$ for more about the menus.

Control Descriptions

Use the mouse to click on different areas of the dialog where the cursor becomes a hand. If your selection "jumps" you to another topic, select the "Back" button to return here.



Test File Name

The Test File Name check box allows you to have Easy Uploads check to be sure that the file you've specified to Upload actually exists! If EU cannot find the file when the check box is enabled, you will be prompted to that effect. When disabled, EU will do no checking!

HINT: If you don't have a file already named for your upload, leave the FileName= parameter empty, and EU will NOT annoy you by prompting that it doesn't exist. Be sure to fill it in later!

Send Data

The **Send Data** button/menu item starts Easy Uploads on its way. See: <u>Uploading Files to WinCIM</u>, and <u>Uploading Files to CSNav</u> for more on what happens when you press Send Data button.

NOTE: If the Contribute dialog for the currently selected program (WinCIM/CSNav) is not available when you select Send Data, you will be notified as such, and offered a Demo dialog instead. Select No to return to EU, or Yes, and EU will display a Demo of the appropriate dialog, and Send your data to it. This is a good way to practice with, and without the Warnings.

If you have a Contribute dialog open, and expected EU to work, select No, and check to be sure that the WinCIM/CSNav option buttons are set for the proper program, then try again.

Warnings/On Top

Warnings check box

The Warnings are only to alert you to be sure the cursor is properly placed in the Contribute dialog, and to set the Forum, and File Type before you press OK. Once you have the hang of it you can disable the Warnings, and things will really fly!

On Top check box

Use this check box to control Easy Uploads behavior. When enabled, Easy Uploads will float "On Top" of WinCIM/CSNav when Minimized and Maximized.

Exit

The Exit button/menu item is a quick way to Exit Easy Uploads. **NOTE**: Easy Uploads will never prompt you "If you're Sure?", since there isn't anything to save. It will simply go away quietly.

Test Max Chrs.

The standard "Contribute" dialog in WinCIM/CSNav allows approximately 550 characters. When the Test Max Chrs. check box is enabled, Easy Uploads will test to be sure you haven't exceeded the limit. If you do, and the check box is enabled, you will be prompted to reduce your description. Check the bottom right corner of the window (Avail. Chrs) to see how many characters you need to trim.

NOTE: If you choose to disable this check box, and exceed the limit, be sure to thoroughly check your Description after EU has sent the data. Most likely, it will have been truncated, and you will have heard a lot of BEEPS, as EU tries to follow your wishes, only to be denied by the limit.

Date, Time, and Size

If Easy Uploads is able to find the file you've specified, it will display the last Date/Time it was Saved, along with its Size in Bytes.

WinCIM/CSNav/AOL Options

The WinCIM/CSNav/AOL option buttons allow you to specify which application you would like your data sent to. Since the Contribute dialogs differ between applications, Easy Uploads needs to know where it's going, BEFORE you click a Send button.

NOTE: Easy Uploads is currently under construction to include America Online as a new option. Stay tuned for further updates.

Double-clicking the options buttons will Launch the selected program if you have properly set the Path to the program in the <u>Defaults</u> dialog.

Description Statistics

The standard "Contribute" dialog in WinCIM/CSNav allows approximately 550 characters. These numbers provide a measure of how "full" your Description is, displaying the Description Total, and the Number of Characters Remaining/Over.

Data Boxes

The text boxes for: Destination, Title, Keys, and Description, display the information in your Data files in a fashion similar to CIS, and the Contribute Dialog. Edit your data directly in these text boxes.

You can use Ctrl+C/Ctrl+V/Ctrl+Z to Copy/Paste/Undo within the text boxes, or use the Edit menu.

Library

Since there are way too may libraries for it to be practical for EU to display them, by default, I have filled the list with generic library names. In keeping with CIS's 24 library limit, they are appropriately named:

[0] Library 1 [1] Library 2 etc.

