# Chapter 1

# Annotate.AmigaGuide

## 1.1 Annotate 2.0

Welcome to Annotate 2.0 A Shareware text editor for the Amiga.

This is the third release of the Annotate and is the first version with a full ARexx port. The documention has been kept to a minumum (do to a lack of time on my part) but if you are used to using any other text editor or word processor this doc file and a little getting used to Ann should be enough for anyone. If you have any ideas for Ann please feel free to drop me a line (see About Annotate for info).

### 1.2 Notes about Annotate 2.0

#### -FUNDAMENTALS

Some of the basic concepts of this text editor are far different than regular text editors.

Firstly, Annotate has a cursor separate from the selection. For instance, one could move the cursor wherever he or she pleases without losing the selection. In fact, if one was to edit the text inside the selection, the highlight would resize accordingly. As this text editor was created with programmers in mind, it has many features useful to programmers.

#### -Status Line

When editing text in Annotate, one would notice the current status line at the bottom.

A typical display would look like:

"work:Ann/AnnotateDoc" Col: 30 Line: 85/ 85 Modified Srl LS Sel

On the very left is the current document you are editing. Next is the current column and line display, then "Modified". If "Modified" is present, then the text has been edited since the last save, and will prompt for saving changes, if you try to quit. "Srl" means that the numeric keypad is in scroll mode. It could also read "Num" at which time you can input numbers with the keypad. "LS" which may also say "VS" tells wheather the current editor is in line selection mode or vertical selection mode. "Sel" is used to indicate if there is any text currently selected. This is useful as many menu items act on a selection, and not neccesarily the cursor. Also, any error messages are conveyed on this bottom line, temporarily replacing the stats.

#### -Scroll Bar

But not just any scroll bar. A scroll bar should show you where you are in relation to the top and botton of text. Ann's scroll bar also shows you where your cursor, selection, and scroll stores are. Try it, you'll find it very useful.

A very important part of annotate is it's ScrollStores, these beasties are used to save your current position in the document. It is useful when programming, when trying to find the little piece of code within 100s of lines or more. All one has to do, is set a ScrollStore there, and then call that same ScrollStore when one wants to return. There are 6 different ScrollStore locations, so up to six positions may be saved. - Note: ScrollStore merely identifies vertical and horizotal scroll, not the actual text your looking at. On the scroll bar they appear as lines with a number under them to indicate which scrollstore the line represents.

#### -Quick keys not on the menu

Ctrl ArrowKey - Will move you to the beginning or end of the next word on the current line.

Shift ArrowKey - Will move the cursor to the top of screen, bottom of the screen, beginning of line and end of line.

One other recently added "feature" is the "shift-TAB". By holding down the shift key and hitting TAB, the cursor will delete the number of characters the current TAB is set to. This is useful for programming when one wants to move out one tab space. \*\*Caution, this will delete characters as well as spaces.

#### -A word about making selections

Normally Ann has an unfilled be for a cursor but if you click down on the the cursor it will become filled in. If you drag the cursor to a new position and let go Ann will make a seltion from where you started to where you ended.

-About the close box

It should be noted that hitting the close box Ann last window ( which would cause most programs to quit) ann will close the editor in the window but will not close the window if there is an editor in the external editor list. Insted it will put the first external editor into the window. However if there is not an external editor ann will quit just like most programs.

# 1.3 Startup

Starting from Workbench:

To start Ann from workbeach simply double click on the Ann icon in which case Ann will appear with the ASL file requester ready for you to use, or by double clicking on a project icon with Ann as the default tool in which case Ann will appear and imedetly load the file.

Starting from the Shell:

If you start ann from the shell you have the option of suppling a file list to be loaded at startup. You may also give a directory name as a file name in which case a file requester will appear with it's directory string set to the directory you specifed.

