New Explorer File Dialogs of Windows 95

This version of Instant File Access **does not** work with the new file dialogs of Windows 95. However, IFA does work with the file dialogs of Windows 3.1x applications running under Windows 95, and lets you see long file names in those file dialogs.

Registering IFA

Registering Instant File Access can be done in 4 ways:

1. Double click on **Registration Form** in your IFA program

manager group.

Fill out and print REGISTER.WRI.

Read CREDIT.WRI for information on registering by Credit

Card.

4. Use the **Shareware Registration Service** (GO SWREG) on

CompuServe.

Registered users will NOT receive a printed manual, as this is harmful to the environment, and is not needed since on-line help documents all aspects of the application. Registered users WILL receive notice of updates and bug fixes as they become available. Registered users will also receive notice of future products from Alexoft.

Using Instant File Access with Word and Excel

When using Instant File Access to save files in Word version 2 or 6, or Excel version 5, you can only save documents of the type shown in the "Files of type:" combo box. Only DOC files can be saved in Word, and XLS in Excel. This is due to the way Word and Excel handle their file dialogs.

The best way to avoid this problem is to configure All To Common to place a small button beside the Save dialog. When clicked, this button will activate an IFA dialog which will appear over top of the Word or Excel file dialog. Enter the desired file name along with its file type, then press OK. This will place the DOS name into the filename field of the Word or Excel file dialog. You can now select the desired file type from the Word or Excel file dialog and click OK. Unfortunately, this is not a very clean way of doing things, but at least it's better than nothing.

Reporting Bugs

Please send all bug reports to Alexoft at any of the addresses above. Please include as much information on the bug as possible. It is a great help if you run **DRWATSON.EXE** when you start Windows. This application will trap General Protection Faults and write a log file, enabling us to find exactly where the problem occurred. Please mail the **DRWATSON.LOG** file along with your bug report.
