Expert Image Browser Overview

Expert Image Browser allows you to view up to 18 thumbnail images contained on the CD-ROM disk at one time on the screen. Images are organized by categories which can be selected from the main screen. You can preview a full-size version of any image by clicking on the appropriate button. If you wish to use the selected image in another application, the browser allows you to cut the image and then paste it into another program.

NOTE: The images included in your disk are provided in a variety of different formats. The images you can view in Expert Image Browser are in PCX format and are in 256 colors. If you need higher resolution images, please refer to the documentation that came with your disk to see what other formats and resolution images are included in the CD.

Using the Expert Image Browser

- 1. When you first load the Image Browser, a screen will appear listing the names of all the categories available. Click on the desired category name, or use the RED arrow keys to view other available categories.
- 2. Once you make your category selection, a Thumbnail Album will appear containing thumbnails of all the images in that category. You can click on the **BLUE** arrow keys to view more pages.
- **3.** Select an image by clicking on it once. A highlight square will appear to indicate that it has been selected. You can click on the **DISPLAY** button, or double-click on the thumbnail to see a full screen preview of the image.
- **4.** Use the **GREEN** arrow keys to view other images in that category. If you wish to copy the selected image to another application, click on the **COPY** button. This will place the image in the Windows Clipboard.
- **5.** Once the image is in memory, you can Paste it into your new application, or, if you wish to view it, you may do so with the Windows Clipboard Viewer application.
- **6.** Clicking on the **RETURN** button will take you back to the Image Thumbnails screen.
- **7**. Pressing the **EXIT** button will close the program and return you to Windows.

Browser Contents

The Browser Contents screen lets you see all the image Categories available on the CD.

- Click on the desired **CATEGORY NAME** to go to the Image Thumbnails screen where you can view image representations of the images contained in that category.
- ▶ Click on the **RED** arrow buttons to see more categories. The right arrow button will show you the next Contents page and the left arrow button will show you the previous Contents page.
- ▶ Click on the **HELP** button to bring up this Microsoft Help File.
- Click on the ABOUT button to see a credits and information screen.
- ▶ Click on the **EXIT** button to close the Expert Image Browser program and return to Windows.

Image Thumbnails

The Image Thumbnails screen lets you view up to 18 different thumbnail representations of the selected category's contents.

- Click on an image to select it. A blue selection square will appear over the thumbnail image to indicate that it has been selected. Double-click on it to see a full-screen preview.
- Click on the DISPLAY button to see a full-screen preview of the selected image.
- Click on the **RED** arrow buttons to see more thumbnail images contained in that category. The right arrow button will show you the next Image Thumbnails page and the left arrow button will show you the previous Image Thumbnail page.
- Click on the **BLUE** arrow buttons at the bottom of the screen to see Image Thumbnails for another category. The right arrow button will show you Image Thumbnails for the next Category and the left arrow button will show you Image Thumbnails for the the previous Category.
- Click on the HELP button to bring up this Microsoft Help File.
- Click on the ABOUT button to see a credits and information screen.
- ▶ Click on the **EXIT** button to close the Expert Image Browser program and return to Windows.

Full-Size Preview

The Full-Size Preview screen will display the actual image that has been selected from the Image Thumbnails screen.

- Click on the **GREEN** arrow keys to view full-screen previews of other images in the selected category. The right arrow button will display the next image and the left button will display the previous image.
- Click on the **COPY** button if you wish to place the selected image into the Windows Clipboard. Once the selected image has been copied to the clipboard, it can be pasted into another application.
- ▶ Click on the **RETURN** button to return to the Image Thumbnails screen.

Using Expert Images in Other Programs

Expert Image Browser allows you to place selected images in to the Window Clipboard where they can be pasted into other applications.

- When you select the full-screen preview feature, clicking on the **COPY** button will take the original image from the CD and place it into memory.
- Open your destination application's program window.
- Select the **PASTE** option from your destination program. This option should be available in any graphics or word-processing program in the **EDIT** menu.

Note: when you use copy, the entire original image is copied into the clipboard. Be sure you have enough RAM to support this action.
