ISSUED 2200Z 27 JUN 1984

IA. ANALYSIS OF SOLAR ACTIVE REGIONS AND ACTIVITY FROM 26/2100  
TO 27/2100Z: SOLAR ACTIVITY HAS BEEN LOW. NO OPTICAL FLARES WERE  
REPORTED. THE ONLY EVENT WAS A C4 AT 1813Z (X-RAY MAX). NO  
FLARE WAS OBSERVED AT THIS TIME. AT 1824Z, BOULDER OBSERVED A  
SPRAY TYPE FEATURE NEAR NE20. AT THIS TIME, NO PORTION OF THE  
MATERIAL WAS IN EVENT EMISSION. MAUNA LOA OBSERVATORY REPORTED  
AN ERUPTIVE PROMINENCE AT POSITION ANGLE 070 DEGREES BETWEEN  
1810-1850Z. ENHANCEMENT WAS SEEN MOVING THROUGH THE CORONA.  
REGION 4520 (S15W57) CONTINUES A SLOW DECAY. REGION 4524  
(S13W38) HAS EMERGED TODAY.

IB. SOLAR ACTIVITY FORECAST: SOLAR ACTIVITY IS EXPECTED TO BE  
LOW; HOWEVER, THIS MAY INCREASE IF A NEW ACTIVE REGION ROTATES  
ON TO THE DISK DURING THE NEXT 24 HOURS.

IIA. GEOPHYSICAL ACTIVITY SUMMARY FROM 26/2100Z TO 27/2100Z:  
THE GEOMAGNETIC FIELD WAS UNSETTLED TO ACTIVE AT MID LATITUDES.  
AURORAL OVAL STATIONS HAD STORM LEVELS BETWEEN 0000-0600Z.

IIB. GEOPHYSICAL ACTIVITY FORECAST: THE GEOMAGNETIC FIELD IS  
EXPECTED TO BE UNSETTLED TO SLIGHTLY ACTIVE ON 28-29 JUNE WITH  
ACTIVE FIELD CONDITIONS EXPECTED ON 30 JUNE.