The number in braces designates the "offset" (.ListIndex for you programmers) in the Library list. Don't be fooled by what the forum says when it comes to the Library offset. Often times their numbers have no correlation to the offset in the list. A Library might have a list like:

	Actual Offset
[1] General	0
[2] Windows	1
[4] DOS	2
[5] OS/2	3
[7] Unix	4

HINT: count the # of {DN} key presses it takes to highlight the proper library in WinCIM or CSNav. (0-23=Libraries 1-24) then use that number in the list.

You may change the entries by editing them directly in the list box. Simply type over the default entry. To have your change take effect, you MUST press ENTER. To cancel any changes., select another list item. **Any items not changed by you will revert to the default**.

To avoid typing in the same Library names for multiple EU data files, do the following:

- 1). Enter the libraries to ONE of your Easy Uploads data files.
- 2). Double-click on the data file in the File list to open it in Notepad.
- 3). Towards the bottom of the file you'll find a section named [Libraries].
- 4). Select the ENTIRE section, (including the section header: [Libraries]) and copy it to the Clipboard.
- 5). Close the data file, and return to Easy Uploads.
- 6). Double-click the next data file in the list that has the same libraries.
- 7). Press Ctrl+END to select the end of the data file.
- 8). PASTE the copied libraries to the file.
- 9). Save, and Close the data file.
- 10). Repeat from step #6 for each file with the same libraries.

Using the Demo Dialogs

A companion program to Easy Uploads will display a Demo of the "Contribute" dialogs from WinCIM, and CSNav. You can bring up the Demo dialog from the Options menu in Easy Uploads. Select the dialog that's appropriate for the application you've specified to Send to (not too hard, since the other menu item will be disabled).

Once the demo is displayed, select the Send Data button to test how Easy Uploads will work with WinCIM, or CSNav once their dialog is open. After you've seen the demo, select either the OK or Cancel button to remove the demo, and return to Easy Uploads (both buttons have the same meaning).

NOTE: Easy Uploads will automatically give you the option of Sending to the Demo, if the Contribute dialog for the appropriate program is not available. Just click Send Data, and then Yes, to the option, and EU will open and send to the demo.

NOTE: The Companion program is named CONTRIB.EXE, and must be in the same directory as Easy Uploads to perform properly. I made this its own program to try and keep Easy Uploads small. Sorry for the extra clutter on your hard drive! CONTRIB.EXE cannot be run from an icon, or from File Manager. Only Easy Uploads can open CONTRIB.

Data File Type

The File Type list box allows you to specify which types of files are displayed in the File list. The choices are:

Data (*.ini) All Easy Uploads Data Files.

Backup (*.eub) Data files backed up with the Backup button.

Both (*.ini;*.eub) Data and Backup Files.

Backup


Easy Uploads creates Backups of your Data Files in your Easy Uploads directory, with the extension .EUB.

ZIP Source Contents

Press **F6**, select the **ZIP** button, or the **Upload|Display Zip Contents...** menu item to display the ZIP Viewer, and the contents of the Source ZIP archive. Easy Uploads reads the header data from your ZIP, so it *never* has to call PKUNZIP to find out what's in the archive.

Select the **Run ZIP Association** button on the ZIP Viewer, to pass the File Name of the current Source file to the program Associated with .ZIP in File Manager. See Run ZIP Association.

The ZIP Viewer Dialog is not available when the Source File is anything other that *.ZIP.



NOTE: The contents of the dialog shown above is for display only, and may/may not reflect the files currently included with Easy Uploads.

Credit to **Paul Bonner** is due, for the code used to read the ZIP header. The nuts and bolts of the code was included as a part of his book/disk: <u>Visual Basic Utilities</u>, published by ZIFF Davis Printing/PC Magazine. I made a few changes to one of the dialogs, removed the full ZIP/UNZIP features, adapted it for my code, and it worked! **Thanks Paul**. I would have kept the ZIP/UNZIP features, but with so many good ZIP shells in Shareware, I didn't want to spend my time recreating the wheel (the code wasn't optimized for 2.04g's extra features, since it was published in '93, although the header remains the same). So instead, I added the Run ZIP Association feature, so EU can give you access to the functions of those really good "zip shells".

