What is a topical Bible? Yes, I have been asked this very question. I was surprised to find that many people are not familiar with topical Bibles. A topical Bible is one of the most useful tools ever compiled for Bible study. The idea is quite simple. You can create your own topical Bible. Its that easy. This is what you do. Think of a subject that the Bible deals with, any subject, like for example prayer. Write the word prayer at the top of a clean sheet of paper. Now read through the Bible, Genesis to Revelation, and copy every verse or passage that deals with prayer onto your paper. Make sure you keep the verses in canonical order. They just let the scripture speak for itself. Where interpretation creeps in is in the choice of verses. Two different topical Bibles on the same subject may have different lists of verses. Thats also a good reason to obtain more than one. Topical Bibles are great time savers. Their even better on computers. On a computer the topical Bible is more useful than was ever possible in print. A computerized topical Bible like the Logos module Naves Topical Bible has all the verse references without being tied to a particular text. 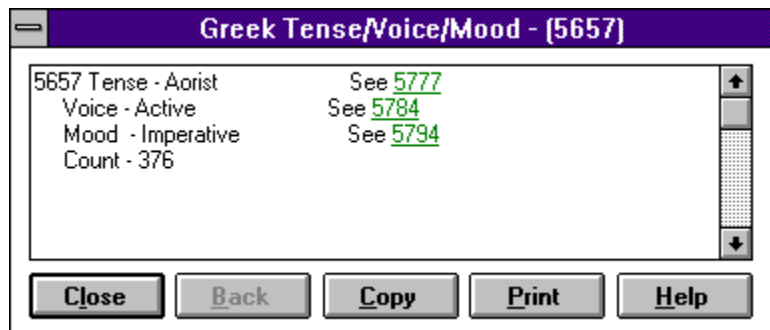

Why does Logos offer four different Greek texts? The reasons may or may not be familiar to you. It all revolves around the issue of the missing Autographs.

Following along this idea I decided to use the projection panel to do real live Bible teaching with audience participation. The result was that I taught a quarter of Sunday School using the computer and allowing group participation. This gave me some real first-hand experience using the tool in public. These are my results:

1. The group loves to work with the computer program.
2. The group can use the computer to chase rabbits and get off the subject.
3. As we used reference works like the Hebrew/English Dictionary, Strongs numbers and Naves Topical Bible I became aware that this was a first time experience for many people who never had bothered to learn how to use these books effectively.
4. We found that group-based note taking is a very effective tool for keeping people together in synchronization.
5. We found that most people never stray from their favorite text and the experience was great for exposing them to various texts. Logos encouraged a new interest in comparative study.
6. We found the entire exercise gave people a new respect for the Word of God.
7. We found that it takes a different kind of preparation to be able handle the rapid give and take and not to loose sight of the lesson plan.
8. We found the response very enthusiastic and a general desire to continue.

Logos is a library of totally integrated Bible study tools written for Microsoft Windows. Logos Bible Software represents a learning system revolving around a core retrieval and display engine. The next step in this process for Westminster began in 1987 and was again under the direction of Professor Groves. This time he and his staff began to develop a morphological text for the electronic Hebrew Bible, providing morphological

identification of every Hebrew word. This project was completed in another four years and will soon be incorporated into the Logos product lineup.

Future plans for the Westminster Computer Center

Presently Professor Groves is developing data for a syntactical analysis of the Hebrew Bible. This work has launched Westminster from its original project oriented approach to a vision of an expanded center for computerized Biblical studies with an international array of participants. This project will incorporate the study of the Bible on computer with current scholarship in hermeneutical fields of study such as discourse analysis and linguistics.

CedarNet Goes On-line With Logos Bible Software

Students take their seats, pulling notebooks from backpacks. The professor steps up to the overhead projector, and class begins. But in this classroom, the overheads are on computer, and the LCD projector is plugged into a network connector in the wall. This professor is using the latest high-tech instructional equipment to show students how to do their own research with state-of-the-art software. A graduate course in physics? A special seminar for engineering majors? Note this is a first-year course at Cedarville College called *Introduction to Bible Study*. The software is Logos.

When the administration at Cedarville College invested in a campus wide computer network, they had in mind much more than a few PCs placed around campus for the pocket-protector crowd. They realized that the best way to move Cedarvilles quality curriculum into the twenty-first century would be to completely integrate computers into all areas of instruction. The first phase of CedarNet, a truly campus wide network, was installed for the fall 1992 term, linking 300 dormitory rooms with the college computer center, library, classrooms, faculty offices, and computer labs. By the fall of 1993, approximately two-thirds of on-campus students will have network workstations in their rooms, and the rest of Cedarvilles 2,200 students will have access to computers in easily accessible labs. At a college where high-tech programs like nursing or engineering often get much of the attention, one of the first departments to come on-line was the Department of Biblical Education. In a special chapel service in May 1992, one of two academic departments showing students the benefits of network software was the Bible department, using Logos. All the Bible faculty have 486 computers in their offices with access to laser printers and a color printer, matching the best equipment on campus. And some faculty are developing hypermedia to use as on-line textbooks for general education Bible courses.

Cedarville College has always offered a strong Bible major and requires a Bible minor for all students. This years theme for the college, An Unchanging Christ for a Changing World, underscores why the school believes that students should learn to study the Bible for themselves. The faculty has designed the required Bible courses to give students the tools they need, especially as more and more students are leaving high school without a good understanding of Bible basics.

