To install the DialogBoxMaker macro:

This macro will create a very simple dialog box containing a ComboBox, an OK button, a Cancel button, and a Title. In other words, it's not much, but it's a start. After installing the DialogBoxMaker macro (see instructions above) run the macro, (Select Macro, Run, and Click on DialogBoxMaker) and answer the questions. You've still got some editing to do, but not that much. (see instructions below) Please feel free to make any changes you'd like to this macro. If you get a chance, upload any changes to CIS, or EMAIL them to me. Have fun!

After the DialogBoxMaker macro has finished running:

- 1.
- Insert a 'default' choice as indicated in the macro listing.(This will be the choice that will be highlighted by default when the dialog box starts.)
- 3. Insert the statement(s) to be processed in each 'CASE' portion of the macro listing.
- 4. Copy the entire listing to the Clipboard <Ctrl NumPad5> <Ctrl Ins>
- 5. Select Macro, Edit
- 6. Type a name for Macro Name and press <Enter>
- 7. Place cursor on line between Sub Main and End Sub
- 8. Paste from Clipboard <Shift Ins>
- 9. Close the Macro Window <Ctrl F4>
- 10. Click 'Yes' to save the macro
- 11. You can now select Macro, click Run, click on the name of the new macro, and voila!
- 12. To get rid of the Message Boxes, edit the DialogBoxMaker macro by removing all lines that begin with 'MsgBox'.
- 13. Be sure to save Glossary Changes when you exit Word for Windows.