Forums

Select the Forums button/menu item to display the Forum Tracker dialog. See <u>Forum Tracker</u>.

Source File Name


Easy Uploads will display a standard Open dialog for you to use to specify the Source File that you want to Upload to CIS, just like the one in the Contribute dialog.

The Destination Name will be determined from the Source, and entered automatically.

NOTE: If Easy Uploads finds a file named: FILE_ID.DIZ (DIZ - Description in ZIP) in your Source directory, it will prompt you whether you want to read it in to the Description to give you a quick head start.

Forum Tracker

Press **F4**, select the **Forums** button, or the **Options|Forum Tracker...** menu item to display the Forum Tracker. After you Upload your file, be sure to add the Forum to its List! Forum Tracker makes it Easy to remember where to post your Upgrades!



Last Uploaded is a field where you can enter the date you last uploaded the file.

Add a Forum from the Master list (left) to your Upload List by:

Selecting a Forum and pressing Enter.

Selecting a Forum and pressing the **Add** -> button.

Double clicking on a Forum.

Once you've added a forum to your upload list, specify a **Library** for the Forum by entering the Library name in the text box. If you care to keep track, you can also enter the number of **Accesses** your upload has received.

NOTE: Pressing ENTER in the Accesses box automatically selects the next forum in your upload list, and highlights the current accesses to get ready to overwrite them. This makes it easy to run down the list with Num Lock, the Ten Key pad, and the Enter key. If the Accesses haven't changed, simply Press ENTER to go on to the next forum.

NOTE: The Library and Accesses entries are optional.

Remove a Forum from your Upload list (right) by:

Selecting a Forum and pressing Enter.

Selecting a Forum and pressing the <- Remove button.

Double clicking on a Forum.

To Add a **New Forum** to the Master list (left).

Select the **New Forum** button.

Enter some text to describe the Forum.

This can be anything that makes sense to you, since it won't be used in your Upload. Select OK.

The Forums for this Upload data is written to your Easy Uploads data file when you press the **Save** button. Press **Cancel** to abandon any changes.

NOTE: Adding New Forums to the Master list (left) is independent of the Upload list in terms of the Save button. New forums added to the Master list are saved immediately, and remain even if you select to Cancel changes to your Upload list.

NOTE: Currently there is a limit of 200 forums in the Master list. If anyone out there needs more, please contact me.

NEW! Easy Uploads Scripting for WinCIM, is almost here!

In recent weeks I've created an "auto-pilot" of sorts, for EU and WinCIM, and it's now in BETA with a few users who will take a shot at it! Many Thanks to the BETA testers! EU Scripting will be ALL point and click, with a listing of over 750 Forums (and their respective Libraries) to choose from! Simply select a Forum to GO to, an EU data file to use for the Upload, and the Library to post to, and you're all set! Select multiple files for a Forum, or select multiple Forums. Hopefully, the file you're reading now was uploaded with EU Scripting, since I'm taking the opportunity of EU v2.01, to be its first run with real uploads. The upload script will contain over 20 forums, and over 30 files, so wish me luck!

NOTE: Easy Uploads Scripting will be FREE to Registered Users! Unregistered Shareware users will be limited to 2 Forums per Script, with 3 Uploads per Forum (=6 uploads per script). *You can add as many Forums and Files as you like, but it will only upload as described above. The theoretical limit for Registered Users is over 1,500 uploads per Script!

Look for Easy Uploads Scripting in the coming weeks...
For now, take a look at what I've done for the newest version of Easy Uploads...

Defaults

Press F3, or select the Options|Defaults... menu item to display the Defaults dialog.

The Defaults dialog contains input boxes for you to specify the Paths to WinCIM and CSNav for the <u>Launch</u> feature, a Path to a Common Upload Directory for the File Name button, and other miscellaneous options.

