Followings are some of my favorite tricks:

2. Playing a music at a set time (Chime)
3. Displaying a digital clock on a title bar of an active window
(Very handy!!!)

Settings

Click the right mouse button on my dancing clock to tell me how I should behave.

1. Time to Chime (to remind you of tea time)
 - Please enter the time to chime my clock.
The time should be set in 24 hour army time.
I will tell you when the set time arrives by chiming my clock.
 - If you do not want me to chime (give it a deep though because I just love to chime), check the box to the left of "Do not chime".
2. WAV Files Settings
 - If you have a particular music which you want me to play for a chime, enter the name of the WAV file (files ending with a WAV extension). If you do not the exact location of the file, choose the [Browse] button. I will bring up the WAV File Selection dialog box.
 - If you don't have any particular music, check the box to the right of "Use the default sound". I will pretend that I am a cuckoo (I'm a very good actor).
3. Save Settings
 - If you want me to memorize what you told me, choose this button. I have a good memory (even though it is small).
4. Save Position
 - If you want my clock to appear at the same position the next time you beckon me, choose this button. I will do my very best to go there.
5. Exit
 - If you absolutely just do not want to see my clock any more (you just do not know how that hurt me), choose this button.

WAV File Selection dialog box.

6. Test
 - I will play the WAV file you have selected.
7. OK
 - If you decide on which WAV file I should always play for my chime, select the file and choose the [OK] button.
8. Cancel
 - If you decide that you really do not want to change the chime after all, choose the [Cancel] button.
