<b>D-Day</b>	6 June 1944, the date of the Allied invasion of Normandy, France, during World War II
<b>D-day</b>	the execution date of any military operation
<b>DOD</b>	Department of Defense
<b>DOTLMS</b>	doctrine, training, leader development, organization, materiel, and soldiers
<b>DPP</b>	deferred payment plan

<b>ECAS</b>	ethical climate assessment survey
<b>ed.</b>	editor, edition
<b>EFMB</b>	Expert Field Medical Badge
<b>EO</b>	equal opportunity
<b>ETO</b>	European Theater of Operations (used during World War II)
<b>EUCOM</b>	United States European Command
<b>FM</b>	field manual
<b>GA</b>	General of the Army
<b>GEN</b>	general
<b>GI</b>	general issue (refers to equipment; sometimes used during World War II to refer to soldiers)
<b>GTA</b>	graphic training aid
<b>HQ</b>	headquarters
<b>HQDA</b>	Headquarters, Department of the Army
<b>Humvee</b>	phonetic spelling of the acronym HMMWV, high-mobility, multipurpose wheeled vehicle
<b>IFOR</b>	the NATO Implementation Force sent to Bosnia to implement the 1995 Dayton peace accords
<b>IPR</b>	in-process review
<b>JOPEs</b>	Joint Operation Planning and Execution System
<b>JP</b>	Joint Publication
<b>JSPS</b>	Joint Strategic Planning System
<b>JTF</b>	joint task force
<b>LDRSHIP</b>	an aid for remembering Army values (loyalty, duty, respect, selfless service, honor, integrity, personal courage)
<b>LTC</b>	lieutenant colonel
<b>LTG</b>	lieutenant general
<b>MAJ</b>	major
<b>MDMP</b>	military decision-making process
<b>METL</b>	mission essential task list
<b>METT-TC</b>	mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops, time available, civil considerations (in tactics, the major factors considered during mission analysis)
<b>MOS</b>	military occupational specialty
<b>MOUT</b>	military operations on urbanized terrain
<b>NATO</b>	North Atlantic Treaty Organization
<b>NCO</b>	noncommissioned officer
<b>NCODP</b>	noncommissioned officer development program (used to designate either a unit program or training conducted as part of that program)
<b>NCOER</b>	noncommissioned officer evaluation report

<b>NCOERS</b>	Noncommissioned Officer Evaluation Reporting System
<b>OCOKA</b>	observation, concealment, obstacles, key terrain, and avenues of approach (in tactics, the military aspects of terrain considered during a mission analysis)
<b>OER</b>	officer evaluation report
<b>OERS</b>	Officer Evaluation Reporting System
<b>OPTEMPO</b>	operational tempo
<b>PMCS</b>	preventive maintenance checks and services
<b>PPBS</b>	Planning, Programming and Budgeting System
<b>PT</b>	physical training
<b>PVT</b>	private
<b>PW</b>	prisoner of war
<b>PX</b>	post exchange
<b>QM</b>	quartermaster
<b>R&amp;R</b>	rest and recuperation
<b>ROE</b>	rules of engagement
<b>RPG</b>	rocket propelled grenade (a man-portable, single-shot, antitank rocket)
<b>SFC</b>	sergeant first class
<b>SGT</b>	sergeant
<b>SHAEF</b>	Supreme Headquarters, Allied Expeditionary Force (the highest Allied headquarters in the ETO during World War II)
<b>SIDPERS</b>	Standard Installation/Division Personnel System
<b>SJA</b>	staff judge advocate
<b>SOP</b>	standing operating procedures
<b>SSG</b>	staff sergeant
<b>TAPES</b>	Total Army Performance Evaluation System (the system used to evaluate DA civilians' performance)
<b>TLP</b>	troop leading procedures
<b>TOC</b>	tactical operations center
<b>TOW</b>	tube-launched, optically-tracked, wire-guided (refers to the Army's heavy, antitank missile system)
<b>UCMJ</b>	Uniform Code of Military Justice
<b>UN</b>	United Nations
<b>US</b>	United States
<b>USAREUR</b>	United States Army, Europe
<b>USC</b>	United States Code
<b>USR</b>	unit status report (also called the "2715 report"; a report of unit personnel, equipment, training and overall readiness submitted monthly by active component units and quarterly by reserve component units)
