Rules

How To Play

Acey-Ducey (sometimes called RED DOG) is a very simple card game. The house deals 2 cards and you bet or pass depending on whether or not you think the next card will have a value between the two displayed cards.

Remember Aces are equal to 14 in this game!

Odds are calculated based on the spread between the cards. the smaller the spread the bigger the odds. For a 1 point spread (e.g., a 4 and a 6 are displayed) the odds are 5 to 1. For a 2 point spread 4 to 1, for a 3 point spread 2 to 1. For 4 point or greater spread the house pays even money.

A pair (2 cards of the same value) can be played with the goal being a 3 of a kind, the house pays 11 to 1. Consecutive numbers (a zero spread) will not allow a bet.

Thats all there is to it.

I hope you enjoy playing it as much as I did writing it.