Launch Paths

Select the appropriate Browse button to specify the FULL Path to WinCIM and CSNav. Easy Uploads comes set for the default directories in the respective Setup programs. Specifically:

C:\CSERVE\WINCIM\WINCIM.EXE C:\CSERVE\CSNAV\CSNAV.EXE

If you changed these directories when you installed either of these programs, then you will need to make the corresponding changes in the Easy Uploads Defaults dialog. Otherwise, you should be all set.

Once properly set, you can Launch a program by selecting it from the Options menu, or double-clicking on the appropriate option button.

Common Upload Directory Check box, and Path

Select the appropriate Browse button to specify the FULL Path to your Common Upload Directory. If you keep all your upload files in one directory, you can set the File Name dialog to start by listing the files in the "Common Upload Directory". Simply enable the check box, and select your path. If you've created a subdirectory to EASYUP for your upload files, and named it UPLOADS, then you'd select C:\EASYUP\UPLOADS as your common upload directory.

When the **Use Common Upload Directory** check box is Disabled, (or if you enter an invalid Path) the File Name dialog will start by listing the files in your Easy Uploads Directory.

WinCIM Language, and Contribute Dialog Title

Users of the English version of WinCIM should **NOT** change this option from "English/Library Contribute". This option has been added to make it possible for Easy Uploads to work with the German and French versions of WinCIM.

Users of the German version must change the option to: "German/eitrag an Bibliothek senden". Users of the French version must change the option to: "French/Soumettre un fichier".

Show Status Bar Check Box

Enable the check box to display the Status Bar, or Disable it to Hide the Status Bar.

Start Minimized Check Box

Enable the check box to start Easy Uploads as an icon (minimized), or Disable it to start normally.

Disable Screen Saver While Open

Enable the check box to disable the Windows Screen Saver while Easy Uploads is open. In monitoring the CIM Support forums, I have seen messages from CIM users, and Sysops which indicate that it's possible that a screen saver kicking in during an upload or download can cause problems. For this reason I have included the ability to disable it, to avoid this potential problem. This option is disabled by default, and you must enable it to utilize the functionality.

Important: Easy Uploads will reset your Screen Saver option to whatever it was BEFORE you opened EU, <u>as soon as you Exit EU</u> (minimizing EU does not reset the screen save option). So, if you want you

utilize this function, you MUST NOT Exit Easy Uploads, until you're ready to allow the screen saver to kick back in!

NOTE: Personally, I never use a screen saver, for this and other reasons. If you don't either, leave this check box <u>disabled</u>, and EU will Open and Exit 1-2 seconds faster than if it's enabled (that 1-2 seconds would be a waste, as it would never try to kick in anyway).

If you do use a screen saver, and have enabled this option, you will notice that EU will Open, and Exit 1-2 seconds slower than usual. Unfortunately, you can't just set the **ScreenSaveActive=** parameter in the WIN.INI file to 0 to disable it, but rather must use an API call that notifies ALL applications that a system setting has been changed, thus requiring the additional second or two.

Run ZIP Association

Press **F7**, select the <u>Upload|Run Zip Association</u>... menu item, or the <u>Run ZIP Association</u> button on the ZIP Viewer, to pass the File Name of the current Source file to the program <u>Associated</u> with "ZIP" in File Manager.

This feature is especially useful if you use a utility like WinZIP© to maintain your Upload Archives. With WinZIP©, and utilities like it, you can Add To, Delete From, and Temporarily Install, any Archive quickly and easily.

NOTE: The \underline{Run} ZIP Association button on the ZIP Viewer will actually display \underline{Run} , and then the actual Association found in your WIN.INI file.

For example:

```
If your ZIP Association in WIN.INI = C:\UTILITY\PKUNZIP.EXE, then the button reads:

Run C:\UTILITY\PKUNZIP.EXE...

OR

If your ZIP Association in WIN.INI = C:\WINZIP\WINZIP.EXE, then the button reads:

Run C:\WINZIP\WINZIP.EXE...
```

The ellipsis (...) indicates that EU will also pass the current EU File Name to the Associated program.

Note that the ZIP Association button/menu items are Disabled if there is no Association for ZIP in your WIN.INI file.

