Overview

FxEdit for Windows 95/NT is a small file utility that will allow you to view and modify binary disk files.

String Searches

FxEdit can also be used to search for specified hexadecimal and ASCII text strings.

Drag & Drop

Files can be quickly opened and viewed by simply dragging a file's icon to the FxEdit window.

Print Files

FxEdit will also print binary files in a variety of user-specified formats.

Desktop Locations

FxEdit's location on the desktop is saved when the program is exited. Whenever you start FxEdit it will reappear on the desktop where you last placed it. FxEdit property sheet locations are also stored and reused the next time they are opened.

Taskbar Tray

FxEdit for Windows 95/NT can be optionally configured to place its program icon in the Taskbar Icon Notification Tray. This option provides a simple means of keeping the taskbar button region clear for other running programs.

Installing FxEdit

Installation

To install FxEdit for Windows 95/NT on your computer simply create a new, empty folder and place the files; FXEDIT.EXE, FXEDIT.HLP and FXEDIT.CNT there.

FXEDIT.EXE - The FxEdit Application - The Windows 95/NT Help File FXEDIT.CNT - The Help Contents File

To integrate FxEdit for Windows 95/NT with the MS Windows Explorer select the FxEdit <u>Explorer Setup</u> property sheet while FxEdit is running.

Note If you have an earlier version of FxEdit for Windows 95/NT installed on your computer, simply replace the FXEDIT.EXE, FXEDIT.HLP and FXEDIT.CNT files with the newer versions.

Note The FXEDIT.INI file is no longer used and can be deleted. The various application settings specified in the <u>ExEdit Options</u> property sheet as well as the main window's size and location on the desktop are now stored in the MS Windows 95/NT <u>System</u> Registry.

Note Some earlier versions of FxEdit for Windows 95/NT included a FXEDIT.WRI documentation file. This file has been replaced by the FXEDIT.HLP file and can now be deleted.

Warning If you rename the FXEDIT.EXE file you must also rename the HLP file using the same basename. For example if you change the FxEdit application file name to NewName.exe, rename the help file to NewName.hlp. Do not rename the FXEDIT.CNT file however. The HLP and CNT files *must* reside in the same folder as the FxEdit application file itself.

Configuring FxEdit

FxEdit Options

Select the **File | Options** menu item to display the FxEdit Options property sheet. This window will allow you to change the various FxEdit program settings listed below.

Launch Multiple Instances

Check this item to allow more than one instance of FxEdit to be run on the desktop.

Reopen the Last File Used at Startup

Check this box to reopen the last file used when FxEdit is launched.

Open Locked Files as Read-Only

Check this box to open write protected files as read-only. If this item is not checked and a locked file is opened you will be prompted to load the file as read-only.

Show Tool Bar Tips

Check this item to display small popup tip windows when the mouse pointer is placed over <u>toolbar ribbon</u> pushbuttons. A short description of the button currently beneath the mouse will be shown when this item is checked.

Place Icon in Taskbar Tray

Check this item to display a small FxEdit program icon in the Taskbar Icon Notification Tray. If this item is selected and the FxEdit window is minimized a button will not be added to the Taskbar, to restore the FxEdit window on the desktop press the small icon in the taskbar tray instead. This option is available to keep the taskbar free for other running programs.

Note When this option is selected, clicking on the Close box in the upper right-hand corner of the window title bar will minimize FxEdit instead of closing the application. To quit FxEdit right-click with your mouse on the FxEdit icon in the Taskbar tray. You may also use the **File | Exit** menu command or the **Ctrl+Q** keyboard shortcut.

Confirm Program Exit

Check this item to confirm quitting FxEdit for Windows 95/NT. When this option is selected you will be prompted to confirm your intention to exit FxEdit and return to the MS Explorer desktop. This item is useful if you run FxEdit from the tray and wish to avoid accidental exits when you right-click on the FxEdit tray icon.

Display the Full ANSI Character Set

Check this item to display the entire ANSI character set, codes 32-255. If this item is not selected only ASCII character codes between 32-127 will be displayed.

Record Numbers

Check this box to include file record numbers when printing binary file reports.

ASCII Character Strings

Check this box to include ASCII character strings when printing binary file reports.

Hexadecimal Data Values

Check this box to include Hexadecimal data values when printing binary file reports.

Warning Sounds with Dialog Boxes

Check this box to play a short beep sound when FxEdit displays a warning dialog box or an error occurs.

ΟK

Press this button when you have completed your selection of FxEdit program options. When you press this button the FxEdit Options property sheet will be closed and your settings will be saved.

