The expression there is (singular) becomes there are in the plural.

Example: There is a hole in your pocket.

There are many nice flowers in that garden.

In the interrogative form, there is put after the verb.

<u>Example</u>: Is there a problem?

Are there lots of children on the playground?

In the negative form, there is becomes there isn't (there is not) and there are becomes there aren't (there are not).

Example: There isn't any milk left.
There aren't many mistakes in your paper.
