

With the May 1936 issue, NEW MYSTERY ADVENTURES became MYSTERY ADVENTURE MAGAZINE. Due to numerous title changes, this pulp is one of the more confusing pulp titles to understand; hardly a surprise considering that its initial publisher was Harold Hersey. Briefly however, it began as NEW MYSTERY ADVENTURES with the March 1935 issue and continued to April 1936. The title changed to MYSTERY ADVENTURE MAGAZINE with the May 1936 issue, and it remained thus through the November 1936 issue, when, with the December 1936 issue it became (for one issue only) MYSTERY ADVENTURES. The final four issues (January 1937 to May 1937) appeared under the title MYSTERY ADVENTURES MAGAZINE. Got it? Good. Both Wayne Rogers and Richard Sale were frequent contributors to the pulp.
