NEW MYSTERY ADVENTURES featured many fine covers by one of the kings of the pulp field, Norman Saunders. The November 1935 issue is no exception. However, while the covers and the interior illustrations--many of which featured women either nude or in varying stages of undress--would indicate that the magazine was a competitor of the SPICY chain of pulps, the stories themselves were much tamer than the SPICY pulps. The November 1935 issue also featured a science fiction story, by SF writer R.F. Starzl, "World Tube Murders." This foreshadows the appearance of the short-lived Zenith Rand science fiction series, which would later run in MYSTERY ADVENTURE MAGAZINE.
