# Evaluating the impact of innovations in assessment

## Two one-day Workshops:

- Loughborough, 4<sup>th</sup> December 2003
- Newcastle, 8<sup>th</sup> December 2003

Facilitator: Professor Graham Gibbs, Open University

#### **Purpose**

This workshop is for those Science teachers who have introduced changes to the assessment of their courses, or are about to, and who want to know if they 'work' or what impact they have had. The workshop has a practical goal: that all participants leave with a workable evaluation plan they feel confident about implementing. For this reason, each workshop is limited to eight participants.

The workshop will have seven phases.

### Before the workshop

1. Those registered will email Graham Gibbs a brief description of their assessment innovation and what they hope it will achieve. These descriptions will help Graham Gibbs to prepare relevant examples of how to evaluate such innovations.

These pre-workshop notes will be summarised and distributed so that participants can see if others have similar concerns.

#### At the workshop

- 2. At the start of the workshop, Graham will summarise a variety of ways in which assessment innovations have been evaluated in the past (from the literature) and also in the FAST Project (http://www.open.ac.uk/science/fdtl/) and participants will be able to discuss key issues such as:
  - Can you trust what students tell you?
  - Are questionnaires reliable?
  - Can you use exam results as a measure of learning?
  - What well established measurement instruments/tools already exist?
  - How would you develop your own questionnaire?
    - .....in the light of examples
- 3. Participants will articulate what they are really interested in finding out and turn this into "researchable questions".
- 4. Participants will draw up 'first draft' outline evaluation plans and present them on posters for discussion and suggestions for improvement.
- 5. Participants will revise and develop plans so as to leave with a fairly full second draft.

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#### After the workshop

- 6. These second drafts will be tidied and sent to Graham Gibbs for mounting on the SIG website for the benefit of others planning evaluation.
- 7. The FAST project will be able to support participants in their evaluations with visits, advice, processing of questionnaires, etc the form of support can be negotiated. Funding is also available from FAST to cover expenses incurred in carrying out evaluations.

One year later (Autumn 2004)

8. A meeting will be reconvened to share the outcomes of evaluations conducted by participants.

#### Costs

- 1. There is no fee for the workshop (FAST will cover costs of the meeting room, lunch, refreshments)
- 2. Participants travelling costs and subsistence will be reimbursed by the FAST Project.
