Federal, State and Local Contracts

The Government Contract Acquisition Program (GCAP) can assist Oregon businesses in finding out about contract opportunities as well as about pursuing them. Through a computer matching service, the program can search bidding opportunities posted daily by every federal agency in the country. Contract leads that match the goods or services of an Oregon business can be faxed or mailed to the business that same day. Other potential contract sources also are available, including international, state and local government contract opportunities.

In addition, staff provide technical assistance to businesses operating in the government arena. This includes hands-on counseling and training in every aspect of doing business with government entities—for example, proposals, bidding, payment, electronic data interchange and disputes.

The Oregon Department of Agriculture works with grower/producer marketing groups, cooperatives and processors to provide information on marketing agricultural products overseas; it also helps to develop marketing strategies and to identify potential overseas customers. The department organizes and leads overseas agricultural trade missions and hosts incoming foreign business delegations. It works with U.S. and foreign governments to eliminate tariff and non-tariff barriers adversely affecting sales of Oregon agricultural products.