Introduction to Bible Study (IBS) is either the first or second Bible course a Cedarville student takes the other being *The Christian Life*. In IBS, students must write an inductive Bible study paper. A similar paper is then required in each of the succeeding four required courses: *Old Testament Survey*, *New Testament Survey*, *God and History*, and *God and the Church*. The lessons of IBS are designed to provide the basis not only for the rest of the curriculum, but for the students entire Christian life.

IBS teacher Chris Miller says Logos is an ideal tool for inductive Bible study. *In Introduction to Bible Study*, we teach students to do word studies using Strongs Concordance. Logos takes a lot of the pain out of those assignments. In Logos, clicking the # icon displays the Strongs numbers next to each word in the text. Double-clicking on that number opens the Strongs entry in a new window. Miller continues, Part of the Strongs entry is a cross-reference with the numbering system of the *Theological Dictionary of the New Testament* or the *Theological Wordbook of the Old Testament*. Logos gives the volume and page number for a student to check the expanded information in one of those references.

Miller also teaches students to compare translations by opening more than one window in Logos; for example, looking at the King James Version and the Revised Standard Version simultaneously. Logos also adds the ability to view the text in paragraph, poetic, or traditional verse form, he adds. And he can honestly tell the students that these features are useful at any level of Bible study. Miller uses the same methods every day as he works on his doctoral dissertation.

Cedarville chose Logos because it is fully compatible with the most advanced other software available for the campus wide network. Cedarville and IBM are showcase partners in the effort, and the college is trying to give students access to the best software available, including Windows 3.1. Logos works especially well with Windows word processors.

Rich Blumenstock, another IBS instructor, also teaches his students to do word studies in Logos, and then bring the text into Word Perfect for Windows to be manipulated. The dynamic verse insertion feature in Logos creates a menu item in the word processor so the user can pull Bible text right into the word processing document without using the clipboard. The user simply opens both Logos and WordPerfect for Windows and lets them run concurrently.

Dr. David Drullinger, another Cedarville Bible professor, uses the Logos English and Greek texts as well as Strongs in his research for the upper division classes he teaches in Romans and Galatians. He uses these same Logos functions as he prepares for regular preaching responsibilities at a church in nearby Dayton, Ohio.

Other members of the college family are also learning to apply Logos powerful functions to areas outside the classroom. I use it sometimes for personal study, says Christine Timmer, nursing sophomore from Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio. Nothing big just taking advantage of Strongs Enhanced Lexicon. Lee Webb, residence director of Lawlor Hall, shares, I have used Logos software several times for personal Bible study as well as for preparing for devotionals and have found it to be very helpful. Pamela Rutledge, an elementary education sophomore from Rochester Hills, Michigan, simply says of Logos, I love it.

Although the college did not offer formal training in the software, students from various majors have learned it on their own or with the help of lab assistants. Phase Two of CedarNet, to be in place for the fall 1993 term, will include increased opportunities for students to learn Logos and other software in classroom settings, and the Bible faculty also plan to offer more instruction in Logos in their classes. Through these efforts, the college hopes that these testimonials will be repeated by the great majority of Cedarville students.

For some students, using Logos has enhanced their ability to minister to Christian friends and encourage fellow students. Engineering freshman Jason Macfarlane from McKinney, Texas, says I use it [Logos] when I am writing a letter of Biblical ideas or encouragement. It has a nice concordance system, and the Strongs interpretations really help as well. It is fast and easy to use.

Once I wanted to find some verses to send to a friend on the subject of prayer, so I did a word search, says Tanya Nicholson, a freshman from Delran, New Jersey. Another time I used it during my devotions.

Brian Blackburn, senior marketing major from Westerville, Ohio, used Logos during premarital counseling. I used it to do a concordance study on the word grace for myself and on the word trust for my fiancée, he says. "I used it [Logos] to prepare for a sermon I preached in the student fellowship on Lamentations, chapter 3, Daniel Treier, computer information systems senior of Bloomdale, Ohio, shares. I kept some personal notes in it, as well as using the Strongs and concordance features. Logos was very helpful and has a good user interface. Other students have found Logos to be helpful in preparing for ministry off-campus. Cedarville students volunteer over 70,000 hours in community service annually, and several gospel teams travel to approximately 480 churches each year. Logos Research Systems has released Logos Bible Crosswords for Windows, the first multimedia Windows Bible crossword program on the market. Logos Bible Crosswords is an exciting and challenging computerized crossword puzzle program which contains 200 fascinating puzzles, supplied by Tyndale House Publishers, with religious or biblical themes. Logos Bible Crosswords combines graphics, sound, crosswords, and the Bible to create a very enjoyable and educational crossword game.

This product represents an expansion of the Logos software family beyond traditional Bible software, says Kiernon Reiniger, Vice President of Logos Research Systems. Even though Logos Bible Crosswords is extremely easy to play, it is a highly customizable program. You can change the look and feel, the color, the sounds, the fonts, and the skill level. Change the look and feel through the Preferences dialog box. Choose your favorite color scheme in the Colors dialog box. Choose your fonts through the Fonts dialog box. Challenge yourself by choosing one of three different skill levels on the Skill menu.

When you run Logos Bible Crosswords, the program's voice—which is the voice of Lisa Zullo, Kiernon Reiniger's fiancée—narrates the program. For example, the program says, Welcome to Logos Bible Crosswords! When you correctly guess a word, the program says, Great Job! If you finish a puzzle, the program says, Congratulations! You're done! Logos Bible Crosswords also has several musical sound bites which are used throughout the program, as well as a MIDI introduction song, which will be played if you have a MIDI-compatible sound card installed and configured in your system. All of these sounds can be turned on or off through the Preferences dialog box.
