

The January 1937 issue of SPICY ADVENTURE STORIES features the fifth, and last, of Robert E. Howard's contributions to the magazine, as "Murderer's Grog" by Sam Walser makes its appearance. This was later reprinted in the November 1942 issue as "Outlaw Working" by Max Neilson. Although the Walser byline was not used on any of Howard's pulp stories other than those in SPICY ADVENTURE STORIES, at least one other story in which Howard had a hand later appeared under that name in a different magazine. In 1984, Robert Price published the first issue of his small press magazine, RISQUE STORIES, which was dedicated to printing new fiction in the spicy pulp vein. Leading off the first issue (March 1984) was Sam Walser's "She-Cats of Samarkand", written by Marc A. Cerasini and Charles Hoffman from an outline left by Howard.
