IA. ANALYSIS OF SOLAR ACTIVE REGIONS AND ACTIVITY FROM 14/2100
TO 15/2100Z: SOLAR ACTIVITY WAS AT A LOW LEVEL DURING THE PAST
24 HOURS. REGION 4481 (N07W43) IS BECOMING LESS AND LESS OF A
THREAT AS DECAY CONTINUES AND THE MAGNETIC GRADIENTS RELAX MORE
AND MORE. REGION 4490 (S15E57) RECENTLY BECAME A FLARE PRODUCER
HAVING THREE SUBFAINTS TO ITS CREDIT SO FAR TODAY. THE OTHER
VISIBLE REGIONS REMAIN BASICALLY QUIET. TWO OLD PLAGES, 4487
(S14E20) AND 4489 (S17E14), HAVE REGAINED THEIR SPOTS.

IB. SOLAR ACTIVITY FORECAST: SOLAR ACTIVITY SHOULD REMAIN AT A
LOW LEVEL WITH THE POSSIBILITY OF ISOLATED ENERGETIC ACTIVITY
FROM 4481. OLD REGION 4474, WHICH WAS QUITE ACTIVE ON ITS LAST
TRANSIT, IS DUE BACK ON THE VISIBLE DISK BY 18 MAY.

IIA. GEOPHYSICAL ACTIVITY SUMMARY FROM 14/2100Z TO 15/2100Z:
THE GEOMAGNETIC FIELD HAS BEEN UNSETTLED TO ACTIVE.

IIB. GEOPHYSICAL ACTIVITY FORECAST: THE GEOMAGNETIC FIELD IS
EXPECTED TO BE UNSETTLED TO ACTIVE THRU 17 MAY AND THEN
UNSETTLED.