#### example:

Ann s:starup-sequence s:user-startup
 (opens two windows and loads the files into them
Ann s:
 (opens a window and file requester set to s:)
Ann /
 (opens a window and file requester set the the current directory)

On startup Annotate will search for it's config files. Ann looks for three files:

- 1) AnnConfig
- 2) AnnTools
- 3) Default.AnnMacs

AnnConfig contains the deafault settings for window placement, rendering options, etc. It is created by use the "Save" gadget in the Config requester. Ann looks for AnnConfig in s:.

AnnTools is a list of menu items and execution information for anns tool menu that is userconfigerable by using this file. Ann looks for AnnTools in the Current directory and if it is not found there then Ann searches s:.

#### example:

AnnTools

command from the menu. Ann looks for Default. AnnMacs in the Current

directory and if it is not found there then Ann searches s:.

If any of these files are not present Ann will resort to it's built in default settings for that file.

When Ann has loaded all config files it will then search for the default public screen (in most cases this is the workbeach screen) and bring up any windows on that screen. Ann will also use the default fonts of the screen. Also Ann must run on a screen at least 640x200. If the default public screen is smaller this 640x200 ann will fail to open and supply an error msg that the screen is to small.

# **Example AnnTools**

The following is my defualt "AnnTools" from s:. I also keep "AnnTools" specfic to a piticular project in the drawer with the project so that when I work on a project I have set of specalized tools for that project

This file begins with the word "ClickDos" and ends with a LF after "numberlist"

#### 1.5 Menus

Annotate uses standard Amiga menus with one exception. All quick  $\,\,\leftrightarrow\,\,$ keys are

case sensitive. For example:

# 1.6 Project Menu

- ABOUT This item merely give some information on this version of Annotate and a brief description. (And a plea for "gifts".)
- NEW This will start a "new" document in a new window (it will be the front one).
- OPEN NEW This will bring up the AmigaDOS 2.04 requester for opening files and will open the selected one on a new screen placed in the front.
- OPEN This will bring up the AmigaDOS 2.04 requester for opening files and will open the selected one. Careful this is destructive, it will replace current document.
- SAVE/CLOSE This saves the file. (As it's current name rewriting the old file if there was one.) It will prompt for a name if this is a "new" document. Then After the file is saved the window and editor are closed.
- SAVE ALL MODS This saves ever file that has been modified using it's current name.
- SAVE AS Lets you save the file as a different name, and this will remain the current name.
- SAVE This just saves the file. (As it's current name rewriting the old file if there was one.) It will prompt for a name if this is a "new" document.
- PRINT sends the current window out prt:
- LAST SAVED This will "revert" the text to the last version saved.

  Caution destructive!
- DELETE FILE... This will bring up an AmigaDOS 2.04 requester prompting for which file to delete.

  This is obviously DESTRUCTIVE!
- SAVE ALL/QUIT This option saves all current documents open (like doing a "SAVE" for each one) and quits the program.
- QUIT This option lets the user quit without saving the documents.

  If changes have been made, a requester will pop up asking if

you wish to really quit.

### 1.7 Edit Menu

- LINE/VERT SEL The selection will change from a line selection to a vertical selection. To find out what mode the window is in, look at the status bar it will have an "LS" or "VS" in it, meaning Line Select mode or Vertical Select mode respectively.
- CUT This will allow you to "cut" ( which copies to the clipboard and deletes ) to one of six clipboards from the current selection.
- COPY This will allow you to "copy" ( which copies to the clipboard )
   to one of six clipboards from the current selection...
- PASTE This will allow you to "paste" (which prints from the clipboard) from one of six clipboards to current cursor position.
- ERASE This will delete the current selection. Caution destructive.
- FOLD This will fold the currently selected lines.
- UNFOLD This will unfold the line the cursor is currently on.
- UNFOLD ALL This will unfold all of the folded lines in the current document.
- SHIFT RIGHT This will shift all of the characters in the current selection right on the assumption that ENTIRE lines are selected.
- SHIFT LEFT This will shift all of the characters in the current selection left on the assumption that ENTIRE lines are selected.
- UPPER CASE This will shift all of the characters in the current selection to upper case.
- LOWER CASE This will shift all of the characters in the current selection to lower case.
- DUPLICATE LINE This will take the line the curent cursor is on, and will duplicate it on the next line.
- MERGE LINE Merge line takes the current line the cursor is on and tacks the next line to the end of it. (Try it and you will see what I meen.)
- DELETE LINE This menu item deletes the line the cursor is on.
- LOCK LINES Sets all lines in the current selection to locked. This makes the selected lines uneditable. You can use this featue to protect certain parts of your document. Locked

