The competition is open to all UK higher education students (both undergraduate and postgraduate) in a pure or applied biological science. Entries are limited to one per student and must be the original work of the student submitting the essay.

Essays will be judged against the following criteria and will:

- be entertaining and interesting to read
- be well written in terms of structure, grammar and spelling
- not exceed the 1,000 word length (by 10% either way)
- be submitted on this application form in electronic format
