Overview

BattleStar for Windows 95/NT is a small game similar to the classic BattleShip. The BattleStar game board is a 9x9x9 grid representing a 3-D galaxy. The galaxy contains 972 sectors, 60 of which contain enemy warships. You must locate and destroy these enemy invaders before they can establish bases in the galaxy

Game Play

Simply click the **Mouse** on any galaxy sector coordinate to select a missile target and then press the **Spacebar** to fire a missile. Press the **Enter** key to move to the next galaxy quadrant.

Desktop Locations

BattleStar's location on the desktop is saved when the program is exited. Whenever you start BattleStar it will reappear on the desktop where you last placed it. BattleStar property sheet locations are also stored and reused the next time they are opened.

Installing BattleStar

Installation

To install BattleStar for Windows 95/NT on your computer simply create a new, empty folder and place the files; BSTAR.EXE, BSTAR.HLP and BSTAR.CNT there.

BSTAR.EXE - The BattleStar Application
BSTAR.HLP - The Windows 95/NT Help File

BSTAR.CNT - The Windows 95/NT Help Contents File

If you installed BattleStar for Windows 95/NT using the SETUP.EXE program and selected the default installation settings BattleStar for Windows 95/NT will be installed in the **C:\Program Files\Software by Design** folder.

To integrate BattleStar for Windows 95/NT with the MS Windows Explorer select the <u>Help | Setup</u> menu item to open the BattleStar <u>Explorer Setup</u> property sheet.

Note If you have an earlier version of BattleStar for Windows 95/NT installed on your computer, simply replace the BSTAR.EXE, BSTAR.HLP and BSTAR.CNT files with the newer versions.

The various application settings specified in the <u>BattleStar Options</u> property sheet as well as the main window's size and location on the desktop are stored in the MS Windows 95/NT <u>System Registry</u>.

Warning If you rename the BSTAR.EXE file you must also rename the BSTAR.HLP file using the same basename. For example if you change the BattleStar application file name to NewName.exe, rename the help file to NewName.hlp. Do not rename the BSTAR.CNT file however. The HLP and CNT files *must* reside in the same folder as the BattleStar application file itself.

The MS Windows 95/NT Help program creates a pair of files associated with the BSTAR.HLP file. These files will have file extensions of GID and FTS. These files are used to store specific information about the help window location on the desktop and the word list used for topic searching. These two files will be created when the BattleStar for Windows 95/NT Help file is first used.

Configuring BattleStar

BattleStar Options

Select the **File | Options** menu item to open the BattleStar Options property sheet. This window will allow you to change the various BattleStar program settings listed below.

Easy

Check this item to play BattleStar games that are VERY easy to win. You will be given 360 Missiles and 150 Fuel Units.

Normal

Check this item to play BattleStar games that are challenging. You will be given 240 Missiles and 100 Fuel Units.

Hard

Check this item to play BattleStar games that are VERY hard to win. You will be given 120 Missiles and 50 Fuel Units.

Play Sound F/X Wave Files

Check this box to play WAV files. Your computer system must be equipped for MultiMedia and have a sound card installed for this option to be valid.

OK

Press this button when you have completed your selection of BattleStar program options. When you press this button the BattleStar Options property sheet will be closed and your settings will be saved.

Cancel

Press this button to close the BattleStar Options property sheet without making any changes. If you have made any changes to the option settings, and then press this button your changes will not be used, and your previous settings will remain in use.

Help

Press this button to open the BattleStar Help Window and go directly to the Configuring BattleStar topic.

Note The options you have selected will be saved when you press the **OK** button. The desktop location of the BattleStar Options window itself will also be stored. Your settings will be saved in the MS Windows 95/NT <u>System Registry</u>.

BattleStar Explorer Setup

BattleStar Explorer Setup

Select the **File | Options** menu item to open the BattleStar Options property sheet. Select the **Explorer** tab to display MS Windows 95/NT Explorer setup options. This window will allow you to integrate BattleStar for Windows 95/NT with the Microsoft Windows 95/NT Explorer. You can also select the **Help | Setup** menu item to go directly to this window. Use this command to create and remove MS Explorer shortcuts for BattleStar for Windows 95/NT.

Create a Start Menu Item

Check this item to create a BattleStar Start Menu entry. The BattleStar for Windows 95/NT program will be located in the Software by Design folder on the Programs menu. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a BattleStar item already exists in the Software by Design folder.

Remove this Start Menu Item

Check this item to remove the BattleStar entry located in the Software by Design folder on the Programs menu. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a BattleStar item does not already exist in the Software by Design folder.

Create a Desktop Icon

Check this item to create a BattleStar for Windows 95/NT program icon on the Explorer desktop. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a BattleStar desktop icon already exists.

Remove Icon from the Desktop

Check this item to remove the BattleStar for Windows 95/NT program icon from the Explorer desktop. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a BattleStar desktop icon does not already exist.

Create a Startup Folder Item

Check this item to automatically run BattleStar for Windows 95/NT whenever Microsoft Windows is started. This option creates a BattleStar program icon in the MS Windows Explorer Startup folder. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a BattleStar startup item already exists in the Startup folder.

Remove the Startup Folder Item

Check this item to remove BattleStar from the MS Windows Explorer Startup folder. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a BattleStar startup item does not already exist in the Startup folder.

oĸ

Press this button when you have completed your selection of MS Explorer shortcuts. When you press this button the BattleStar Setup property sheet will be closed and the MS Explorer shortcuts you have selected will be created or removed.