Cancel

Press this button to close the FxEdit Options property sheet without making any changes. If you have made any changes to the option settings, and then press this button your changes will not be used, and your previous settings will remain in use.

Help

Press this button to open the FxEdit Help window and go directly to the Configuring FxEdit topic.

Note The options you have selected will be saved when you press the **OK** button. The desktop location of the FxEdit Options window itself will also be stored. Your settings will be saved in the MS Windows 95/NT <u>System Registry</u>.

Configuring the Tools Menu

Configuring the Tools Menu

FxEdit for Windows 95/NT allows up to nine (9) applications to be added to the Tool menu. To define a tool select the **Tools** | **Define Tools** menu item. A property sheet will be displayed allowing you to specify the various tool parameters for the tool menu item you are defining.

Tools

Use this list dropbox to select the tool menu item you would like to define or modify. Tool menu items that are not defined will have a title of Undefined. The Tool menu item properties for the tool you have selected will be reflected in the window below.

Name

Enter a short name to be used as the tool menu item name. This name will appear on the Tools menu.

Active

Check this box to enable the tool menu item. If this item is not checked the tool name will appear on the Tools menu but the item will be disabled (grayed).

Minimize FxEdit on Tool Launch

Check this box to minimize to the FxEdit main program window to an icon on the MS Explorer Taskbar or Icon Notification Tray. This option is useful to reduce screen clutter when FxEdit is used with other applications.

Program

Enter the name of the program you would like to associate with the tool menu item. Use the entire path when specifying a tool menu item, or press the browse button [...] to the right of the entry field to select an application using the standard MS Windows file browser.

Command

Enter any option command arguments this tool definition may need. This is an optional item and may be left blank if you simply need to launch a program without any additional command arguments.

Run

Specify the window size using this command. Tools can be launched with a normal sized main window, or a minimized or maximized window.

Ask for Arguments

Check this box to be prompted for runtime command line arguments when a tool is launched

Working Directory

If this entry is filled with a directory name, the folder you specify will be selected and made the default working directory before launching the menu item tool. Press the browse button [...] to the right of this entry field to automatically select a folder using the folder browser dialog box.

OK

Press this button when you have completed your selection of Tool settings. When you press this button the Tool Customization property sheet will be closed and your tool settings will be saved.

Cancel

Press this button to close the Tool Customization property sheet without making any changes. If you have made any changes to the tool settings, and then press this button your changes will not be used, and your previous settings will remain in use.

Delete

Press this button to delete the currently displayed Tool settings. You will be asked to confirm this command before the current tool is deleted.

Help

Press this button to open the FxEdit Help window and go directly to the Configuring the Tool Menu topic.

Tip Use the Ctrl+1 through Ctrl+9 shortcut keys to quickly invoke the tool menu items you have defined.

Note The Tool Menu settings you have selected will be saved when you press the **OK** button. The desktop location of the Tool Customization window itself will also be stored. Your settings will be saved in the MS Windows 95/NT <u>System Registry</u>.

FxEdit Explorer Setup

FxEdit Explorer Setup

Select the **Help | Setup** menu item to display the FxEdit Setup property sheet. This window will allow you to integrate FxEdit for Windows 95/NT with the Microsoft Windows 95/NT Explorer. Use this command to create and remove MS Explorer shortcuts.

Create a Start Menu Item

Check this item to create a FxEdit Start Menu entry. The FxEdit for Windows 95/NT program will be located in the Software by Design folder on the Programs menu. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a FxEdit item already exists in the Software by Design folder.

Remove this Start Menu Item

Check this item to remove the FxEdit entry located in the Software by Design folder on the Programs menu. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a FxEdit item does not already exist in the Software by Design folder.

Create a Desktop Icon

Check this item to create a FxEdit for Windows 95/NT program icon on the Explorer desktop. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a FxEdit desktop icon already exists.

Remove Icon from the Desktop

Check this item to remove the FxEdit for Windows 95/NT program icon from the Explorer desktop. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a FxEdit desktop icon does not already exist.

Create a Startup Folder Item

Check this item to automatically run FxEdit for Windows 95/NT whenever Microsoft Windows is started. This option creates a FxEdit program icon in the MS Windows Explorer Startup folder. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a FxEdit startup item already exists in the Startup folder.

Remove the Startup Folder Item

Check this item to remove FxEdit from the MS Windows Explorer Startup folder. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a FxEdit startup item does not already exist in the Startup folder.

OK

Press this button when you have completed your selection of MS Explorer shortcuts. When you press this button the FxEdit Setup property sheet will be closed and the MS Explorer shortcuts you have selected will be created or removed.

