The spreadsheets that qualified for the PC/Computing 200 are DOS and Windows programs with high-end analytical capabilities and robust presentation-graphics features. All the programs can link across worksheets with at least the sophistication of Lotus 1-2-3 Version 2.3's /File Combine command. We tested only applications that could both load a Lotus 1-2-3 WK1 file and execute Lotus-style macros, allowing us to benchmark them for speed.

<p>Microsoft Excel is the most comprehensive spreadsheet in its class; it's far more advanced than DOS spreadsheets and snappier than 1-2-3 or Windows. With slick graphics capabilities, full implementation of Windows conventions, and robust help for 1-2-3 users, Excel covers all the bases. If you make the leap to Windows, this product will pay off handsomely.</p>	94.50
<p>The most full-featured DOS spreadsheet is Borland's Quattro Pro. With a built-in 1-2-3 interface, slideshow-building capabilities that rival those of presentation-graphics packages, and all the spreadsheet-publishing muscle you could want, this package is well equipped. We recommend Quattro Pro on the DOS platform.</p>	83.50
<p>For the army of 1-2-3 users working under DOS, Lotus 1-2-3 Release 3.1 Plus is a cutting-edge product. It's a better choice than Release 2.3 if you have 1MB of RAM, as it has fully implemented 3-D functionality. It is more expensive than competitors such as Quattro Pro, but Release 3.1 Plus is a very capable DOS spreadsheet and a longtime leader.</p>	81.50
<p>1-2-3 for Windows is a great choice for Lotus regulars moving to Windows. Excel is snappier and more in line with Windows conventions, but 1-2-3 for Windows won't throw you off if you're used to 1-2-3 for DOS; it even has 1-2-3's classic slash-key interface. Lotus's SmartIcons make the product much easier to use than most other spreadsheets, and 1-2-3 for Windows produces advanced, presentation-quality spreadsheets.</p>	81.50
<p>1-2-3 2.x has defined spreadsheet standards for years, and this release is still fit to be a leader. Release 2.3 doesn't work with multiple worksheets in RAM, but if you can forgive this fault and like Lotus's slash-key menus, you'll find this product is a powerhouse that runs well with only 640K of RAM. You can increase functionality, via add-ins included with the product, and third-party add-ins abound.</p>	68

A leader in the graphics category since its move from the Mac to the Windows platform a few years ago, Wingz carved out a niche for itself. Its lead has closed somewhat as other spreadsheets have taken on robust graphics capabilities, but Wingz is still powerful. Though it lacks the easy-to-use toolbar feature of Excel and 1-2-3 for Windows, it's an attractive and flexible program.