lines will appear underlined if you have the "Draw Line Locks" gadget ticked in the config requester otherwise locked will appear identical to unlocked lines.

- UNLOCK LINES Sets all locked lines in the current selection to unlocked. (see LOCK LINES for more info)
- START SEL Start a selection from the keyboard. This feature is mostly here for making selections from ARexx and Macros.
- END SEL End a selection from the keyboard. This feature is mostly here for making selections from ARexx and Macros.

## 1.8 Search Menu

- FIND... Find produces a "find" requester. The "string" gadget accepts a string of characters to find.
- FIND NEXT Uses the string from the original find requester to find the next instance of the string.
- REPLACE Produces a "replace" requester with several option gadgets.

  The string gadgets accepts strings to search for and replace with. There are cycle type gadgets from search type and prompt type.
- Sel->Replace Takes the current selection and places it in the "replace" requester.
- Line Number... Brings up a requester prompting for the line number you wish to go to.
- Match Brace This finds the opposite bracket or brace and takes the cursor to it.
- Match Brace/Sel This finds the opposite bracket or brace and selects everything between the two.
- Select All Simply selects the entire document.
- Select Line Selects entire line the cursor is on.
- Select Word Selects the word your cursor is on.

### 1.9 View Menu

ED EXCHANGE... - OK, this is the coolest thing in Ann. What it will let you do is have several files loaded into memory, but not necessitating have windows for them all. And, if you want to look at a file in one

of the buffers, you simple exchange it for a file that is in the current window. Or you could put it in a new window of it's own. You can also open close windows but still keep the file in memory or open files into the current window and have the current text in the window buffered off into memory. To make a long story short, (too late, I know) Exchange is the best place to open and close files and windows if you are working on a large number of files, it's hard to explain this feature fully. So... all I can say is try learning to use it. Once you figure it out, you'll never use the normal Open from the file menu again.

Shrink Ann - Makes Annotate shrink to minimum possible size.

Enlarge Ann - Makes Annotate grow to a maximum possible size.

Ann to Front - Takes Annotate's window and pushes it front.

Ann to Back - Takes Annotate's window and pushes it to the back.

Go->ScrollStore - (1 - 6) Goes to previously set scrollstore from one to six.

Goto Cursor - Moves your "scroll" or view back to the cursor. It may not be at the cursor if you have used the Scroll Store.

Goto Selection - Moves your "scroll" or view to the currently selected text.

Scroll/Num - Sets the keypad between scroll movement and typing numbers. Much like a "NumLock" key on an IBehM.

Regen All - This will redraw all of Annotate's current windows. It will also set Ann Global variables named GRAPHIC\_UPDATE and SHOW\_REQUEST to ON (see AREXX section under SET).

### 1.10 Macros Menu

PLAY MACRO - Play macro is use to play a maros 1 to 10 depending on the number you select. Note that the Quick key is Shift the funtion key which coresponds to the macro you wish to play. Also if you hold down the Ctrl key in the quick key combination the macro will shut down screen update until after the macro has finished. For macros that do a lot of screen update this can speed up the macro dermaticly.

RECORD MACRO - Will start recoring a macro in the number you selected.

Use 'Stop Recording' when you are finished.

STOP RECORDING - If you Recording a Macro this will stop the recording and return Ann to it's normal state.

OPEN MACROS - Load a macro file made with 'Save Macros'.

SAVE MACROS - Save all macros to a file.

