## **Proximal Attachment**

The seventh intercostal intimus muscle lies deep to the seventh intercostal internus in the middle twoquarters of the intercostal space. It is a more substantial muscle than those of the upper intercostal spaces and arises from the internal aspect of the seventh rib.

## Distal attachment

Anteriorly the fibers pass infero-laterally, while laterally they pass infero-medially to insert onto the internal aspect of the eighth rib.

## **Nerve Supply**

The seventh intercostal intimus muscle is supplied by the seventh intercostal nerve.

## Action

The seventh intercostal intimus muscle is most active during expiration, but its primary role is with the seventh intercostal externus to stiffen the chest wall during respiration.