Cancel

Press this button to close the FxEdit Explorer Setup property sheet without creating or removing any MS Explorer shortcuts.

Help

Press this button to open the FxEdit Help window and go directly to the FxEdit Explorer Setup topic.

File Menu

File Menu Commands

The File menu provides commands to work with the binary files used by FxEdit. A short description of each item follows:

Open

Opens an existing binary file, and loads it for editing or viewing. When this item is selected the standard MS Windows Explorer file browser will be displayed, use this window to select the disk file you wish to work with. Check the **Open as Read-Only** box to load files for viewing only. The **Ctrl+O** shortcut can be used for this command.

Properties

Displays a small window showing file properties for the currently selected binary file. This window will display the document's file name, folder location, size, last modification date and file access permissions. The **Alt+Enter** shortcut can be used for this command.

Close

Closes the currently active disk file. If the file has been edited you will be prompted to save or discard the changes before closing. The **Ctrl+W** shortcut can be used for this command.

Save

Saves changes made to the currently selected disk file. This menu will be disabled (grayed) if no changes have been made to the file since it was last loaded or saved. The **Ctrl+S** shortcut can be used for this command.

Save as Hex Data

Saves the currently active disk file as an ASCII Hexadecimal text file. This option is useful if you need to create files suitable for use by Hexadecimal to Binary conversion utilities. When this item is selected the standard MS Windows Explorer file browser will be displayed, use this window to specify a name for the ASCII Hexadecimal text file being created. The ASCII Hexadecimal files you create can be optionally padded with spaces separating each individual byte as it is being written. The **Ctrl+D** shortcut can be used for this command.

Save a Copy As

Saves the currently active disk file with a new name. When this item is selected the standard MS Windows Explorer file browser will be displayed, use this window to specify a new name for the current file. The **Ctrl+A** shortcut can be used for this command

Discard

Use this item to discard editing changes made to a disk file, and reload the previous version from disk. This item will be disabled (grayed) if the file currently being edited has not changed since it was last saved or loaded. The **Ctrl+R** shortcut can be used for this command.

Printer Setup

Opens the standard MS Windows 95/NT Printer Setup dialog box, allowing you to select a printer and set various other printer options.

Print

Prints the currently selected binary file on your system's printer. A dialog box will appear before printing is started to allow you to select the printer to be used and various other printer options. The **Ctrl+P** shortcut can be used for this command.

Options

Opens the <u>FxEdit Options</u> property sheet and allows you to change FxEdit program settings. Use this command to configure the FxEdit program.

Recent Files

This command displays a sub-menu containing up to 9 recently edited files. Select a file name from this list to quickly reopen a recently edited binary file.

Exit

Closes the FxEdit program and returns control to the Explorer desktop. The Ctrl+Q shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used File commands can be invoked using shortcut keys or buttons on the toolbar ribbon

Edit Menu

Edit Menu Commands

The Edit menu provides commands used to edit the contents of binary files. A short description of each item follows:

Edit Hex

Begins editing the currently selected binary disk file record in the Hexadecimal mode. The editing cursor will change to a red block to specify the byte currently being edited. Enter the hexadecimal characters 0-9 or A-F in this editing mode. The red editing cursor will automatically move to the next byte in the block as hexadecimal values are typed. Use the arrow keys to skip bytes without making changes and the Esc key when you have completed editing. The **Ctrl+K** shortcut can be used for this command.

Edit String

Begins editing the currently selected binary disk file record in the ASCII/ANSI mode. The editing cursor will change to a red block to specify the byte currently being edited. Enter normal ASCII/ANSI characters in this editing mode. The red editing cursor will automatically move to the next byte in the block as characters are typed. Use the arrow keys to skip bytes without making changes and the Esc key when you have completed editing. The **Ctrl+E** shortcut can be used for this command.

Stop

Stops or cancels the currently active editing mode. The cursor will change back to a yellow block when this command is invoked. The **Esc** shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used Edit commands can be invoked using shortcut keys or buttons on the toolbar ribbon.

View Menu

View Menu Commands

The View menu provides commands used to change FxEdit display options. These items provide a means of changing the FxEdit window appearance. A short description of each item follows:

Customize Toolbar

Use this command to <u>customize</u> the FxEdit for Windows 95/NT toolbar ribbon. The standard MS Windows Toolbar Customization dialog box will be opened and displayed when this command is selected.

Go to Record

Use this command to go directly to a specified disk file record. A small dialog box will appear when this command is invoked. Enter the record number of the disk file block you wish to view and then press the **OK** button. You may enter record numbers as either decimal or hexadecimal values. The **Ctrl+G** shortcut can be used for this command.

