- I thought that you all might be interested in some of the comments I've received from versions 1.0 and 1.1 of The Dumpster, so here they are:
- C: The Icon seems to be too large sometimes.
- A: The Dumpster icons are standard size. You can, however, switch to a higher video mode, such as 800x600, and have more desktop space.
- C: I don't like the fact that the icon is always visible. It shows through all applications, even if I don't want it to!
- A: I agree! Since version 1.1, The Dumpster includes a switch in the Preferences menu item that you can use to turn off the "always on top" feature. You asked for it, you got it!
- C: The price is excellent! How can you sell it this cheap?
- A: Unlike the competition, I don't assume that just because you're running Windows, you can automatically afford to spend lots of money for a small utility.
- C: I really want two icons for the program one that shows The Dumpster empty, and another that only displays when there are files in the hold area.
- C: I want to know when The Dumpster is deleting files. Maybe it should beep or something.
- A: Ok, you talked me into it. Now there's not one, not two, but three icons included in The Dumpster. The first icon is an empty trash barrel. The second icon is the same barrel with "trash" in it. And the third icon has flames shooting out of the top of the barrel whenever a file is deleted.
- C: Why does The Dumpster icon look like a trash barrel instead of a dumpster?
- A: I've only seen flames shooting out of a dumpster once, and it wasn't a pretty sight! Seriously, I like the barrel.
- C: How about adding support for deleting entire subdirectories?
- A: The Dumpster works the sized and timed deletion by first placing the filenames into the Dumpster.ini file and then marking the files "read-only" until the time or size for deletion is reached. Hiding entire subdirectories gets messy and confuses some users. I've had both versions tested and this one won hands down with the testers. However, if I receive enough comments requesting this feature, or any of the others mentioned above, I will change it for you. The majority rules!