Cancel

Press this button to close the BattleStar Explorer Setup property sheet without creating or removing any MS Explorer shortcuts.

Help

Press this button to open the BattleStar Help window and go directly to the BattleStar Explorer Setup topic.

Game Menu

Game Menu Commands

The Game menu provides commands to play and save BattleStar games. A short description of each item follows:

<u>N</u>ew

Starts a new BattleStar game. The Ctrl+N shortcut can be used for this command.

<u>O</u>pen

Opens a previously saved BattleStar game document, and loads it for play. When this item is selected the standard MS Windows Explorer file browser will be displayed, use this window to select the game you wish to resume playing. The **Ctrl+O** shortcut can be used for this command.

Properties

Display file property information about the current BattleStar game document. The **Alt+Enter** shortcut can be used for this command.

Close

Closes the currently active BattleStar game. You will be prompted to save or discard the current game before closing. The **Ctrl+W** shortcut can be used for this command.

Save

Saves the current game. The Ctrl+S shortcut can be used for this command.

Options

Opens the <u>BattleStar Options</u> property sheet and allows you to change BattleStar program settings. Use this command to configure the BattleStar program.

Exit

Closes the BattleStar for Windows 95/NT program and returns control to the Explorer desktop. The **Ctrl+Q** shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used Game commands can be invoked using shortcut keys.

View Menu

View Menu Commands

The View menu provides commands used to change BattleStar display options. These items provide a means of changing the BattleStar window appearance. A short description of each item follows:

Z Axis Scan

Use this command to display a Z Axis Scan of the galaxy. The Ctrl+Z shortcut can also be used for this command.

Y Axis Scan

Use this command to display a Z Axis Scan of the galaxy. The Ctrl+Y shortcut can also be used for this command.

X Axis Scan

Use this command to display a Z Axis Scan of the galaxy. The Ctrl+X shortcut can also be used for this command.

Scanner Log

Use this command to display the BattleStar Scanner Log window. This window will contain information regarding the galaxy coordinates you have explored. The **Ctrl+L** shortcut can also be used for this command.

Always on Top

Use this command to keep the BattleStar window top most on the desktop. When this item is checked the BattleStar window will float above all other non-topmost windows on the desktop. This item is useful if you normally run BattleStar with a small window that would be easily obscured by other applications. The **Ctrl+T** shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used View commands can be invoked using shortcut keys.

Ship Menu

Ship Menu Commands

The Ship menu provides commands used to control the ship. A short description of each item follows:

Aim

Opens and displays the targeting coordinate window. The Ctrl+A shortcut can also be used for this command.

Fire

Fires a single missile using the current target coordinates. The Ctrl+F shortcut can also be used for this command.

Helm

Opens and displays the helm coordinate window. The Ctrl+H shortcut can also be used for this command.

Engage

Engages the engines. The Ctrl+M shortcut can also be used for this command.

Reverse

Reverses the engines. The Ctrl+R shortcut can also be used for this command.

Play Sounds

This command turns sounds F/X on and off. The Ctrl+P shortcut can also be used for this command.

Help Menu

Help Menu Commands

The Help menu provides commands used to get help with BattleStar operations. A short description of each item follows:

Contents

Opens the BattleStar Help Topics window and displays the Table of Contents. The **F1** shortcut can be used for this command.

Search

Opens BattleStar Help Topics and displays the Search window. You can use this window to search for specific BattleStar help topics.

How to Use Help

Opens a Help window that explains how to use the MS Windows 95/NT Help program.

Game Rules

Displays BattleStar game rules. Press the **[Esc]** key, or click your mouse anywhere in the main viewing region to resume play.

Keyboard Shortcuts

Displays BattleStar keyboard shortcuts. Press the **[Esc]** key, or click your mouse anywhere in the main viewing region to resume play.

Mission Orders

Displays BattleStar mission orders. Press the **[Esc]** key, or click your mouse anywhere in the main viewing region to resume play.

Register

Displays the BattleStar Shareware Registration Wizard. This wizard allows you to register BattleStar for Windows 95/NT for authorized use.

Setur

Displays the BattleStar <u>Explorer Setup</u> property sheet. This window provides options to integrate BattleStar for Windows 95/NT with the MS Windows Explorer. Use this window to create MS Explorer Start Menu items and desktop icons.

Web Site

Opens your web browser application and goes directly to the Software by Design web site on the Internet.

About BattleStar

Displays the BattleStar splash box. This window contains program information, the current version of BattleStar you are running and a program copyright notice. Click the mouse anywhere in this window to close it



System Registry

BattleStar for Windows 95/NT System Registry Key

BattleStar for Windows 95/NT stores configuration settings in the MS Windows 95/NT System Registry. These settings are updated automatically while BattleStar is running. There is no need to edit these settings manually.

If you insist upon editing these settings, you do so at your own risk. BattleStar automatically updates registry entries when it exits. If you edit these settings make sure BattleStar is not running while you edit them. If BattleStar is currently running your changes will be overwritten when BattleStar exits.

BStar.cnt BattleStar Help Topics File Bstar.hlp BattleStar Help File

If you have opened and used the BattleStar for Windows 95/NT Help files your system may contain the following two (2) files. These files are created by the standard MS Windows 95/NT Help program WinHlp32.exe. These files may also be safely removed.

BStar.gid MS Windows Help settings file. This file contains the BattleStar Help window size and desktop location as

well as any bookmarks you may have created.

BStar.fts MS Windows Help word database. This file is created when you build a custom word list for BattleStar Help

files. This file is used to search for words and phrases in the BattleStar Help files.



What is Shareware
