• The expression **there is** (singular) becomes **there are** in the plural.

<u>Example</u>: There is a hole in your pocket.

There are many nice flowers in that garden.

• In the interrogative form, there is put after the verb.

<u>Example</u>: Is there a problem?

**Are there** lots of children on the playground?

• In the negative form, there is becomes there isn't (there is not) and there are becomes there aren't (there are not).

<u>Example</u>: There isn't any milk left.

There aren't many mistakes in your paper.