Associating Files In File Manager

When you associate a file with an application, you can open the file and start the application at the same time. If a file is associated with an application, there is a document-file icon next to the filename in the directory window. When you start File Manager, some files are already associated with applications.

To associate a file with an application in File Manager...

- 1 Select the name of the file you want to associate with an application. (Select any ZIP file)
- 2 From the File menu, choose Associate.
- In the Associate dialog box, select the application you want to associate with the file. If WinZIP is installed on your system, it's probably an option, otherwise, you may need to "Browse" for another Utility, or PKUNZIP. When Browsing, select the actual EXE file to Associate. e.g. C:\UTILITY\PKUNZIP.EXE
- 4 Choose the OK button.

For help with the Associate dialog box, choose the Help button or press F1 while using the dialog box in File Manager.

File Type

The File Type List allows you to select the type of file you're uploading. Select from: Binary, Text, GIF, JPEG, RLE* (*CSNav only)

Spell Checking via

If you're an MS Word, or Excel 5.x user, Easy Uploads can utilize its spell checker via OLE to Spell Check your Descriptions. Simply select the appropriate Spell Check button, and wait a few moments while EU communicates with Word/Excel, and then away you go. Use it just as you normally do.

NOTE: If Easy Uploads doesn't find Word and/or Excel on your system, the option(s) will be disabled, and you must copy your descriptions to another application to spell check.

You don't own Excel or Word?

If you're a CompuServe User, and of the mind, there's an excellant Freeware program called "Spell Checker for Edit Boxes" by Brian Quinion, which allows you to spell check data in any application's edit box. I've tried it, and it works with Easy Uploads' edit boxes (description, keywords, title). Mr. Quinion's description for his utility on CIS reads as follows:

Spell checker for edit boxes provides spelling checking from within any Windows edit box. 80,000+ word UK & US English dictionaries (UKENG.ZIP or USENG.ZIP - must be separately downloaded), custom dictionaries, undo, ignore all and a decent auto suggest are all available. Custom dictionaries may be disabled, or made read only, are fully editable and can be searched for suggestions. Works with any application which uses standard edit controls. This program will work with WinCIM, MS Access plus many others. Requires Windows 3.1. Freeware.

Nice job Brian!

You can find "Spell Checker for Edit Boxes" in the Windows Shareware Forum (GO WINSHARE) as **SPELL2.ZIP** (and the appropriate dictionary file: **UKENG.ZIP or USENG.ZIP**) in the Languages/Spell Check library. The program and english dictionary archives are 82K, and 335K respectively (417K total) for those watching their download time. You must download two files for this program to work (the program and a dictionary).

NOTE: I am in no way associated with Mr. Quinion, or "Spell Checker for Edit Boxes" (which holds all rights and responsibilities/support associated with the use of the program). I only share this with you to help make spell checking in Easy Uploads available to everyone. In fact, Excel and Word users may find this utility useful for other programs, as well as its being a little faster than the OLE methods I offer, since I have to start Word or Excel!

Save As DIZ

Select a Easy Uploads data file, and then choose <u>Save As DIZ...</u> (the DIZ button, or Ctrl+S) to create a DIZ file using the current Description. Easy Uploads will display a Save As DIZ dialog, starting with the directory where the ZIP is located. If you wish, you can select a different directory where the DIZ is to be saved, and then select OK. Easy Uploads will display some statistics about the file it's created, and open it with Notepad for you to edit or print if needed.

IMPORTANT: <u>Do NOT change the Filename!</u> Select the Directory only, and then OK. Easy Uploads automatically names your file, FILE_ID.DIZ; reducing the possibility of naming the file incorrectly. **If the file is not named FILE_ID.DIZ**, it will not be read by BBS software.

DIZ files (acronym for: Description In ZIP) provide BBS's using PC Board® bulletin board software, and users, a way to post consistent information about your files. The files contain a short description of the program that an author has written and archived with PKZIP®. When uploaded to a BBS using PC Board software, PC Board "looks" inside of the ZIPped file and reads the description in the FILE_ID.DIZ file and the description that the author has written is automatically displayed for users to read.

