#### What is License Manager?

Tracking licenses manually on local computers or within a small domain is possible but time-consuming. Tracking licenses (without the assistance of automated tools) across an entire organization or enterprise with multiple domains can be unreasonably difficult, costly, and time-consuming.

License Manager helps to contain these costs by managing and tracking licenses and usage throughout an organization. It makes it easier for a company to comply with legal requirements by automatically replicating licensing data from all primary domain controllers (PDCs) in the organization to a centralized database on a specified <u>master server</u>.

Administrators (those who certify that the company has purchased licenses) can use License Manager to:

- See a centralized view of <u>Per Seat</u> and <u>Per Server</u> licenses across the organization.
- Manage the purchasing or deleting of licenses for products on network servers over which they have administrative rights.
- See usage statistics for each user.
- Balance the licensing replication load across the network.

#### **Notes**

- License Manager cannot guarantee compliance with legal licensing requirements. Hardware problems could eliminate or delay the updating of licensing data.
- Licensing replication does not depend on or use the server-replication process.

## **Master Server**

The master server is a server that is designated as the final centralized repository of all licensing data for an organization. It can be either the primary domain controller (PDC) for that domain or a specified enterprise server. An enterprise server is the server to which multiple PDCs in a large organization will replicate.

#### Per Seat

**Per Seat** licensing mode requires a Client Access License for each computer that will access a server running Windows NT Server for basic network services (such as file, print, and remote access services). When a computer is licensed, it may access any computer installed on the network running Windows NT Server at no additional charge. **Per Seat** licensing mode is often the most economical one for networks in which clients tend to connect to more than one server.

#### **Per Server**

With **Per Server** licensing, each Client Access License is assigned to a particular server and allows one connection to that server for basic network services (such as file, print, and communications). You must have at least as many Client Access Licenses dedicated to that server as the maximum number of client computers that will connect to that server at any time. **Per Server** licensing mode is often the most economical one for networks in which clients tend to connect to only one occasional-use or special-purchase server.

To start License Manager

Click Start, point to Programs, point to Administrative Tools, and then click License Manager.

# To format the screen in the Products View and Clients (Per Seat) tabs

- 1 On the **Options** menu, click **Format**.

## To select a domain

The first time you use this dialog box, there may be some delay while License Manager searches the network for domains.

## To refresh the display

On the **View** menu, click **Refresh**.

## Note

Since most servers replicate at different times, this feature allows you to keep up with changes to the licensing data that might affect purchasing decisions.

- If you select **Start Every**, licensing information may take as much as twice the frequency you set to get to the master server: one interval to get to the primary domain controller and one to replicate up to the master server.

#### Refresh

Updates the active tab view. You may want to update periodically the information shown to stay current with network server activity.

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Enables you to change the font, font style, and font size that License Manager uses to display text on the screen. As you make changes, they are reflected in the **Sample** box.



### **Change Master Server to Domain Controller**

If this server is a master server (such as a primary domain controller), any Per Seat licenses installed for its domain currently reside at the enterprise server. Converting this server to a domain controller will remove any Per Seat licenses from its domain.

Before you change this server's master server to be a domain controller, you may want to remove some licenses from the enterprise server. You can then change this server's master server to domain controller, and add the licenses that you removed from the enterprise server.

### **Change to Different Enterprise Server**

If this server is a master server (such as a primary domain controller), any Per Seat licenses installed for its domain reside at the current enterprise server. Changing to a different enterprise server means that this server's domain will start using Per Seat licenses that already exist at the new enterprise server.

Before you change this server's master server to be the new enterprise server, you may want to remove some licenses from the current enterprise server. You can then change this server's master server to be the new server, and add the licenses that you removed from the old enterprise server.

### Frequently Asked Questions Regarding Client Access Licenses

### Why do I need Client Access Licenses?

A Microsoft Client Access License is a legal document that provides the right for an individual computer to access a particular Microsoft server product. Client Access Licenses are required for compliance with the terms of the licensing agreements for the Microsoft server products. To legally use Microsoft server products, customers must purchase Client Access Licenses for computers.

### When are Client Access Licenses needed?

A Client Access License for Microsoft Windows NT Server is required for programs that use the Windows NT Server basic networking services (file, print, and communications). This is true regardless of whether you use Microsoft or third-party programs. For example, you need a Client Access License if you intend to use File and Print Services for NetWare.

This means that you need a Client Access License for each computer that will be accessing the following basic network services:

File services, for sharing and managing files and disk storage.
 Printing services, for sharing and managing printers.
 Remote access services, for accessing the server from a remote location through a communications link.

## Do I need Client Access Licenses if I have Microsoft Windows 95 or Microsoft Windows NT Workstation?

Yes. Client Access Licenses are separate from the desktop operating system software you use to connect to Microsoft server products. Purchasing Microsoft Windows 95, Windows NT Workstation, or any other desktop operating system (such as Macintosh) that connects to Microsoft server products does not constitute a legal license to connect to those Microsoft server products. In addition to the desktop operating system, Client Access Licenses must also be purchased.

### When should I use the Per Server vs. the Per Seat licensing mode?

The following examples are designed to help clarify the situations under which you would use each of the two licensing modes for Client Access Licenses.

### **Example One**

A company uses Windows NT Server software for file and print services. The company has three servers and 100 employees. All the employees log on to a "home" server and, normally, access one additional server during the day.

If the **Per Seat** licensing mode is selected, the company would purchase 100 Client Access Licenses, and the employees could access all the servers. If the **Per Server** licensing mode is selected, the company would have to determine the maximum number of concurrent connections to any one server to guarantee access for all users. Depending on the demand, this might require them to purchase more than 100 Client Access Licenses.

For example, if 33 employees use only one home server and, on average, 20 other employees normally connect to an additional server, then the maximum number of concurrent connections for each server might be 53. That would require the purchase of 159 Client Access Licenses or 53 for each of the three servers. In general, **Per Seat** is the most economical one to choose when the use of a server is pervasive or when guaranteed access is needed to services, such as file and print, or business-critical applications.

### **Example Two**

A company is planning to use Windows NT Server software for remote-access services. The company has 200 employees but anticipates that only 50 employees will dial in at any one time.

In this case, the company should license Windows NT Server in **Per Server** mode and purchase 50 Client Access Licenses for that server. **Per Server** is the most economical for occasional-use servers, such as when a great number of clients will access a server only on an occasional basis, or for special-use servers, such as those running Remote Access Service, Internet servers, or bulletin-board servers.

### **Example Three**

In contrast with example two, when the number of Client Access Licenses in **Per Server** mode approaches or is greater than the total number of clients in an organization, then switching to **Per Seat** mode becomes more cost effective.

For example, consider a company with a total of 200 workstations and four computers running Windows NT Server. If the company purchases 50 Client Access Licenses for each server (for a total of 200 Client Access Licenses) in **Per Server** mode, they should switch to **Per Seat** mode on all the servers to reduce administrative costs and guarantee access to services, such as file and print, or business-critical applications.

### What if I am still unsure which licensing mode to use?

If you are unsure which licensing mode to choose, select **Per Server**. The license agreement allows you a one-time, one-way option to change from **Per Server** to **Per Seat** licensing mode.

### 1. GRANT OF LICENSE.
