Events

We have two national events coming up which I would like to bring to your attention:

Benchmarking and the New Method for Academic Review

Tuesday, September 11th, 2001, University of York

The programme and registration form will be present as an insert within all the Bulletins delivered to you (and can also be found on our website under Events). In the morning, Prof. Gus Pennington, HESDA, will be running an interactive session focussing on this new method for academic review. Feedback from colleagues at previous dialogue sessions indicate that this will be an interesting and stimulating discussion. After lunch, members of the two subject benchmarking panels (Bioscience, or Agriculture, Forestry, Agricultural and Food Sciences) will lead a discussion on the implications of subject benchmarking for our community. This will provide a timely opportunity to give feedback to the panel whilst they are still in the consultation stage. For those with a more general interest in benchmarking, Prof. Pennington will be our guide through the current progress on subject benchmarking across the HE sector. Cost is £25 (including lunch).

Enhancing Bioscience Student Learning Through C&IT

Tuesday 25th September, 2001, University of Bristol

A one-day seminar on the theme of using C&IT to enhance student learning. The workshops and presentations will cover: using IT for study support. IT for lecture delivery and the use of images in biology education. The full programme will be available soon. Registration is free of charge and can be completed on-line.

• Special Interest Groups (SIGs)- Call for Co-ordinators

Discussion with our community during our regional workshops has underlined the desire for the development of Special Interest Groups, allowing members the chance to discuss, identify and swap innovative ideas, problems and good practices that will be beneficial to the wider community as well as to members of that group. Each SIG will have a Co-ordinator who will facilitate and co-ordinate activities carried out by the group. LTSN Bioscience will provide admin. and organisational support, exchange and circulation of reference material, support of communication networks and dissemination of information and results. A renumeration will be made available to the Co-ordinator to allow the individual to attend a conference of their choice.

At this stage we invite proposals for SIG topics under the general headings of: **Assessment, Problem Based Learning, Practical Classes** and **Ethics.** Suggestions for other topics for future rounds of proposals are welcomed. • Call for Discipline Consultants