#### 1.11 Tools Menu

Config... - This is the item for changing the default configuration of Annotate. Almost everything here is self explanatory except for a few items. The "scroll unit" is the number of characters from all sides of the window, where Annotate will decide to scroll if you are in. ( - Note: you may wish to make it quite small, if you are using a small window size. It will let you to continue to operate with scrolling intact. The "Window TopEdge" is where you want the top, left edge of Annotate to default to (in pixels from the top, left of your screen). "Window Width" and "Height" are also set the default configuration of Ann's window in pixels. The make .info file switch, determines if icons are created for your text files. (If there is a .info file, there is an icon.) The make .bak switch sets wether or not the program creates ".bak" backup files, of your current version of the text you are editing. Auto Indent tells Annotate if it should automatically indent you when you press return to where you indented to on the previous line. You can also set the default search and prompt type for the various requesters throughout Annotate (ie. Search and Replace requesters).

RX FILENAME - After selecting this item a file requeter will apear with '#?.rexx' in the patten gadget. When you select a file Ann will run it as 'rx filename'. Note this will only work if you have ARexx properly installed on your system.

FILENAME TO CLIPO - This will copy the current windows filename to unit 0 of the clipboard.

INSERT ASCII CODE - Will produce a requester letter you input a number between 0 and 255. This number is inserted at cursor position when the OK gadget is pressed.

REPEAT NEXT EVENT - Will produce a number requester. Whatever number you put into the requester will the number of times the next event is done. For example, if you input the number 10 into the requester and after hitting OK you press the letter 'j', insted of 1 j being inserted into the editor 10 j's will be inserted.

JUSTIFY LINE - Justify line has three options from the menu, Left,
Center, and Right. Left will push the line the cursor
is on to the far left. Center will center the line
between the left the Wordwrap Colum (set in the config
requester). Right will push the line up so it touches

the Wordwrap Col.

-Tool Items - after this menu item, are the tools that may be added.

Tools may be added by adding them to the text file

"AnnTools. Explained previously in the starup section.

If they are added correctly, then they will appear here.

#### 1.12 ARexx

The following are a list of base commands for the annotate ARexx  $\hookleftarrow$  port

which can be addressed as:

address ('Annotate\_Rexx')

Each of these base commands may have more specfic commands and/or parmeters follow them. For example the if you wished to play macro 6 via the rexx port the command would be:

DOMENU PLAY MACRO 6

In this case DOMENU is the base command, PLAY\_MACRO is the first sub command, and 6 is the second sub command. Note that memu commands never take any parmeters.

An example of a command that does take parmeters is:

MOVE\_CURSOR REL 5 8

Where MOVE\_CURSOR is the base command, REL (for relative to the current position of the cursor) is the sub command and 5 and 8 are the parameters for deltaX and deltaY. This command will move the cursor 5 spaces to the right and 8 spaces down exatly the same way you can do with the cursor keys.

If OPTIONS RESULTS has been specficed in the rexx program then many of the following commands will also return valuabbe information.

The following is a complete list of Annotates rexx commands, subcommands, parmeters and return values.

## 1.15 Seach and Load

/\* This rexx program brings up a list requester with some file names. After the user picks a file (as long as they didn't pick cancel) the program searches to see if ann has that file in a window and if it finds it, Ann brings the window to front. If ann dons't find it, Ann searches the external editor list in memory and brings the editor (if it's there) into the current window. If ann still hasn't found the file, Ann will load it off disk and into the current window and push the editor in the current window into the external editor list.

Whenever I'm working on a project this is the program I us to manage my files. You can expand it simply by adding more file to the List requester.

#### 1.16 domenu

The DOMENU command can be used to access most menu items by simply writting out the menu item after DOMENU. Menu items with more then one word in them such as "Last Saved" must be written as "LAST\_SAVED" so ann will not think the word "SAVED" is another subcommand. DOMENU commands never take any parms and never return anything. Below is a complete list of the menu items supported be Ann. Indented items are sub commands of the previos item and must be used to make the command work.
