- We call question tags the little questions (auxiliary + subject pronoun) that are placed at the end of a sentence.
- Usually an affirmative sentence is followed by a negative question tag and a negative sentence by an affirmative question tag.

Example: You're British, aren't you?
We can't go this way, can we?
She won't take the plane, will she?

Note: When there is no auxiliary in the first part of the sentence, we use do in the tag. Example: He lives in Wales, doesn't he?
