





The Devil gave a sudden leap Rod struck Miss Squill all of a heap.




He swooped her up from off the ground Rod twirled her madly round and round.




That night she saw when she undressed His mark was burned upon her breast.



Next day flew in her open door R creature named Beëlphazoar.




It brought a recipe for fudge of pounded pencil-stubs and sludge.

Her laugh made beetles swoon; her frown Made geese and cows turn upside down.




She did her neighbours' forms in wax and stuck them full of pins and tacks.

She got from somewhere stones with eyes and plants that gave out screams and sighs.




But then the demon, much too soon, returned one Sunday afternoon.