Top of File

Use this command display the first record block in the current file. The Ctrl+PgUp shortcut can be used for this command.

Previous Record

Use this command display the previous record block in the current file. The PgUp shortcut can be used for this command.

Next Record

Use this command display the next record block in the current file. The PgDn shortcut can be used for this command.

End of File

Use this command display the last record block in the current file. The Ctrl+PgDn shortcut can be used for this command.

Minimize

Minimizes the FxEdit window to a button or icon on the taskbar. The Ctrl+Y shortcut can be used for this command.

Always on Top

Use this command to keep the FxEdit window top most on the desktop. When this item is checked the FxEdit window will float above all other non-topmost windows on the desktop. This item is useful if you normally run FxEdit with a small window that would be easily obscured by other applications. The **Ctrl+T** shortcut can be used for this command.

 $\textbf{Tip} \ \text{Commonly used View commands can be invoked using } \underline{\text{shortcut keys}} \ \text{or buttons on the } \underline{\text{toolbar ribbon}}.$

Search Menu

Search Menu Commands

The Search menu provides commands used to search for specified strings in the currently active binary disk file. A short description of each item follows:

Find Hex

Opens the Find Hexadecimal dialog box and allows you to specify the Hexadecimal string to be used for a file search. The **F8** shortcut can be used for this command.

Find String

Opens the Find String dialog box and allows you to specify the ASCII/ANSI string to be used for a file search. The **F2** shortcut can be used for this command.

Find Next

Use this command to find the next occurrence of the string specified. The F3 shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used Search commands can be invoked using shortcut keys or buttons on the toolbar ribbon.

Tool Menu

Tool Menu Commands

The Tools menu provides commands used to launch FxEdit custom tools. The custom tools you have <u>defined</u> can easily be launched using this menu.

The upper region of this menu contains room for up to 9 custom tool menu items. To define a custom tool menu item use the **Tools | Define Tools** menu command and then select the tool you wish to <u>define</u>.

Tip Commonly used Tool commands can be invoked using the shortcut keys; Ctrl+1 - Ctrl+9.

Help Menu

Help Menu Commands

The Help menu provides commands used to get help with FxEdit operations. A short description of each item follows:

Contents

Opens the FxEdit Help window and displays the Table of Contents. The F1 shortcut can be used for this command.

Search

Opens FxEdit Help and displays the Search window. You can use this window to search for specific FxEdit help topics.

How to Use Help

Opens a Help window that explains how to use the MS Windows 95/NT Help program.

Registe

Displays the FxEdit Shareware Registration Wizard. This wizard allows you to register FxEdit for Windows 95/NT for authorized use.

Setup

Displays the FxEdit Explorer Setup property sheet. This window provides options to integrate FxEdit with the MS Windows Explorer. Use this window to create MS Explorer Start Menu items and desktop icons.

Web Site

Opens your web browser application and goes directly to the Software by Design web site on the Internet.

About FxEdit

Displays the FxEdit splash box. This window contains program information, the current version of FxEdit you are running and a program copyright notice. Click the mouse anywhere in this window to close it

Tip Commonly used Help commands can be invoked using shortcut keys or buttons on the toolbar ribbon.

Customizing the Toolbar

Customizing the Toolbar Ribbon

The FxEdit toolbar ribbon can be customized by selecting the **View | Customize** menu item. The standard MS Windows 95/NT Toolbar Customization dialog box will be opened when this command is invoked. Use this window to add and remove FxEdit toolbar buttons as well as to change the order that the buttons appear on the toolbar ribbon.

Tip you can also move and delete toolbar buttons without opening the Toolbar Customization dialog box by simply shift-clicking with your mouse and dragging the button to a new location on the FxEdit toolbar ribbon itself. To delete buttons shift-click and drag the button off of the FxEdit toolbar ribbon.

Note Some versions of MS Windows 95 redraw the toolbar ribbon height incorrectly after customization, if this happens exit FxEdit and restart it again to restore the proper toolbar ribbon height.

Available Buttons

This list will contain the buttons available for adding to the FxEdit toolbar ribbon. Only buttons not currently installed on the toolbar ribbon will be displayed in this list.

Toolbar Buttons

This list will contain the buttons currently installed on the FxEdit toolbar ribbon.

hhΑ

Press the **Add** button after selecting a toolbar button from the Available list. The tool button you have selected will be added to the FxEdit toolbar ribbon at the current selection point.

Remove

Press the **Remove** button after selecting a toolbar button from the Toolbar list. The tool button you have selected will be removed from the FxEdit toolbar ribbon.