In most cases, you are the one uploading your file to a BBS, however, it you've given permission for users to further distribute, and upload to other BBS's, you can't always be sure what type of description they'll post for your files. When a file is posted by someone other than the author, a BBS can opt for using the info in the DIZ file for the file's description. This helps reduce the chance that you'll log onto a BBS someday and find your program with the description: "Really Cool Stuff", or with inaccurate and misleading statements.

FILE_ID.DIZ Format

The FILE_ID.DIZ file consists of straight ASCII text, up to 10 lines of text, each line being no more than 45 characters long. It should *NOT* contain any blank lines, any form of centering or formatting, or any Hi-ASCII or ANSI characters. (e.g. it should ONLY contain alpha & numeric characters).

Since you don't normally construct your Easy Uploads Description in DIZ format (with the Title in the Description) it is advised that you save your EU data file under a temporary name (e.g. FILE_ID.INI) and then modify it to fit the DIZ standard, before you create the DIZ file (I've create a single FILE_ID.INI file, and then save EVERY other EU data file over the top of it, when I want to create a DIZ file, to cut down on the clutter. However you certainly can create a DIZ formatted data file for each of your uploads if you choose.

The ASP recommends that the DIZ file consist of 5 basic parts:

- 1. The proper name of your program
- 2. The version number
- 3. The "ASP" identifier (optional, for ASP members)
- 4. The description separator
- 5. The description

All of the above parts should be separated by a single "space".

PROGRAM NAME: To set it apart from the rest, it is recommended that you use ALL CAPS for the program name.

VERSION NUMBER: The version number should be in the form of "v12.34".

ASP IDENTIFIER: If you are an ASP author, it is recommended that an "<ASP>" identifying mark be added after the version number, to identify your product as an ASP-authored product.

DESCRIPTION SEPARATOR: To separate the actual description text, insert a simple "-" (hyphen/minus) character after the ASP identifier (or version number, if not using the ASP identifier), and in front of the description text.

DESCRIPTION: You should attempt to FULLY describe your product, including its most important functions and features. Be sure to include anything which will separate your program from it's competition, and make the BBS user want to download your file. Also try to include any hardware or software requirements that your product may have.

You should try to use the first 2 lines of the text to give a basic description of your program. This is helpful for sysops who's BBS software limits them to less than 10 lines, 45 characters. Sysops who are limited to using shorter descriptions can simply use the 1st two lines and truncate the rest. Thus, you can basically still supply your own description for BBS software which does not actually utilize the FILE_ID.DIZ feature.

The remaining lines of text can be used to elaborate on the programs features, enhancements from the prior version, information concerning multi-file sets. Please note that older versions of some BBS software can only use 8 lines of text. It is advisable that you create your FILE_ID.DIZ file so that the file can be truncated to various line lengths without destroying it's usefulness.

Example DIZ File

EASY UPLOADS v2.00 - Save Time/\$ Uploading to CIS with WinCIM or CSNav. With Easy Uploads, just enter all the data for your uploads once, and then fill the Contribute dialog in WinCIM/CSNav in seconds, time after time! Whether you're on-line or off, EU is the best way to help insure consistent Titles, Keywords, and Descriptions for your files on CIS. Shareware - Requires WinCIM or CSNav, and VBRUN300.DLL

*It may look like line 3 could be wider, however remember that it's displayed here in a proportional font. If it were a "fixed width" font like Courier, it would line up more closely with the other lines.

IMPORTANT: If your description exceeds the 450 character limit, you will be warned that it will be truncated. Ifyour description is 450 characters or less, **you are not guaranteed** that it will all fit in a DIZ file. You'll note in the example above that line 1 is only 44 characters long since adding "CIS" would have made the line 48 characters (3 + a space after "to"), which is past the 45 character limit. So, after line 1, my maximum is down to 449, and lessens with each line that's under 45 characters. If you want to get as close to the 450 limit as you can, avoid using words with more than 5-6 characters, and carefully plan how the words are arranged. A little rearranging can often yield better results, and more words. For instance, a compound word like: "WinCIM/CSNav" is better having the slash "/" replaced with a space, or as "WinCIM and CSNav" if it's shows at the beginning of a line, so the first word can wrap back a line (if it begins a line as in line 5 above, and the previous line is almost full, or it falls in the middle of a line with word(s) following, it would obviously make no difference, until such time as a change in a previous line pushed it toward the end of the line......).

