## **Fish Editor**

Use the Fish Editor to customize fish species, or create your own.

Open an existing fish by choosing "Open" from the file menu. Choose the fish file you want from the list of files shown, or type in the path name of the file you want.

You can save your changes by choosing "Save" from the File menu, or you can save your current work to a new file by choosing "Save As" from the File menu.

## **Fish Motion**

Use the Fish Motion dialog to determine how your fish moves. Fish may move horizontally, vertically or diagonally. Horizontal fish may move to the left, or to the right, or both. Further, they may be constrained to stay near the top of the screen, near the bottom of the screen or in the middle of the screen. Vertical fish can move up, or down, or both and can be constrained to the left, right or middle portion of the screen. Diagonal fish may wiggle up the screen, or squirm down the screen.