Close

Press the **Close** button to finish toolbar customization. The selection of toolbar buttons that you chose to include will be saved and reloaded whenever FxEdit for Windows 95/NT is started.

Reset

Press the **Reset** button to restore the FxEdit toolbar ribbon to its original default settings.

Help

Press the Help button to open the FxEdit Help file and go directly to the Customizing the Toolbar topic.

Move Up

Use this button to move the currently selected button up one place in the toolbar button list. The currently selected button will appear one place to the left on the actual FxEdit toolbar ribbon when this command is used.

Move Down

Use this button to move the currently selected button down one place in the toolbar button list. The currently selected button will appear one place to the right on the actual FxEdit toolbar ribbon when this command is used.

Toolbar Buttons

Tool Ribbon Buttons

Most commonly used FxEdit menu commands can also be quickly invoked by pressing a button on the toolbar ribbon displayed at the top of the main window.

These buttons work exactly the same way as the corresponding menu items that they duplicate.

The number of buttons and their order on the toolbar ribbon may differ from the following description if you have <u>customized</u> the FxEdit toolbar ribbon.



Open - Open a file



Save - Save changes made to a file



Close - Close the current file



Save Copy - Save a copy of the file



Properties - Show file properties



Print - Print the current file



Edit Hex – Edit file using hexadecimal



Edit String – Edit file using strings



Stop - Stop editing



Go To - Go to the specified record



Top of File – Display the first block



Previous – Display the previous block



Next - Display the next block



End of File - Display the last block



Find Hex - Search for a hex string



Find String - Search for an ASCII string



Find Again - Repeat the search



Topmost – Make the FxEdit window topmost



Options - Open the ExEdit Options dialog



Help - Open this Help file



About - Show FxEdit splash box

Tip If the Show ToolBar Tips option is selected a small popup tip window will appear when the mouse pointer is placed over a button. A short description of what each button does can be viewed using this method.

Shortcut Keys

Shortcuts

Shortcut keys allow you to quickly invoke FxEdit menu commands without first displaying the menu and then selecting an item from it. The most commonly used FxEdit commands can be invoked using the following shortcut keys.

File Menu

Ctrl+O Open an existing disk file

Alt+Enter
Ctrl+W
Ctrl+S
Ctrl+D
Show properties for current disk file
Close the current disk file
Save changes made to the disk file
Save as ASCII Hexadecimal data

Ctrl+A Save a copy of the current file
Ctrl+R Discard editing changes
Ctrl+P Print the current disk file

Ctrl+Q Exit FxEdit, and return to the desktop

Edit Menu

Ctrl+K Begin editing using the Hexadecimal mode

Ctrl+E Begin editing using the ASCII mode

Esc Stop editing

View Menu

Ctrl+G Go to the specified record
Ctrl+PgUp Display the first record in the file
PgUp Display the previous record
PgDn Display the next record
Ctrl+PgDn Display the last record in the file
Ctrl+Y Minimize FxEdit to a button or icon

Ctrl+T Make the FxEdit window topmost

Search Menu

F8 Search for a hexadecimal string
F2 Search for an ASCII/ANSI string
F3 Repeat the previous search

Tools Menu

Ctrl+1_Ctrl+9 Run a Tool menu item

Help Menu

F1 Display this Help file

System Registry

FxEdit for Windows 95/NT System Registry Key

FxEdit for Windows 95/NT stores configuration settings in the MS Windows 95/NT System Registry. These settings are updated automatically while FxEdit is running. There is no need to edit these settings manually.

If you insist upon editing these settings, you do so at your own risk. FxEdit automatically updates registry entries when it exits. If you edit these settings make sure FxEdit is not running while you edit them. If FxEdit is currently running your changes will be overwritten when FxEdit exits.

FxEdit for Windows 95/NT stores configuration settings in the following system registry key:

Software
Software by Design
FxEdit for Windows 95/NT
Section
Label = Value

Warning There is no need to edit these settings manually. FxEdit will automatically maintain these settings for you. If you do edit these, you do so at your own risk.

Removing FxEdit

Removing FxEdit for Windows 95/NT

If you find that FxEdit for Windows 95/NT does not meet your needs you can remove it from your computer system by simply deleting the following files from your hard drive. All of these files will be located in the folder that you originally installed FxEdit in.

FxEdit.exe FxEdit for Windows 95/NT application program.

FxEdit.cnt FxEdit Help Topics File

FxEdit.hlp FxEdit Help File

files. This file is used to search for words and phrases in the FxEdit Help files.
