

SAUCY MOVIE TALES ran for approximately 21 issues, beginning with the December 1935 issue and ending with the January-February 1938 issue. It is possible that it is a retitling of SPICY MOVIE TALES, although the existence of this latter magazine has not been confirmed. If it did exist, it is likely that Trojan (publisher of SPICY ADVENTURE, SPICY MYSTERY and SPICY DETECTIVE) threatened to sue, leading to a title change, much as Better Publications, publisher of the Thrilling group of pulps, caused Popular Publications' THRILLING MYSTERIES to be cancelled after one issue. It is also possible that STAGE AND SCREEN STORIES was merged into SAUCY MOVIE TALES sometime after April 1936.
