HOW TO SEND TEXT FROM THE CC40 TO AN IBM COMPATIBLE USING THE WINDOWS TERMINAL PROGRAM.

You need an IBM compatible computer that can run Windows, a CC40 connected by a hexbus cable to a hexbus RS232, and a serial cable to connect the hexbus RS232 to a com port on the IBM. L.L. Conner can make such a cable or you may be able to use an off the shelf serial cable. You need the CC40 Memo Processor cartridge or my BASIC CC40 word processing program.

On the IBM launch Windows. From the "Accessories" window double click on Terminal to start the Windows terminal program.

Click on "Settings" and then click on "Terminal Preferences". Click on the "Inbound" box under "CR-> CR/LF" and then click on "OK".

Click on "Settings" again and then click on "Communications". Select 300 baud, 8 data bits, parity none, the com port your serial cable is connected to, and one stop bit by clicking on each of these settings. Then click on "OK".

Click on "Transfers" and then click on "Receive text file". Select a file name such as bootlog.txt and a directory and then click on "OK". Answer Yes to the prompt about overwriting an existing file if you get such a prompt.

On the CC40, if using Memo Processor select "Com" by pressing FN and comma. Then select "send text" (FN and + if using Memo Processor). The text should appear on the IBM's screen.

On the IBM, when text stops flowing in from the CC40 click on "Stop". Then exit Windows. The ASCII file bootlog.txt can then be loaded into any PC word processor for further processing and/or printing using the PC's printer.

In doing my preparations for Fest-West, I found a couple of minor bugs in some of my software. As always, I'm passing these updates along for the Lima Public Domain Library.

The REFORMATTER is updated because under certain circumstances it would omit several records from the end of the input file. It would also tend to omit the line skip after a paragraph ending. Both of these problems have been fixed.

The FONT CONVERTER and the TURN FONT (font turner) have been corrected for my own misunderstanding about the File Header on CHARAI files. The correct header has the file length in the second word to include the header itself, while the old versions of these products assumed that the second word in the header did not include the 6 bytes of the header.
