

B- Use of have (got) to

- The auxiliary **have (got) to** is used when **the obligation comes from somewhere else**.

Example: You **have to** be at the airport at one o'clock.

(The speaker remembers that this is the "rule.")

but You **must** be at the airport by one o'clock.

(The speaker emphasizes the fact so that the listener doesn't forget.)

- In the **future** and the **past simple**, we use **have (got) to** instead of **must**.

Example:

Future I'll **(will) have to** be patient.

Past simple They **had to** wait.