Status Bar

Simply move the mousepointer over any area of Easy Uploads and the Status Bar will display helpful information related to the current object under the mousepointer.

NOTE: This method does not work for dropdown lists (both File Types, and Library lists). To display status bar help for dropdown lists, select the list, or move the mousepointer over its accompanying text.

You can hide the Status Bar if you choose, by disabling its check box in the <u>Defaults</u> dialog.

Upload Time Estimate

Press **F11**, or select the <u>Upload|Time Estimate...</u> menu item to display the Estimate dialog, where Easy Uploads will ESTIMATE the time required to upload your file(s) (based on the total file size). Estimates are given for 2400, 9600, 14400, 19200, and 28800 Baud.

If you want to calculate the time required to upload more than one file, you can select multiple files in the list by holding the Control key, and clicking with the mouse (at present, multiple selection in the File list only applies to the time estimate, and printing).

Since there are many factors that can influence the *actual* time required to upload your file, I've included a Conversion Factor, so you can more accurately estimate the upload time based on how, when, and with what, *You* upload *Your* files.

Also included is the ability to calculate the Total time of multiple uploads of the file(s). Simply enter the number of times you're going to upload the file(s), and let Easy Uploads do the time math.

Finally, enter the \$/Hr. your BBS charges for access time to download files, and Easy Uploads will determine the total cost for your users, or for the download of the specified number of bytes (see below).

NOTE: The Conversion factor and \$/Hr. will be saved between sessions so you don't have to remember them.

Estimating Download Time

To estimate the download time for a specific number of bytes, select the Download check box, and enter the number of bytes. Deselecting the check box will revert the bytes, and associated Time/\$ to that of the upload for the specified file(s).

Search Forum Library



Select the Search Forum Define Search... menu item or use Ctrl+F to Define your Search.

NOTE: The Search Forum menu item is only available when CSNav is selected as the current 'Send To'. I've restricted it to CSNav since WinCIM holds your search request as you move between forums, and therefore this option would serve little or no use in WinCIM.

Why the Search Dialog?

Often times I find that I'd like to search many forums in my CSNav script for a particular Keyword, or File. As it was with the Contribute dialog, (before Easy Uploads) you're required to manually enter your search criteria for EACH forum in your script. Well, NO MORE! Now you can set your search criteria ONCE, and then fill in as many CSNav Search dialogs as you wish.

About the Search Dialog

The Easy Uploads 'Search Forum Library' dialog closely resembles CSNav's dialog, and should be "filled out" in the same manner, so I won't go into what's obvious. However, you'll notice a difference in that it does not contain Library selections, and adds two new option buttons. I don't include the Library selection list since I seriously doubt whether a single set of selections would work with all forums as you go from one to the next, and would venture that most people simply choose to select All libraries for inclusion in the search, to cover all bases. Although there are instances where the search needs to be narrowed, and hence the two option buttons which are described below.

Using the Search Dialog

Simply enter your search criteria as you would in CSNav, and select OK to have it held in memory for the current session. Then, when you want to fill out a Search dialog, simply select the Search Library... button in your script for the proper forum, and after it's up, tell EU to send your criteria. This is the same methodology as Contributing files in that YOU must first get the dialog open, and then have Easy Uploads send the data.

You can send search data from the Search Forum menu, or press F12 while Easy Uploads is maximized, or I've also included an item in the control menu for sending search data while Easy Uploads is minimized. Either way, you must first open the dialog yourself. Once sent, Easy Uploads will do one of two things, depending on your selection of the following options.

Close Search Dialog When Done

Select this option to have EU enter your search criteria, and then automatically select OK to close the dialog. This option therefore leaves ALL Libraries selected, as they are when the dialog first appears.

