- 512MB의 실제 RAM(1GB 권장)
- 2GB의 사용 가능한 디스크 공간(이상 권장)
- 800x600 화면 해상도(1024x768 이상 권장)

SUSE Linux Enterprise Server 설치

컴퓨터에 기존 Linux 시스템이 없거나 기존 Linux 시스템을 교체하려면 이 지침을 사용하십시오.

1. 드라이브에 SUSE Linux Enterprise Server DVD를 넣은 다음 컴퓨터를 재부팅하여 설치 프로그램을 시작합니 다.



2. 부팅 화면의 설치를 선택한 다음 Enter 키를 누릅니다. SUSE Linux Enterprise Server 설치 프로그램이 로드되 고 표준 모드에서 설치가 시작됩니다.



- 3. 설치 중에 그리고 설치된 시스템에서 사용할 언어를 선택합니다.
- 4. 사용권 계약을 읽고 *동의함*을 클릭합니다. *다음*을 눌러 계속합니다.



5. *새로운 설치*를 수행할지 또는 SUSE Linux Enterprise Server의 이전 버전에서 업데이트할지 여부를 결정합니다. *다음*을 눌러 계속합니다.



시스템에서 사용할 시간 및 시간대를 선택합니다. 다음을 눌러 계속합니다.




7. 실제 시스템에 기본 운영 체제로 설치할지, 가상 시스템을 선택하여 XEN 시스템의 가상 호스트로 설치할지 또는 XEN 가상 호스트 옵션을 사용하여 다른 가상 시스템을 실행할 수 있는 가상 호스트로 설치할지 여부를 결정합니다. 다음을 눌러 계속합니다.



8. 설치 설정 화면을 통해 제안된 여러 설치 및 파티셔닝 옵션을 확인한 다음 필요한 경우 원하는 옵션을 변경 합니다.

개요 탭에는 대부분의 일반적인 설치에서 수동 작업이 가끔 필요한 기본 옵션이 있습니다. 고급 탭에는 고급 구성 옵션이 있습니다.

9. 동의를 클릭하여 사용권 계약에 동의합니다.



10. 설치를 눌러 설치를 시작합니다.

기본 시스템 설치 및 선택한 모든 소프트웨어 패키지 설치를 완료했으면 SUSE Linux Enterprise Server 설치 가 새 Linux 시스템으로 부팅됩니다. 재부팅 후에 다 음 화면이 나타납니다.



11. 시스템 관리자 계정(root 사용자)의 비밀번호를 입력합니다.

root 비밀번호를 반드시 기억해야 합니다. 입력한 후에는 비밀번호를 확인할 수 없습니다. 관리자만 비밀번호를 재설정할 수 있습니다. *다음*을 눌러 계속합니다.



12. 이 컴퓨터 및 컴퓨터가 속하는 DNS 도메인 이름을 입력합니다. *다음*을 눌러 계속합니다.



13. 네트워크 구성 화면에서 시스템의 네트워크 연결을 보거나 변경합니다.

네트워크 장치(예: 네트워크 또는 무선 카드, DSL 연결, ISDN 어댑터 또는 모뎀)가 있는 경우 인터넷 연결을 통해 SUSE Linux Enterprise Server가 사용 가능한 업데이트를 가져오고 설치 중에 업데이트를 포함할수 있으므로 지금 장치를 구성하는 것이 좋습니다. 다음을 눌러 계속합니다.



- 14. 예, 인터넷에 시험 접속합니다를 통해 인터넷 연결을 테스트합니다. 이 옵션을 사용하면 최신 SUSE Linux Enterprise Server의 릴리스 정보도 확인할 수 있습니다. 다음을 눌러 계속합니다.
- 15. 실행 중인 인터넷 연결 테스트 화면의 테스트 결과가 표시됩니다. *다음*을 눌러 계속합니다.



16. Novell 고객 센터 구성 화면에서 *지금 구성 > 다음 >* 계속을 클릭하여 시스템을 온라인으로 업데이트할 수 있습니다.

*나중에 구성 > 다음*을 클릭하여 이 단계를 건너뛰고 설치를 계속합니다. 제품을 설치한 후에 이 옵션을 구 성할 수 있습니다. *다음*을 눌러 계속합니다.



17. SUSE Linux Enterprise Server는 기본적으로 시스템 인 증서를 생성합니다. 인증서를 사용 불가능으로 설정 하려면 *구성 건너뛰기* > *다음*을 클릭합니다. *다음*을 눌러 계속합니다.



18. 시스템 관리자가 지시하지 않은 경우 사용자 인증 방법 화면의 *로컬(/etc/passwd)*을 선택합니다. *다음*을 눌러 계속합니다.



19. *사용자의 전체 이름* 필드에 이름 및 성을 입력하고 *사용자 이름* 필드에 로그인 이름을 입력한 다음 *비밀번 호* 필드에 비밀번호(시스템 관리자가 권장)를 입력합니다.

보안 상의 이유로 비밀번호는 8자 이상이어야 하며 대소문자와 숫자를 모두 포함해야 합니다. 비밀번호 의 최대 길이는 72자이고 대소문자를 구분합니다. *다* 음을 눌러 계속합니다.



20. 시스템 구성이 완료되면 릴리스 정보가 표시됩니다. 다음을 눌러 계속합니다.



21. 하드웨어 구성 화면을 통해 그래픽 카드 및 기타 하드 웨어 장치를 확인합니다. *다음*을 눌러 계속합니다.



- 22. 설치 성공 화면에서 *마침*을 클릭하여 SUSE Linux Enterprise Server 설치 화면을 닫고 로그인 화면으로 계속합니다.
- 23. 사용자 이름을 입력하고 *비밀번호* 필드에 비밀번호를 입력한 후 Enter 키를 누릅니다.