Leave Search Dialog Open When Done

Select this option to have EU enter your search criteria, and then leave the Search dialog open, so you can individually select libraries for inclusion/exclusion in your search. You must then manually close the Search dialog by selecting OK.



Select File|VBFile Stamper... or press Ctrl+T to open VBFile Stamper...

As a compliment to Easy Uploads, I've created a Freeware utility to Date and Time Stamp files in Windows, called VBFile Stamper. Even if you never use Easy Uploads again, you're free to continue using this Free utility.

Date/Time stamping is useful as "fake" version control for your files. VB Programmers cannot embed version information in their executable, and oftentimes date and time stamp their files as the next best thing.

For more information on VBFile Stamper see: <u>VBFile Stamper Help</u> (select the <u>Back</u> button when you're finished).

Finding VBFile Stamper

NOTE: If you've downloaded "**Easy Uploads Pro**", then you already have VBFile Stamper. If not, and you want it, you'll need to download it separately. Search the forum where you got Easy Uploads for VBFSTP.ZIP, and unzip it to your Easy Uploads directory. It must be in your Easy Uploads directory for the menu item and shortcut keys to work properly.

Custom Signatures

You can define Generic, and Time Estimate Custom Signatures for your Easy Uploads Descriptions. Select **Options|Custom Signature...** to display the definition dialog. Once defined, simply place the cursor in your Description where you want the signature pasted, and then select the appropriate signature button.

A Generic Signature is anything you repeatedly enter to your Description, and would be easier paste with a click of the mouse.

NOTE: If you want linefeeds before your Signature, add the linefeed symbol to your Signature definition. e.g. [..]Copyright 1995 by P. Scott Antony.[.]All Rights Reserved. will come out as:

end of last paragraph

Copyright 1995 by P. Scott Antony. All Rights Reserved.

A Time Estimate Signature is a combination of your text, and codes for the different baud rates.

Use the # symbol surrounding the baud rate to denote where you want Easy Uploads to enter the Time Estimate. Your text, and the estimated times will be pasted to your Description.

The Default Signature is: [..]DL(2400) #2400# DL(9600) #9600# DL(14400) #14400# DL(19200) #19200# DL(28800) #28800#.

Which, for my last version of Easy Uploads, at 271,608 Bytes, would produce:

end of last paragraph

DL(2400) 18:53 DL(9600) 04:43 DL(14400) 03:10 DL(19200) 02:22 DL(28800) 01:34

You can see where the baud rates were enclosed in # symbols, there's now the estimated time.

NOTE: If you change the Signature, you can regain the Default by clearing the signature, and closing the dialog (select OK). Then Open the dialog again, and the default will be back.

Another Time Estimate Signatures might look like:

[..]Estimated Download: #2400#/#9600# @ 2400/9600 Baud.

Which would result in:

end of last paragraph

Estimated Download: 18:53/04:43 @ 2400/9600 Baud.

Experiment, and see what looks best to you!

ATO Script File

Easy Uploads will now create Script Files for ATO (AutoSig) Users. Simply select one or more EU Data Files in the list, and select **Upload|ATO Script File...** (or **Ctrl+F5**).

NOTE: EU will warn you if your Descriptions exceed the 6*60 (360) character limit.

When complete, you will have a fully commented file like the following. Many features are REMed (*) out so you can use your own scripts to get logged on, etc. and then just invoke the script when you want to upload. However, if you wish to have it logon, and GO to a Forum, then remove the asterisks (*) from the line you wish to use, and modify it appropriately.

A GO section is provided before EACH upload so they can go to different Forums. If they're all going to the same forum, then just modify the first GO if you wish, and leave the others disabled. If they're going to multiple Forums, be sure to properly enter the GO word for EACH Forum, and adjust EACH Library Number!

At the end of the script is a Disabled Logoff. If you want to Logoff after the upload, then remove the asterisks (*) from the lines. (Any word-wrap that may be displayed below is unintentional, and will not be present in the script).
